American Rescue Plan (ARP)/ Elementary & Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER III) Plan

Prior to creating the ARP for Casey County Schools meaningful consultation with stakeholders occurred. School and district leadership teams reviewed data, highlighted needs, and prioritized those needs. Face-to-face meetings were conducted with all teachers, however an emphasis was placed on teachers and families who are at a greater risk (Special Education students, English Language Learners, Gifted and Talented, & Migrant Education students). Stakeholder feedback was solicited from families, students, school and district administrators, community members, and staff (including those represented by KEA, KAPE, etc), both verbally and through a community-wide survey. Our community does not have any local civil rights organizations. Face to face, phone, and zoom meetings occurred to discuss the American Rescue Plan on multiple dates. In addition, a survey (google form) was sent out to all stakeholders families, students, school and district administrators, community members, and staff (including those represented by KEA, KAPE, etc). We will continue to seek input and communicate with all stakeholders as changes occur.

Consultation and survey results yield the following as priority:

- Addressing Learning Loss
- Purchasing educational technology (including hardware, software, connectivity, assistive technology and adaptive equipment) for students that aids in regular and substantive educational interaction between students and their classroom instructors, including students from low-income families and between students and their classroom instructors, including students from low-income families and children with disabilities
- Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental after-school programs
- Repairing and improving school facilities to reduce risk of virus transmission and exposure to environmental health hazards
- Improving indoor air quality

COVID-19 Prevention & Mitigation Strategies

ARP funds will be used to purchase PPE equipment, indoor air units and purification systems, along with sanitation supplies to address the following areas as needed:

Masking	Mandated indoors and on school buses
Physical Distancing	Encouraged greater than 3 feet spacing- classroom spacing maximized
Handwashing/Respirator y Etiquette	Signage in all school areas promoting healthy habits-Hand sanitizer stations- structured breaks for frequent handwashing
Cleaning/Sanitation	Daily disinfection of all school areas- multiple for high touch areas
Contact Tracing	Seating charts in classrooms/buses- working directly with the Health Dept.
Diagnostic Screening	Only when symptoms are presented.
<u>Vaccination efforts</u>	Partnership with Lake Cumberland Family Medical
Accommodations for Special needs	Full participation in all academic and extracurricular activities. Directly follows IEP or 504 plans.

Implementation of evidence based practices to address the academic impact of lost instructional time

Remaining Funds

Based on stakeholder feedback and discussion Casey County Schools plans to spend the remainder of the ARP funds on the following:

- Purchasing educational technology (including hardware, software, connectivity, assistive technology and adaptive equipment) for students that aids in regular and substantive educational interaction between students and their classroom instructors, including students from low-income families and between students and their classroom instructors, including students from low-income families and children with disabilities
- Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental after-school programs (providing transportation)
- Repairing and improving school facilities to reduce risk of virus transmission and exposure to environmental health hazards (including the upgrade of outdoor space/playground areas for easy sanitizing)
- Improving indoor air quality (replacing, upgrading and adding equipment to support clean air)
- Providing mental health services and supports, the hiring of a counselor and purchasing Social Emotional Curriculum
- Providing professional learning for all staff for the implementation of effective instructional and intervention strategies (consultants, registration fees, travel, lodging, etc.)
- Provide instructional support materials to close the achievement gap across all content areas (textbook replacement & upgrades)

Casey County Schools will ensure that interventions address the academic impact of lost instructional time and respond to academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of all students.

Casey County Schools will ensure that interventions address our student's needs. District leaders, principals, teachers, and staff will continue to work as a team to address the academic impact of lost instructional time. Reviewing student data that includes, but is not limited to formative and summative data, social, emotional needs and mental health supports will be monitored through the following:

- Weekly PLCs at all schools
- Monthly District Leadership Meetings
- Monthly Directors Meetings
- Principal and Coach PLCs
- District Academies

Continuous monitoring will allow adjustments to be made if necessary to address instruction and the academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of all students. Monitoring will also indicate the types of professional learning needed to support staff and families as well as parent and community involvement activities.
