[julian] Stripe typings update

Option 1:

Create a full set of generics and override the default Stripe return types.

Our application would work with types such as Stripe.Subscription<Stripe.Customer>. Calls to Stripe would be generic and would infer the return type based on the `expanded` property passed.

Pros:

- Nicest API to interact with in general

Cons:

- A lot to maintain, effectively reworking Stripe's entire typing system
- May not be necessary, since we're wrapping Stripe in a library anyway
- Types-only implementation would probably not be enough, since with types only a function that requires `Stripe.Subscription<Stripe.Customer>` could not be passed `Stripe.Subscription<Stripe.Customer & Stripe.PaymentMethod>` since the `default_payment_method` property would not be a compatible type.

Option 2:

In our own Stripe lib, cast Stripe results to our own types on top of the response type set. We then can work with our own defined subset of typings that fully encapsulate Stripe's typings.

Our application would work with types such as Subscription<Customer> where Customer and Subscription are both types that are defined and maintained by us, and come from the Stripe lib in our own codebase.

Pros:

- Easier to maintain
- Still get some of the flexibility of generics
- Can define a function that requires `Subscription<Customer>` could be passed `Subscription<Customer & PaymentMethod>` since it would be implemented as a 'wider' type with `default_payment_method_id` and `default_payment_method` properties unlike the merged type Stripe has.

Cons:

- Having boutique types for every single Stripe type would still be a good deal of overhead

Option 3:

Never use expanded properties outside of Stripe library. All application behavior uses expanded properties that are always "string".

Stripe data layer can use expand, but we never return expanded types from the library and always break out data to non-expanded variants within our own library level before exposing them to the rest of the app.

Pros:

- Easy to maintain

Cons:

- Could result in more calls to the Stripe API
- Less "pretty" to have function require certain params, but arguably much clearer. For example a method that needs both a subscription and it's customer would have signature `myFn(customer: Customer, subscription: Subscription) ...` rather than `myFn(customer: Customer<Subscription>) ...`.

Notetaker: Bianca Ivo: Options:

- Keep RSC using Monitor's approach to get around inability to use Context
 - The way it works now: LocalizationProvider is passed in navigator.languages which fetches FTL files for browser locales.
 - No navigator.languages or React.Context in RSC (can't use createContext)
 - Their workaround:
 - Instead of importing React.Localization from fluent/react, have to drill into the ES Module and pull it from there rather than use the exposed API.
 - If implementation details ever changed, that could cause problems.
 - Other issue: no access to DOM APIs in RSC
 - Their implementation relies on what environment they're in:
 - Storybook
 - Don't pass in a markup parser
 - Else

- Write own markup parser, since they don't have access to `document` from the web API.
- Also have to stub out `document` server-side with `js-dom`.
- Can use fluent/react to build the bundles, but can't use fluent/react to localize any of their components.
 - E.g. AddEmailDialog component
 - `l10n` object is an extended version of their custom React localization object.
 Also can't use `Localized` component, since that relies on `React.Context`.
 - Monitor already wasn't using `Localization` prior to moving to NextJS so less for them to lose.
 - Talking with Vincent on the Monitor team:
 - Their team tends to favor the `l10n` methods rather than `Localized` components. They're fighting the framework to use fluent/react.
- We want to avoid bespoke implementations ideally.
- Use fluent/bundle instead of fluent/react with RSC
 - Avoids issues with having to use js-dom and run React.Localization server side.
 - To generate the bundles, we do it server-side I read the files from the local file system and create the bundles manually.
 We could do this only at start up and shared across all requests.
 - In the component itself, you have to grab and parse the AcceptLanguage header, and instead of using navigator.Languages, you can use that.
 - Use 110n` methods here instead of `Localized` component from react/fluent.
- Client components (no RSC)
 - Getting I10n to work with client side components was very easy; salvages implementation from 2.5.
 - Same approach currently used by FxA and supported by Fluent.
 - Can use our familiar `Localized` component.
- I18n package from NextJS (in Beta) for RSC
 - Routes-based approach for determine locale. Locale is part of the route.
 - Similar to how fluent/react works, but we'd have to parse all our FTL files into JSON objects that can be consumed by NextJS's I18n package.
 - See also this <u>question</u>

Ivo's thoughts:

- It makes sense to ditch RSC and use client components, so we can share React components with FxA.
- With how new RSC is wrt React and NextJS, might behoove us to wait.

