**PROCEDURES FOR NO SCHOOL/DELAYED OPENINGS AND EARLY DISMISSAL DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER - Stamford Public Schools REGULATION #6110-R.**

**No School/Delayed Opening**

In the event of inclement weather, the Superintendent of Schools will make a decision to cancel school or have a delayed opening early in the morning, after consulting with Transportation and Facilities personnel. Information about no school or a delayed opening is announced to the public no later than 6:00a.m.

Below is a chart that explains your child's adjusted day based on their program FOR A DELAYED OPENING:

School begins at 10:00 a.m. for a delayed opening.

Students who leave at 10:30 a.m. every day, will not have school on a delayed opening.

**Early Dismissal**

Occasionally, weather conditions may necessitate dismissing school early. If the best available forecast indicates weather conditions will become hazardous by the end of the school day, the Superintendent of Schools will announce an early dismissal by 6:00a.m. This information is available to the public via the website ([www.stamfordpublicschools.org](http://www.stamfordpublicschools.org)) and area radio and TV stations. If, however, weather forecasts become increasingly hazardous after the school day has already begun, the Superintendent of Schools will make an early dismissal announcement by 10:00a.m. In a rare circumstance, an emergency may present itself after 10:00a.m. which may necessitate an early dismissal. **Parent Responsibility**

It is the parent or guardian's responsibility to keep informed of the latest weather forecast to determine if an early dismissal has been announced, since schools may not be able to contact each parent individually.

### **Early Release Days**

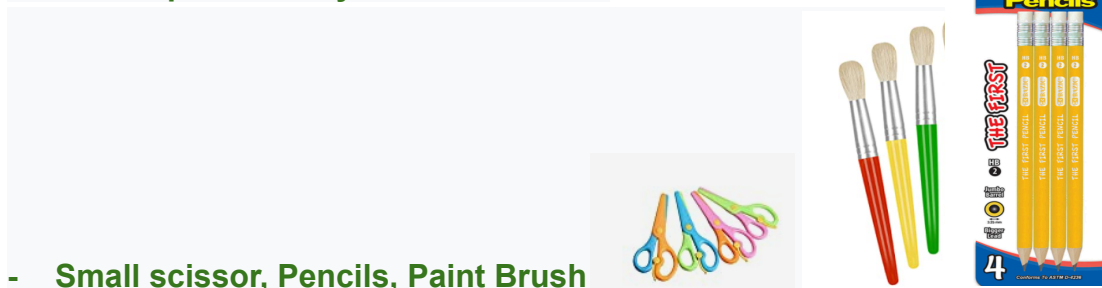

We thank you in advance for your support with School Supplies for your child. Please only purchase what you can! We are also working with Staples and Pitney Bowes to support our needed School Supplies. We have purchased small bins for all these materials to be stored in.

To continue to maintain the health and safety of our APPLES community please do your best to send in **any (no need to buy all)** of the following supplies:

- Unscented hypo-allergenic baby wipes
- Child safe, disinfectant wipes (no alcohol, no bleach)
- Tissues
- paper towels
- ziplock bags (sandwich and gallon sizes)

**Each child will also need:**

- a backpack and lunch box
- a water bottle with a straw that has been filled at home
- Masks are OPTIONAL. IF you want your child to wear a mask, we will need you to send more than one. If the mask can have a lanyard **Please label your child's mask with their name.**
- 2 extra sets of clothes **LABELED** in plastic bags
  - (shirt, pants, shoes, underwear, socks)

\*\*\*If your child is **not** toilet trained, you will need to provide us with wipes and diapers to change your child.

**Arrival and Dismissal Procedures**

Parents who are driving children to and from school will use the Loveland Road entrance. Please do not get out of your car until you reach the door. Parents are responsible for

buckling and unbuckling car seats. School staff will meet the children and walk them to and from their classrooms.

School staff will meet the children and walk them to their classrooms upon arrival and will put them on the buses at dismissal. Any planned changes in a child's usual transportation home **must be made in writing and given to the classroom teacher or office as soon as parents are aware.**

**Friendly reminder: Please remember to buckle your children into their car seat before leaving the premises. It's the law!**

### **Attendance/Sickness**

Your child is expected to attend school **every day** unless an illness, family emergency or unavoidable circumstance prevents his/her participation. Our staff will call or e-mail home to inquire when your child does not come to school. When children are late for school or are picked-up before the end of the school day they are missing important learning opportunities. We can't do our best work if your child is not at school.

If your child is absent due to illness, please make sure to contact the school nurse directly. Darline Gaspard can be reached at 203-977-8868 or [DGaspard@stamfordct.gov](mailto:DGaspard@stamfordct.gov). It is imperative that Darline know what illness your child is suffering from. Darline will inform you of next steps based on current CDC guidance.

### **COVID Guidance**

We follow all regulations given by the Stamford Public Schools, Office of Early Childhood and Governor's Orders.

### **Backpacks**

Families are encouraged to provide backpacks for children to carry belongings to and from school. Please be sure **all personal items** are labeled with your child's name.

### **Change of Clothes**

Preschool play is often messy! Children might get wet when playing in the water table, dirty when playing outdoors, spill milk at lunch or have a toileting accident during the day. Please send a labeled change of clothes including socks and under garments that can be left at school for these "just-in-case" times. If your child is in the midst of toilet training, we may need multiple sets of clothes, wipes, and diapers/pull-ups. If your child is not toilet trained, please make sure we have an extra set anyway, along with diapers/pull-ups and wipes. Please place these clothes in a labeled large zip lock bag.

### **Outdoor Play**

Children will have an outdoor play period (recess) daily. Please be sure children are dressed for play. Children should wear sneakers (No crocs, "flip-flops" or sandals) and "play" clothes.

Hats and mittens are needed for cold weather months. In the warmer months please put sunscreen on your child. We cannot do that here without a doctor's note.

### **School Program Meals**

Chartwell's School Dining Services provides breakfast, lunch and snack for children. Chartwell's staff can be reached by calling 203-977-4737. **Please be sure the Nurse, Darline Gaspard, is made aware of any food allergies.**

Under state law, children with life-threatening food allergies may be entitled to an individualized health care plan, regardless of the child's status as a child with a disability under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 or under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. The Stamford Public Schools has developed guidelines for managing students with life-threatening food allergies. For more information, please contact the Food Service Director at (203) 977-4732.

Great news for you and your children! Stamford Public Schools has been approved to provide free healthy breakfast and lunch at school to all students during the 2023-24 school year!

- You do not need to do anything.
- You do not have to pay any money or fill out any forms.
- You do not need to send your child to school early for breakfast. Breakfast will be part of the school day.

### **School Safety**

Safety procedures require that:

- ❖ Exterior and classroom doors are locked at all times.
- ❖ All staff wear a BOE Identification Card at all times.
- ❖ Visitors sign-in and receive a Visitor Identification card/badge in the APPLES ECEC Office.
- ❖ Safety drills occur as directed by BOE policy.

Your child will not be released to another adult without your written consent. This person will be required to show a photo identification card.

Teachers, other school staff and District employees who become aware of, witness acts of, or receive a student report relating to a student experiencing bullying, harassment or discrimination are required to promptly notify the school principal in writing.

The Stamford Public Schools prohibits threatening to or retaliating against any other person for reporting or filing a complaint, for aiding or encouraging the filing of a report or complaint, or for cooperating in an investigation of harassment or discrimination.

Each school has a staff member(s) who is available to answer questions and receive complaints about civil rights violations including discrimination and harassment. They can assist students or parents/guardians with making a complaint, seeking supportive measures, or
