

Purpose:

He spurred the agency into finding additional records pertaining to the CIA's program of experimentation with human subjects. These new records were discovered **by** the agency in March. Their existence was not made known to the Congress until July. The records reveal a **far** more extensive series of experiments than had previously been thought. Eighty-six universities or institutions were involved. NeV instances of unethical behavior were revealed. The intelligence community of this Nation, which requires a shroud of secrecy to operate, has a very sacred trust from the American people. The CIA's program of human experimentation of the fifties and sixties violated that trust. It was violated again on the day the bulk of the agency's records were destroyed in **1973**. It is violated each time a responsible official refuse to recollect the details of the program. The best safeguard against abuses in the future is a complete public accounting of the abuses of the past.

MK Ultra Simplified:

An important lesson is that such paranoia, combined with secrecy and a lack of oversight and accountability, can easily lead to abuses – something also seen in the UK's use of interrogation techniques in Kenya in the 1950s and Northern Ireland in the 1970s. 12 Following the attacks in New York on 11 September 2001, the Bush administration embraced 'enhanced interrogation' methods like waterboarding, abandoning well-established legal norms. Once again, some psychologists proved willing to help design psychological interrogation techniques.13 We forgot the lessons of history then and, unless we keep re-telling the stories of the past, it is likely we will forget them again in the future.

“Unlocking the Universe”:

After 10 years of unwitting testing, the men from MKULTRA apparently scored no major breakthroughs with LSD or other drugs. They found no effective truth drug, recruitment pill, or aphrodisiac. LSD had not opened the mind to CIA control. "We had thought at first that this was the secret that was going to unlock the universe," says a TSS veteran. "We found that human beings had resources far greater than imagined."

Early Experimentation:

the CIA and the army did not think in terms of kicks, religious experiences, or creative buzz patterns. On the contrary, their purpose was explicitly sinister: to develop, weapons that would blow minds and control behavior, in order to gain strategic advantages over potential enemies. The research committee surveyed and rejected numerous drugs, including alcohol, barbiturates, and caffeine. Peyote and scopolamine were also tested, but the visions and hallucinations produced by these substances hindered the interrogation process. Eventually, marijuana was chosen as the most likely candidate for a speech-inducing agent. (Later changed to barbs and stims / NO)

CIA Truth Serum:

In recent years drug therapy has made some use of stimulants, most notably amphetamine (Benzedrine) and its relative methamphetamine (Methedrine). These drugs, used either alone or following intravenous barbiturates, produce an outpouring of ideas, emotions, and memories which has been of help in diagnosing mental disorders. The potential of stimulants in interrogation has received little attention, unless in

unpublished work. In one study of their psychiatric use Brussel et al. 7 maintain that methedrine gives the liar no time to think or to organize his deceptions. Once the drug takes hold, they say, an insurmountable urge to pour out speech traps the malingerer. Gottschalk, on the other hand, says that this claim is extravagant, asserting without elaboration.

that the study lacked proper controls.¹³ It is evident that the combined use of barbiturates and stimulants, perhaps along with ataraxics (tranquillizers), should be further explored.

Three months after the Director approved BLUEBIRD, the first team traveled to Japan to try out behavioral techniques on human subjects—probably suspected double agents. The three men arrived in Tokyo in July 1950, about a month after the start of the Korean War. No one needed to impress upon them the importance of their mission. The Security Office ordered them to conceal their true purpose from even the U.S. military authorities with whom they worked in Japan, using the cover that they would be performing "intensive polygraph" work. In stifling, debilitating heat and humidity, they tried out combinations of the depressant sodium amytal with the stimulant Benzedrine on each of four subjects, the last two of whom also received a second stimulant, picrotoxin. They also tried to induce amnesia. The team considered the tests successful, but the CIA documents available on the trip give only the sketchiest outline of what happened. * Then around October 1950, the BLUEBIRD team used "advanced" techniques on 25 subjects, apparently North Korean prisoners of war.

The Barbiturates:

They can produce the entire range of depressant effects from mild sedation to deep anesthesia -- and death. In small doses they are sedatives acting to reduce anxiety and responsiveness to stressful situations; in these low doses, the drugs have been used in the treatment of many diseases, including peptic ulcer, high blood pressure, and various psychogenic disorders. At three to five times the sedative dose the same barbiturates are hypnotics and induce sleep or unconsciousness from which the subject can be aroused. In larger doses a barbiturate acts as an anesthetic, depressing the central nervous system as completely as a gaseous anesthetic does. In even larger doses barbiturates cause death by stopping respiration.

