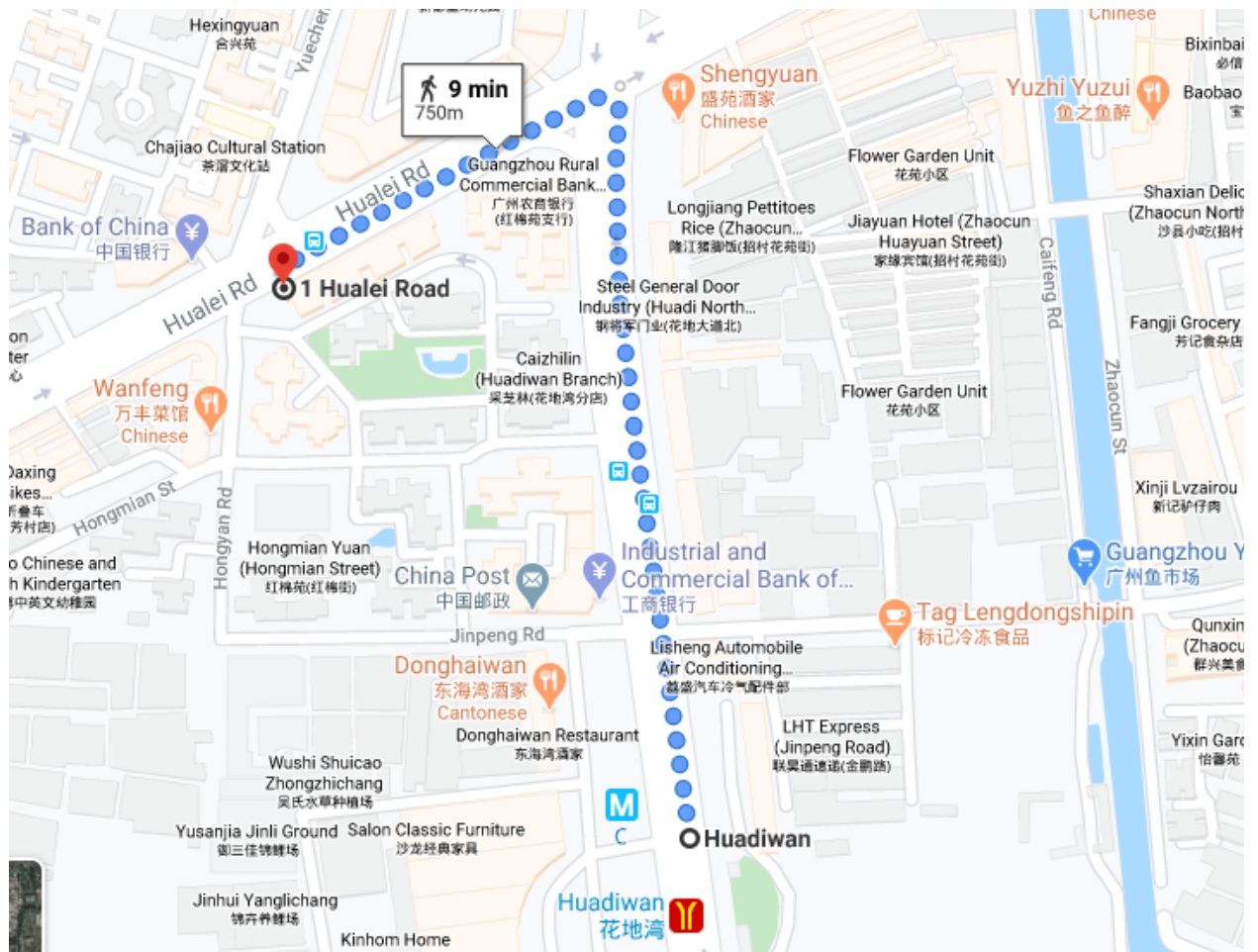


The Changes in *Discover Guangzhou*

The following restaurants have been closed

1. P58 and P87 **You Xiang Dian Restaurant**
2. P146 **Sweet Garden Dessert Store** has been moved to No.1 Hualei Road, 570m from Huadiwan metro station Exit C.



The following points of interest have been changed

1. P51, **Literature Pagoda** is closed to the public.
2. P52, **Pat Wo Wui Kun Association** may not be open to the public. However, an area behind it has been developed into a new tourist attraction called [Yongqingfang](#).
3. P52, The **Erawan Shrine** has been relocated to the backyard of the Chiang Kai-shek Former Residence Museum.

4. The walk of **Julong Ancient Village**, P143 The surrounding plots of Lujulu Road have been demolished and reconstructed by the government and real estate developers to the 3rd CBD. The road on the far right in the overhead view is Lujulu Road and the old buildings in this area have disappeared. Walking directly to Julong Ancient Village from entrance B of Huadiwan metro station is recommended.





5. P150, The point of interest ④ **Oyster Shell Wall**, The wall still stands, but the oyster shells have been covered with cement.

6. P111, The layout of the second floor of **Dongping Pawnshop Museum** has been altered.

Consequently, Guangzhou has seen a decline in its vibrant street culture.
