## **COP28 BIG AG DELEGATES ANALYSIS**

Analysis by DeSmog (November, 30 - December 7, 2023)

## **Working definitions**

For the purpose of this investigation, a **Big Ag lobbyist** is defined as an individual who can be reasonably assumed to have the objective of influencing the formulation or implementation of policy or legislation in the interests of a Big Ag company, its shareholders, or a Big Ag trade association.

We define a **Big Ag company** as the largest companies – by market share – operating across the industry agri-food chain. This includes manufacturers of synthetic pesticides and fertilizers; seed, grains and committees companies; industrial meat and dairy companies, and the world's largest food processors.

We define **Big Ag trade association** as any trade body representing the interests of Big Ag companies as defined above, or representing a high-emissions agricultural sector and/ or with a proven track record of lobbying against measures to address emissions from industrial farming.
