Part 1: Classroom Expectations



In order for us to learn and have successful classroom time, there are 3 expectations we need to follow - the 3 P's.

What does this look like in our classroom?

Part 2: Routines in our Classroom

Typical Day in Spanish Class

- 1. Entering the classroom quietly: I will greet you and you will seat yourself in your assigned seat.
- 2. Getting started: Look at the board....it will usually have some instructions for your "do now".
- **3.** "El Calentamiento": It will be a review or preview of what we are doing in class.



- **4. Preguntas del Día:** There will most likely be daily questions (appr. 3-5) to answer that we will share as a class.
- **5. Main Activity:**There will be various activities that focus on listening/reading/speaking/writing/cultural proficiency.
- **6. Wrap up:** We will briefly discuss the main learning objective of the day. There may be an Exit Ticket **-boleto de salida-** that you will complete to help me see how the class went and what you have learned.
- 1. Homework Drop-off: When homework is due, you will turn it in on Google Classroom (GC) if it's a

digital copy. If it is an actual hardcopy, you will simply give it to me in person in class.

- 2. Asking Questions: Raise your hand please! You all have great things to say/ask but I can only respond one to one.
- **3. Textbook/Dictionaries:** We will be using wordreference.com and our textbook is online. However, I also have the same physical textbook in our classroom as well as numerous online resources.
- 4. Getting your attention: I will most likely ring a bell or squeeze my dog's toy!

Part 3: Feedback and Progress on Standards/skills

In this class you will be given feedback on the 5 standards/skills for learning any World language: speaking, listening, reading, writing, and demonstrating an understanding of Latinx cultures and customs (intercultural competence). These assessments will be carried out in a variety of ways and I will be using Standards Based Grading. Our goal is to keep moving along our path to proficiency.

We may all be at different places and sometimes we will move faster or slower than our peers-which is realistic and okay. :)

Acquiring a new language is different from learning other new subjects. Using a language is a skill and it must be practiced often so that it may be perfected and become automatic.
