# **Course Description**

All NCS Choral ensembles are designed to promote academic achievement through music analysis, evaluation, and performance. Students enrolled will actively participate in solo and ensemble performances, as well as learn the basic fundamentals of singing and musicianship.

# **Expectations**

All students who participate in the Naples choral program assume the responsibilities of being a member of an ensemble. In order to make this group as successful as possible, students are expected to give their best when it comes to singing, listening, creating and following all classroom rules.

# **Classroom Rules and Procedures**

- **1.) Participate!** This includes singing with your <u>best</u> voice, standing with correct posture, and <u>not talking when instruction is taking place</u>.
- 2.) Respect yourself, your peers, your teacher and all equipment.
- 3.) **No food or drinks** (including gum) will be allowed during rehearsals. Capped water bottles are the exception unless they become a distraction.
- 4.) **Be on time.** Students arriving late without a pass will have up to 2 points removed from that day's participation grade. 3 unexcused late arrivals will result in a referral in accordance to the Naples code of conduct.
- 5.) Use the restroom and water fountain before class as students will not be permitted to do so during class unless it is an emergency.
- 6.) **Follow classroom Procedures.** Upon arriving to class, students will retrieve their folders and sit in their assigned seat unless otherwise instructed. Students who fail to do this will have points removed from that day's 5 point participation grade.

# **Consequences of misbehaviors:**

- 1) Verbal warning
- 2) One on one discussion
- 3) Parent Contacted
- 4) "Write up" for administrators

# **Required Supplies**

- Concert Attire: Black and white formal. No short skirts or sneakers please.
- **FOLDER (provided):** Each student will be assigned a black choral folder which will be used during each rehearsal. Students are responsible for keeping their music neatly in the folder along with a pencil. At the end of rehearsal, students are responsible for returning their folder to its assigned number slot. \*If a folder is found to not be returned for an unexcused reason students will be given one reminder. Thereafter 2 points will be deducted from their overall chorus grade each time it is found out of place. Students will also have points deducted if their folder is not taken care of (ie. ripped, drawn on, etc.)

# **Grading**

#### **Concerts and Performances**

•	All school sponsored performances are mandatory. See calendar for dates.
	☐ Any unexcused absence from a concert or festival will <u>significantly</u>
	compromise a student's choir grade. If a student needs a ride to the
	concert we can facilitate that but we ask that you please give us at least 3
	days notice if at all possible.
	☐ If a student is in school on the day of the concert and yet cannot attend
	due to a medical issue, a doctor's note is required. A concert make up
	assignment will then be given to the student in lieu of the concert.
	$\Box$ Concert grades will be based on the following: behavior during the <i>dress</i>
	rehearsal prior to the concert, arriving on time for warm ups the night
	of the concert, being dressed appropriately, and acting appropriately
	before and during the concert.

## Class participation and attendance

Participation during rehearsals is expected. If a student is absent or misbehaving enough that they are unable to pull their weight in the ensemble (or is bringing the group down), their grade will be impacted as seen fit by the director. If a student can not demonstrate proficiency with the music, it is within the directors right to not let them perform with the group the night of the concert.

#### **Lessons and assessments**

• Lessons are a required part of the chorus curriculum. Students will be scheduled for lessons throughout the quarter (approximately 5 lessons per quarter depending on the number of students in each ensemble). I do my very best to rotate each lesson group so students are not missing the same class more than once per quarter.
