Santa Clara County: COVID19 Eviction Moratorium	Resources to stop evictions for families impacted by COVID-19	<p>If you are a tenant, the ordinance provides you with temporary protection from evictions for non-payment of rent if you can demonstrate your income has been substantially reduced due to the COVID-19 pandemic. My Benefits CalWin	Financial Assistance	CalWORKs is a cash aid program for low income families to meet their basic needs. It also provides education, employment, and training programs to help families get jobs and move towards self-sufficiency. Child care, transportation, work expenses and counseling are available for families in work activities. There is a forty-eight month time limit for adults but the children can remain on aid if otherwise eligible under the Safety Net program. There are special services for pregnant and parenting teens through the CalLearn program. CalWORKs program is for pregnant women, or Adults or Teen Parent(s) with dependent children (minors under the age of 19) who are deprived of parental support or care. Refugee families with children may qualify for cash aid, medical assistance, employment services and other support services. To see if you are eligible click here . (408.440.2575), a day or two before the scheduled clinic to ensure that it will be held. You will be seen on a first come, first served basis. We recommend that you arrive before 8:00am to be sure to be seen. You will be provided a 30 minute free legal session with an attorney.
