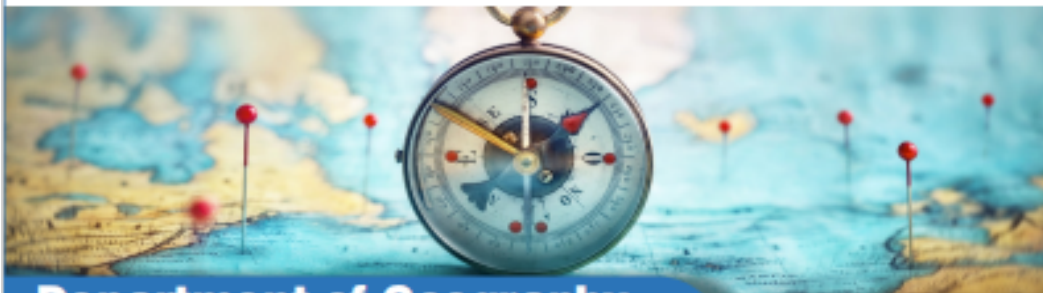

Technical Session – I

National Webinar on "Geographical Perspective on Sustainable Tourism: Balancing Ecology, Society and Economy" organized on the occasion of **World Tourism Day** on Wednesday, **27th September 2023**. The first technical session was graced by the key-note address by Prof. (Retd.) H. N. Mishra, Department of Geography, University of Allahabad and session was chaired by the Senior Prof. (Dr) Ravindra Jaybhaye (Senior Professor, Department of Geography, Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune)

In the Key note address Prof. (Retd.) H. N. Mishra, said that the Tourism and geography share a deeply interconnected relationship, with geography serving as a foundational element in the tourism industry. The choice of tourist destinations is significantly shaped by geography. Factors like climate, landscape, natural attractions, and proximity to other destinations are pivotal in determining a place's appeal to tourists. Countries and regions with diverse landscapes, climates, and cultural attractions are more likely to attract a broader range of tourists. Geography also plays a role in the development of niche tourism segments, such as ecotourism in biodiverse regions, winter sports in mountainous areas, or coastal tourism along coastlines. Geography also determines the vulnerability of tourist destinations to various risks and challenges. Coastal regions, for example, are susceptible to sea-level rise and extreme weather events due to their location, making them particularly relevant in discussions of climate change adaptation in tourism.

The chairperson of the session Senior Professor (Dr.) Ravindra Jaybhaye (Sr. Professor, Dept. of Geography, S.P.P.University, Pune) concluded this session with his remarks as he said Geography is the foundation upon which the tourism industry is built. It shapes destination selection, accessibility, and development, influences tourism niches, and plays a pivotal role in managing risks and opportunities in the tourism sector. The close interaction between tourism and geography underscores the importance of understanding the geographical context when studying and promoting tourism. Crucially, Dr. Jaybhay highlighted that geography is instrumental in managing risks and opportunities within the tourism sector. Understanding a destination's geographical vulnerabilities, such as its susceptibility to natural disasters or climate change impacts, is essential for sustainable tourism development. Likewise, recognizing geographical advantages, such as unique natural attractions or strategic location, can unlock opportunities for growth and development. In essence, the symbiotic relationship between tourism and geography underscores the importance of comprehending the geographical context when studying and promoting tourism.

