Red Flags to Watch Out for When Researching TX Solar Energy Companies

As you're searching for a good fit in a solar company, here is a hit list of red flags to watch out for:

- Poor customer reviews and ratings, including frequent and recent negative reviews across multiple platforms or common complaints
- High-pressure sales tactics, such as sales representatives pushing for immediate decisions, promises of "limited-time offers" or discounts that require quick commitments
- Lack of transparency, unclear pricing, and hidden fees not disclosed upfront, or vague answers about costs, warranties, or contract terms
- Unresponsive customer service, including difficulty reaching customer support, and slow or no response to emails, calls, or service requests
- Substandard equipment and use of low-quality or unrecognized brands for solar panels and inverters, as well as a lack of information about the efficiency and durability of the equipment to be installed

- Inadequate or nonexistent warranties, including short-term warranties or ones that lack comprehensive coverage, no performance guarantees, or unclear warranty terms
- Inconsistent or limited experience installing solar systems, few installations completed, limited experience in the industry, and a lack of certifications or training for installers
- Negative reports from regulatory bodies, e.g. complaints filed with the Better Business Bureau (BBB), legal actions, or penalties from regulatory authorities
- Unclear financing terms, complicated or confusing financing options, high-interest rates, or unfavorable loan terms
- Lack of local presence, no local office or representation in Texas, and limited knowledge of Texas-specific incentives and regulations.

Some factors include the cost of the panels themselves, the cost of batteries, inverters, and charge controllers, labor and more – all of which can vary in price from place to place.

What are the standard warranties and guarantees offered by solar companies?

Solar panels generally come with two warranties: The product warranty covers the equipment and generally guarantees at least 10-12 years without fail, while the power or performance warranty often guarantees at least 90% production at 10 years and 80% at 25 years

How do I find customer reviews and ratings for solar companies?

Look at reputable review sources, including Google, EnergySage, Reviews.io, Reddit, and Yelp.

How long does an average solar panel installation take from start to finish?

The actual installation only takes a few days, but the entire process can take anywhere from two to six months, due to permitting, property conditions, upgrades to the electrical system that may be necessary, potential integrations with the grid, inspections, and more. A qualified installer will be able to walk you through the process before you start.
