- a. Discussion Item-<u>Budget</u>, <u>ESSER</u>, School Building Funds Mrs. Lanell Farmer reported that we are at 91.67% through our budget.
- b. Discussion Item—Extra-Curricular Activities Spring 2022. Mr Josh Wells reviewed Spring sports, track, golf, softball, & baseball. Overall participation has increased in extra-curricular activities.
- c. Discussion Item—Year End Administrator. Three administrators reviewed goals and progress of school year 2021-22. Ms. Elswood discussed the team effort of her staff and the success of the literacy committee. Next year they will continue to focus on vocabulary and combining PLC and PBIS strategies in the coming year. Mr. Heath commented on the team work and comraderie of the Stuart Elementary staff. they implemented Sources of Strength and started a PTO. Goals for upcoming year will include PBIS committee, get ISAT scores above state average. Mrs. Markham reported results of student survey, increased efforts to communicate with parents, Next years goals include improving parent communication, better prepare studens for ISAT, and increase school pride and unity.
- d. Discussion Item—Shelley Workbased academy, SWA. Mr. Messick reported that SWA had 6 seniors graduate Staff will be meeting over the summer break to address board concerns and visit other alternative schools. Board will meet on July 11, 6 pm for worksession.