Questions:

- Bianca: For Bryan, are there plans to support RSC with Fluent?
 - Bryan: Eemli would be the best person. Not a lot of effort on Fluent right now. Different implementation is being focused on right now: Message Format 2.0
 - Ivo: Eemli said there's nothing in RSC spec from React that prohibits using React.Context, this was a decision by the NextJS team.
- Lauren: Is Message Format 2.0 going to replace Fluent at some point?
 - Bryan: It's pretty long-term. I wouldn't expect any changes in the next couple of years. Trying to design it with Fluent in mind to make migration easier.
- Bianca: Seems like main benefit is perf for RSC, which is not a goal for SubPlat 3.0 per the PRD.
 - Ivo: I profiled some of our pages relative to other pages that are more complex like youtube.com.
 - Our page
 - Largest Contentful Paint happens around 1s. Everything after is mostly PayPal stuff.
 - DOMContentLoaded around 200-300 ms.
 - Our page is fairly fast.
 - Amazon.com
 - LCP ~2s
 - FCP: ~1s
 - Highly optimized and much more complex than ours
 - Youtube.com
 - LCP: ~2.6s
 - FCP: > 1s
 - Highly optimized and much more complex than ours
 - Wikipedia.com
 - LCP ~1s
 - FCP ~500ms
- Reino: It's not just page performance for RSC. It also does simplify development quite a bit.
 - Like you said, not too much going on on our pages. RSC brings it back to working with pretty standard HTML.
 - You colocate everything in one component so data fetches occur in that component.
 - It is different from how we're doing stuff right now.
 - No hooks available in RSC. Get data and show it on the page.

- Ivo: With how new RSC is, I don't think there's not a lot of tooling.
 - In DevTools Network Monitor, looking at the RSC requests, they have their own wire format
 - Attaching VSCode debugger with RSC I wasn't able to get working; FWIW I've added some launch.json configs in the past and with my prior experience I wasn't able to get it working.
- Reino: If it's useful, maybe I can give a little context into how we arrived here re: the original decision to use RSC
 - At the beginning of the year, NextJS's AppRouter was still in Beta, so we used the PageRouter.
 - First version prototype stated we plan to adopt AppRouter when it becomes stable.
 - Around May, App Router switched over to stable release.
 - Why we looked at NextJS and Gatsby: We decided SSR was the way we wanted to go. In a way RSC is a better version of SSR. You can just call the DB or API directly with near-0 latency.
 - We're starting development now. By the time we go to production, it will have been a year of development where the dependency ecosystem will have caught up.
 - We also looked at server actions. But this is still in alpha, and there's not much documentation around it.
 - Monitor got it working not just with RSC but also with Storybook.
 - Ivo: Getting something working and doing a large re-write where we're trying to avoid bespoke implementations seem a little different.
- Chelsea: Reminder: A group this size will not get to a decision during the meeting.
 - Formally, we should start a decision brief for this. Outline pros and cons for each option. We also want Ben to weigh in on.
- Ivo: If we do stick with RSC, I'd suggest we don't use Monitor's approach but instead fluent/bundle.
- Bianca: If we use RSC, it seems like we won't be able to use FxA components at all (since they use React.Context and `Localized` components and client side components exclusively).
 - Julian: We won't be able to use `fxa-react` in any integrated apps as-is.
 - We would need to rewrite `fxa-react` as an `nx` library.
- Bryan: For NextJS I18n package: is it a matter of reformatting the Fluent files in some way?
 - Ivo: Also they pull locale from the Route

- Bryan: Does that work with on the fly variables? Fluent does a lot of I18N like converting numbers/dates to the correct format.
- Ivo: It does support variables, but Fluent is pretty robust in that regard, and I don't know how much of that can be salvaged.
- Ivo: I would rule out this approach: it's a different file format, it uses a route based approach for locales, it's still in Beta.