The descent into narcosis and beyond with progressively larger doses can be divided as follows.

I. Sedative Stage

II. Unconsciousness, with exaggerated reflexes (hyperactive stage).

III. Unconsciousness, without reflex even to painful stimuli.

IV. Death.

Whether all these stages can be distinguished in any given subject depends largely on the dose and the rapidity with which the drug is induced. In anesthesia, stages I and II may last only two or three seconds.

The first or sedative stage can be further divided:

Plane 1. No evident effect, or slight sedative effect.

Plane 2. Cloudiness, calmness, amnesia. (Upon recovery, the subject will not remember what happened at this or "lower" planes or stages.)

Plane 3. Slurred speech, old thought patterns disrupted, inability to integrate or learn new patterns. Poor coordination. Subject becomes unaware of painful stimuli.

Plane 3 is the psychiatric "work" stage. It may last only a few minutes, but it can be extended by further slow injection of the drug. The usual practice is to bring the subject quickly to Stage II and to conduct the interview as he passes back into the sedative stage on the way to full consciousness.

Psychic Spies:

the Pentagon is spending \$1 million a year on. The project and is sharing results with the CIA. The funding, which rose from \$200,000 to 81 million a year, was the pentagon's general budget. One of Grill Flame's project leaders is a respected physicist, Harold Puthuff, and the project's top psychic

The researchers are convinced that Swann's feat could not have been trickery. Yet Swann has been reluctant to promote “remote viewing” as a spy technique because it often produces bad information along with good.

Government Sponsored Research in Psychoenergetics:

In FY 1986, a five-year Psychoenergetics research program was launched at SRI using Army Medical Department R&D funds. Although the Army currently provides all the funds, the effort, from the outset, included the needs of the intelligence community. In addition, research, and development on medical and biological aspects of Psychoenergetics was initiated. The Five-Year Program has three major objectives:

- Document that Psychoenergetics phenomena are real and reproducible.
- Determine the mechanism underlying Psychoenergetics phenomena.
- Bring Psychoenergetics into the mainstream of human performance research.

(U) The categories of research interest form a hierarchy ranging from basic research on fundamental mechanisms to methodologies for applications. These include:

- Identify explanatory mechanisms neurophysiological mechanisms). (e.g., electromagnetic effects,
- Specify phenomenological properties (e.g., effects of distance and shielding).
- Determining physical, physiological, and psychological correlates (e.g., geophysical environment, EEG and GSE measures).
- Develop optimal strategies for use in applications (e.g., statistical averaging).

Coordinate Remote Viewing:

Project “SUN STREAK” (a SAP under DIA) has refined the process of teaching CRV to the degree that individuals possessing no known “natural psychic abilities” can be taught to remote view with extreme accuracy in a relatively short period of time. The training program for CRV takes approximately 6 months to complete depending on the individual being trained. The training program is divided into 6 stages with each stage increasing the scope and ability of the viewer. The stages must be completed in sequence and there are no time limits in the training progression – movement to the next stage of training is entirely dependent upon successful completion of the preceding stage.

Somewhere, perhaps in the unconscious mind, there exists what we will label “the Matrix”. The Matrix knows no boundaries and has no limitations – it contains all information about all things. (the space/time continuum) It could be thought of as omnipotent or you could think of it as a database etc.

Coordinate Remote Viewing - Stages:

STAGE I MAJOR GESTALT In Stage I the viewer is trained to provide a quick-reaction response to the reading of geographic coordinates by the interviewer. The coordinates are expressed in degrees, minutes, and seconds when possible. The response takes the form of an immediate, primitive "squiggle" on paper. This "squiggle" is known as an ideogram. The ideogram captures the overall feeling/motion of the gestalt of the site (e.g., fluid/wavy for water). This response is kinesthetic and not visual. In Stage I visual images are noted and labeled as AOL.

STAGE II SENSORY CONTACT In Stage II the viewer is trained to become sensitive to sensations associated with the site. These sensations concern sounds, smells, tastes, textures, temperatures, and energies at the site. Although colors are perceivable, Stage II signals are essentially nonvisual in nature. As in Stage I, visual images are noted and declared as AOL.

