

A Dialog on Police Accountability and Justice

Chicago Justice Project May 25, 2016: 6pm - \$50

The ongoing investigation initiated by the United States Department of Justice Civil Rights Division into the Chicago Police Department has potential to lead to great change within the police accountability system; however, there are also significant limitations to the power of federal officials to force in meaningful change. Chicago's civil community will have to step up and make sure any voids left by the federal investigation are filled. We hope this is the start of the discussions between experts on police accountability and the civil community in Chicago looking towards creating meaningful lasting change in both policing and the police accountability system in Chicago.