Ivo: What are our most important goals here for SubPlat 3.0?

- Reusable code
- Performance
- Reduce complexity
- ...?

Reino: It isn't an all or nothing approach. We can start small with some components where we get the most value. Also make foundation so that we can adopt server components.

- Bianca: We'll always have client components since RSC can't have interactivity or event listeners.
- Reino: It's considered an add-on.

Next steps:

- Chelsea: Let's get together those POCs for the different approaches.
- Bianca: **ADR** or Decision Brief? Seems like ADR since largely technical.
 - Chelsea: Whether we need outside input (non-engineering) as part of the decision determines which is most appropriate.
 - All: Let's try for ADR first and we can change to a Decision Brief if needed.

- Create more tickets
- Big pr that closes several issues
- Steeper learning curve
- If someone else especially someone who only works in a more singular perspective - is sizing things initially, it can feel like we're dealing a blow
 - Dynamic has changed with the building up of our team - everyone on the team is much more familiar with how things work, the processes, the codebase
 - Team-oriented breakdowns early on helps a lot with this
 - there are still non-product non-engineering questions that come up - how can we bring the right people in at the right time
- Rest/Rush
 - Often surprised by the ones that are more difficult
 - Themes of the surprises?
 - Bespoke implementations of something where someone might not have set up who is still on the team
 - If patterns were departed from later in the code
 - Minimizing the bespoke implementations would go a long way for code maintainability and consequently team health
 - Initial implementation of react is very different from the standards that we're developing against today and often means we're having to gapfill unexpectedly
- Slowdowns and large tickets occur when we're doing things that aren't good patterns
 - Typescript is a particular pet peeve
 - Skirting the rules
 - Dealing with many of the react 18 things because we didn't keep up wth the current curve we had a bigger lift to make it work
- Siloed work
 - Mini projects a year ago everyone was doing their work independently - and over the last year we've focused on having much fewer projects at a given time
 - Still feels we're working in siloes
 - Pair programming or working with others are different ways to address a similar thing

- Feels not great to hear that people are feeling like they're banging their heads against the wall late at night because we can help each other out, learn new ways to do things
- Not everything can or will be in the ticket
- What can we do to help each other?
 - Post things learnings, questions whatever to channel.
 - You don't necessarily have to "pair program" in its traditional meaning to be able to help each other.
 - Pull request reviews conversations that happen around that pull request reviews - would be really helpful to have in that subplat channel
 - Announcing pull requests as they're merged in channel
 - I merged this. It did this which will be useful for that. Check it out!
 - If it sets a new standard, introduces something new...whatever.
- Are you comfortable if someone who is not your assigned reviewer comments on your PR?
 - o No
 - Elements of distrust
 - Feelings of 'design by committee' leaves author or pr
 - When it's a draft or wip and the comment is about something you are missing (but you intend to do), it takes time away or out of your zone reading comments about it.
 - Yes
 - Not about trust for me. If I can jump in, I want to give some input or thoughts - not reviewing every single nitpick in a PR, stylistic things are not valid in a code review. Taking some time out to sharing the thought my input - maybe they didn't think about it, might conflict with my track of work - whatever it happens to be.
 - Questions?
 - If someone who isn't the reviewer jumps in with a question or request, do you expect that to be addressed?
 - Yes, with discussions it's collaboration.
 - What are the issues that really matter?

The FxA team doesn't have much appetite for maintaining alternative UIs since that can be hard to scale and we've run into those UIs getting out of sync. One option we discussed is to maintain a separate react captcha component that could be used by both teams. One drawback of this is we'd need to use a locally-hosted captcha since we don't host 3rd party JS on the accounts.f.c domain. Since the payments server is on its own domain with 3rd party JS you could run state-of-the-art captchas (the kind most users don't even notice) which would be a better experience for customers. cc @Chelsea Lewis • Potentially handing off two email input fields to fxa - Reino and Wil connected briefly, Ben is sharing context from the fxa meeting • Fxa team pulled up fields in question, they do not do the same thing in fxa today. Fxa's captcha would need to work very differently than our own. As this is not a component