STAGE III DIMENSION, MOTION, AND MOBILITY In Stages I and II, data typically appear to emerge as fragmented data bits. In Stage III we observe the emergence of a broader concept of the site. With Stage I and II data forming a foundation, more detailed data and dimensional aspects such as length, height, and distances, begin to appear. This increased contact is known as a "widening of the aperture". At this point contact with the site appears sufficiently strengthened that the viewer begins to have an overall appreciation of the site as a whole. This is known as an "aesthetic impact". After the viewer experiences an "aesthetic impact" the urge to draw the site begins. These drawings are expressed in the form of sketches, trackers (outlines of the general configuration of the site), and additional spontaneous ideograms. The final product of Stage I through Stage III training is the recognition of the overall gestalt and physical configuration of the site.

STAGE IV GENERAL QUALITATIVE ANALYTICAL ASPECTS Because of the increased site contact that occurs in Stage III, in Stage IV data of an analytical nature begin to emerge. Contained in Stage IV data are elements that go beyond normal observational concepts. The ambience of the site such as military, religious, technical, or educational, can be expressed in Stage IV. Cultural factors such as Soviet, Muslim, or Arabic, and functional indicators such as power generation, BW research, or human research, can also be reported accurately in Stage IV. Stage IV is therefore the point where the viewer begins to become operational.

STAGE V SPECIFIC ANALYTICAL ASPECTS BY INTERROGATING THE SIGNAL LINE Many complex bits of data are produced during Stage IV. If during Stage IV the viewer attempts to probe or question the significance of this data it usually results in the production of AOL. The analytic functions of the viewer "try too hard" and fill in with logical but incorrect data. In Stage V however, special techniques are used to produce the more detailed information without triggering AOL.

STAGE VI THREE-DIMENSIONAL CONTACT AND MODELING In Stage VI the viewer uses various materials to produce three dimensional representations of the site or specific elements at the site location. Materials such as clay, cardboard, and poster paper can be used to produce models of the specific structure at the site as well as the general configuration of the surrounding area. This construction is done with "feeling". The use of these materials is not simply an attempt to render a more exact representation of the site than can be done verbally, or by means of drawing. The kinesthetic activity appears to both quench AOL formation associated with purely cerebral processes, and to act as a trigger

to produce further analytical content of the site, even concerning aspects not being specifically addressed by the modeling.

Detailed information concerning these training stages is included in the following chapters. Additionally, hypothesized subsequent stages are discussed in chapter 10.

Gang Stalking and Electronic Warfare:

Preface: I have not/will not develop violent tendencies and am not paranoid or impaired cognitively. I have been going about my life as usual, work a fulltime position as a programmer, and have not considered violence in any capacity.

Application of electromagnetic pulses is also a conceptual nonlethal technology that uses electromagnetic energy to induce neural synchrony and disruption of voluntary muscle control. The effectiveness of this concept has not been demonstrated. However, from past work in evaluating the potential for electromagnetic pulse generators to affect humans, it is estimated that sufficiently strong internal fields can be generated within the brain to trigger neurons. Estimates are that 50 to 100 kV/m free field of very sharp pulses (~ 1 nS) are required to produce a cell membranec potential of approximately 2 V; this would probably be sufficient to trigger neurons or make them more susceptible to firing.

An electric field strength of roughly 100 Kv/m over a time period of 1 nanosecond is approximately the condition thought to be necessary to produce the desired effect when provided to an overall repetition rate of 15 Hz. Such a field may be developed using a radar-like, high-peak-power, pulsed source or an

electromagnetic pulse generator operated at 15 Hz. These technologies exist today sufficient to evaluate the disabling concept. Power requirements are not high because the duty factor is so low. Aiming devices are currently available, but a high degree of directionality at long distances will require development. It may be necessary to provide bursts of these nanosecond pulses to stimulate the desired effect. As the duty time increases so does the average power requirement for power source. Because there were no open literature reports from which to make inferences, there is some uncertainty about the power levels required.