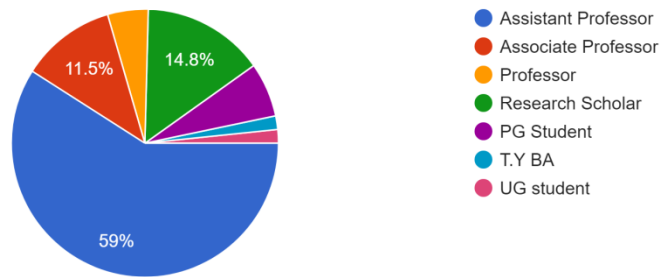

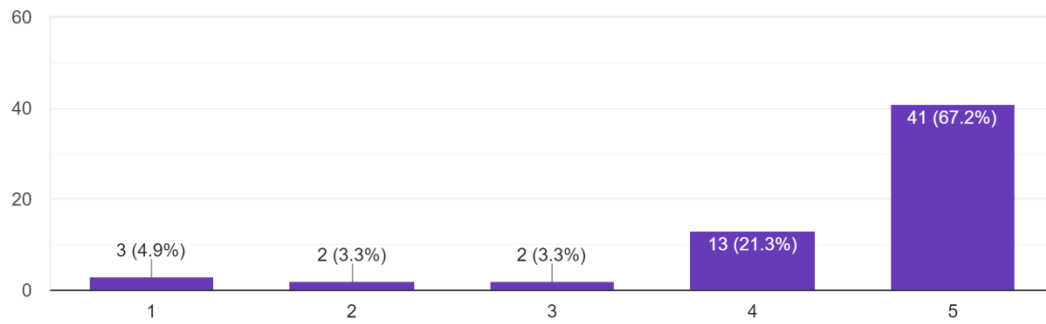

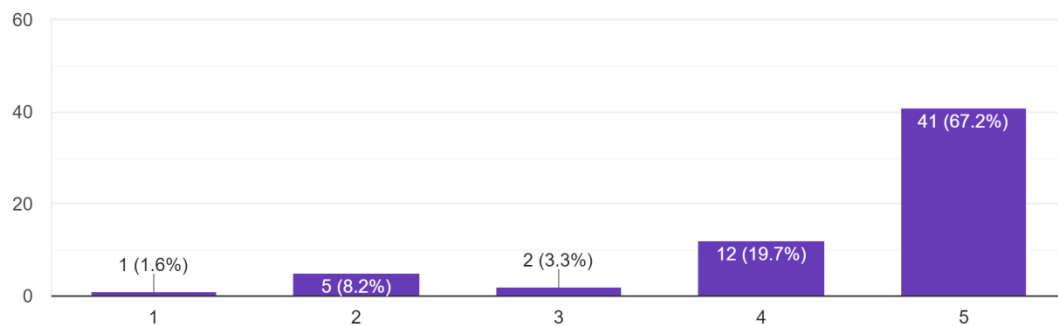
Resource Person Prof.(Retd.) H.N.Mishra's content delivery and subject knowledge

