

Livestock PDC: Education Standing Committee

Purpose/Summary:

• Providing educational opportunities for current and prospective members.

Time required/Dates of commitment:

- Committee meets three or four times each year
- Additional meetings as determined by the committee or with 4-H staff

Responsibilities:

- Organize education workshops in partnership with staff
- Support project bowl teams
- Identify opportunities for members to increase the quality of their projects
- Encouraging opportunities in regional and statewide opportunities.
- Identity opportunities to educate the public.

This role is ideal for:

- Those who enjoy working with youth and adults on a team around a common purpose.
- An individual with strong organizational skills in and content knowledge of livestock.
- Individuals who have an interest in and concern for the strength, quality, and overall well-being of the livestock project and its members.
- Individuals who enjoy supporting youth in their learning and who enjoy sharing knowledge and skills with youth.

Requirements:

- Knowledge of 4-H livestock project area
- Ability to work well with a variety of people
- Ability to work under pressure and adjust accordingly
- Good communication skills
- Knowledge of livestock safety and 4-H rules