The two lateral semicircular canals, one located in each inner ear, alert a person to the fact that his upright head is experiencing angular acceleration. Within the ampulla of the canal are several so-called hair cells. The cilia of these cells protrude into the lumen of the ampulla where they are encased in a mass of jelly-like material (the cupula) which is attached to the opposite wall of the canal. As the head accelerates, the cilia are bent by an inertial force of the cupula and the viscous liquid in the canal lumen. The bending of the cilia excites hair cells which in turn excite afferent neurons; these then alert the brain that a change of position of the head has occurred. Similar events occur when the head stops moving. The result of a strong hair cell stimulus to the brain is a rapid eye movement, call nystagmus, a feeling of dizziness and disorientation, and a possibility of nausea and vomiting. Normal hearing is in the range between the frequencies of 20,000 to 16,000 Hz with the optimal sensitivity for most people between the frequencies of 500 to 6000 Hz.

Other researchers report other vestibular effects in addition to nystagmus at the following thresholds: 125 dB from 200-500 Hz, 140 dB at 1000 Hz, and 155 dB at 200 Hz. Decrements in vestibular function occur consistently for broadband noise levels of 140 dB (with hearing protection).

Human subjects listened to very high levels of low-frequency noise and infrasound in the protected or unprotected modes. Two-minute duration as high as 140 to 155 dB produced a range of effects from mild discomfort to severe pressure sensations, nausea, gagging, and giddiness. Effects also included blurred vision and visual field distortions in some exposure conditions. The nature and degree of all effects was dependent on both sound level and frequency with the most severe effects occurring in the audible frequency range (as opposed to infrasound), at levels above about 145 dB. The investigators found no temporary threshold shift (TTS) among their subjects, and the use of hearing protectors greatly alleviated the adverse effects.

3.3. Categories of Experience of Gang-Stalking

The categories arrived at fall into six distinct groups. (The numbers refer to the items/examples in [Table 1](#)).

- *i)* Those that involve an invasive attack on the subject's body

Being remotely controlled/mind control (7); physical ailments as a direct result of gang stalking (10); voice-to-skull transmission (18); and control and surveillance devices implanted into body (20).

- *ii)* Those involving an exterior attack on the person of the subject or their senses

Physical, interference, intimidation, and harassment (3); targeted by noise (6); and physical attacks (21).

- *iii)* Physical interference with the individual's personal environment or possessions

Physical surveillance/being followed (1); electronic surveillance (5); subject to electronic hacking (8); subject to clandestine, unauthorised entry to home (13); vandalism/theft of property (14); and family and friends also targeted (17).

- *iv)* Assault on reputation

Targeted by slander/gossip (11).

- *v)* Individuals or agencies involved in perpetrating or collaborating with the gang-stalking

Police as part of the conspiracy (15); neighbours as part of the conspiracy (16); family/friends as part of the conspiracy (19); producing 'evidence' of gang-stalking fails to persuade authorities to intervene (22); and medical practitioners as part of the conspiracy (23).

- *vi)* Items concerning interpretation of the meaning of gang-stalking

3.5. Sequelae of Gang-Stalking:

Victim of a conspiracy (by multiple agencies) (2); establishment cover-up (4); victimised as part of a global phenomenon (9); reinterpretation of past events in the light of the gang stalking experiences (12); and complained they didn't know why they were being stalked (24).

- *i)* Psychological/physical effects

Psychological damage (1); isolation and loneliness (2); resentment/distress at being treated as crazy or paranoid (4); physical ailments as a result of stress caused by gang-stalking (8); and feelings of hopelessness (11).

- *ii)* Practical effects/losses

Changed lifestyle (6); financial losses (7); efforts to escape from gang-stalkers (10).

- *iii)* Fighting back

Determination to fight back (3); found support from other gang-stalking victims through the internet (5); and development of hatred/violent tendencies (9).

A factor that stands out in the current study concerns the aggression with which sufferers responded to their experiences (see Table 2). Of respondents, 32% described experiences falling into the category "determined to fight back", while 16% made statements that fell into the category "development of hatred/violent tendencies". Examples include: "We can either go out on our feet or our knees and I plan to sell myself for as high a price as I can reap from them"; "I

may have to kill them before they kill me”; and “I think the only way forward is to get some weapons and act”. Violence in those who have complained of gang-stalking is not unknown. Sarteschi [21] described the cases of four men who believed that they were so-called “targeted individuals” and that the organized efforts of those who targeted them constituted “gang-stalking”. Collectively, the four men killed 28 people and injured 12 more.