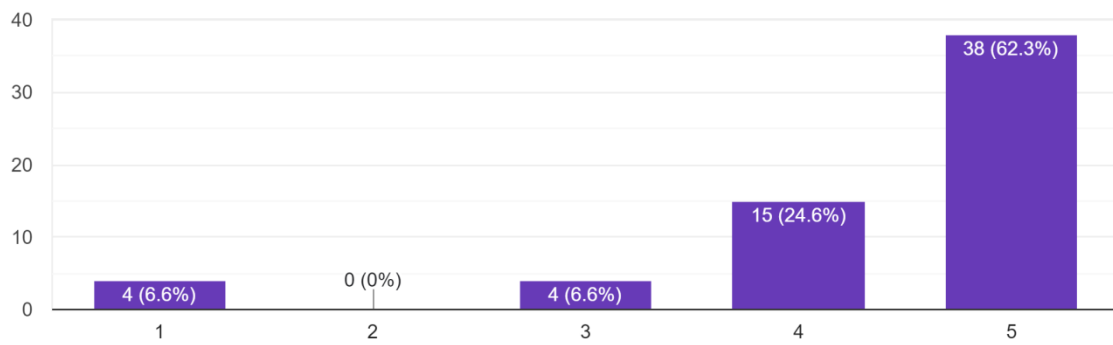

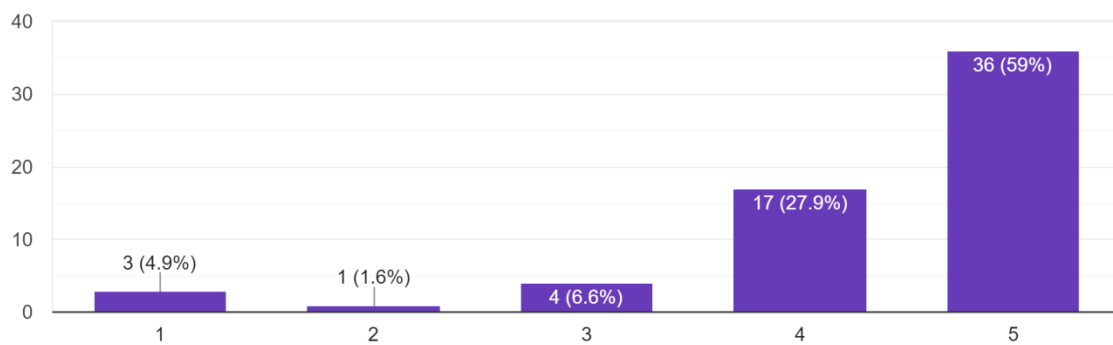

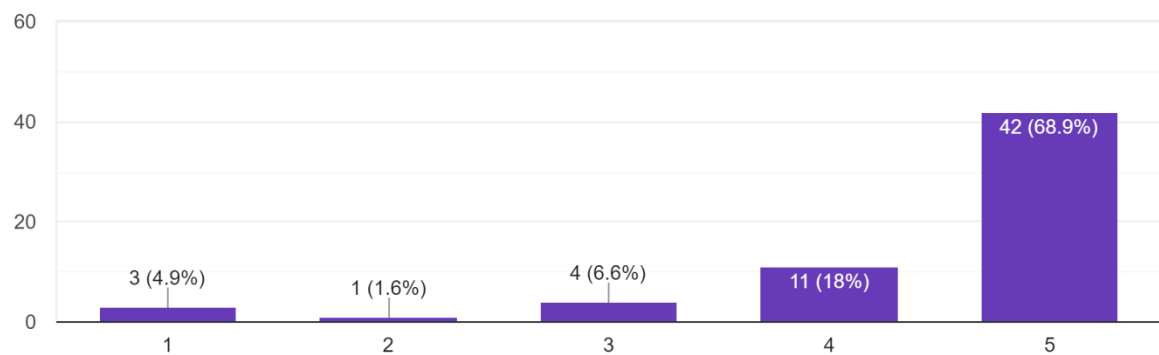
How do you rate the Technical Arrangement and Execution of the event?

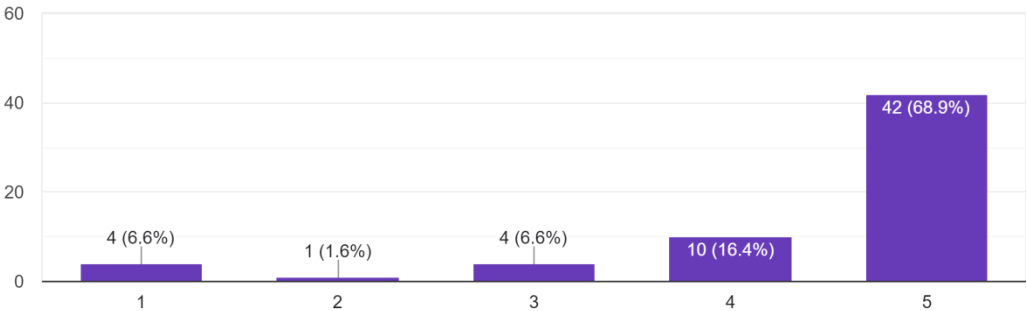

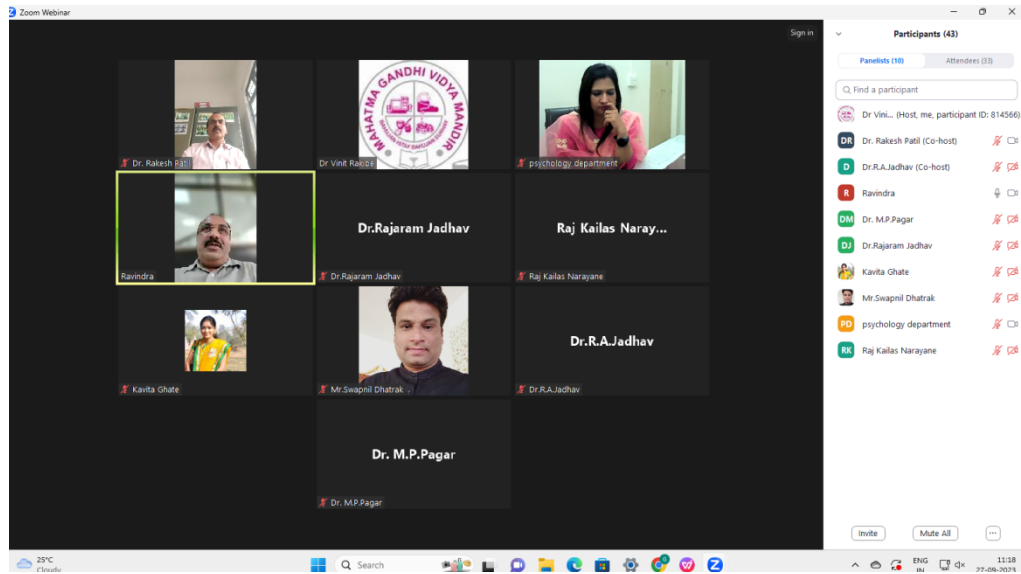

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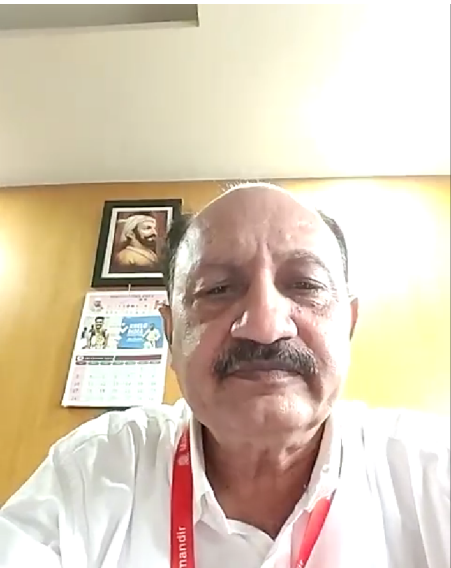
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
