Going into business with God

- The horn in Daniel 7:21 makes war with the Saints
- This war is a noisy war, just noise
- The horn prevails against the Saints until the Ancient of Days comes
- The horn constantly makes war with the Saints, and God allows it until His judgment
- Judgment is given to the Saints of the most high
- The time comes when the Saints possess the kingdom
- The little horn in Daniel is blowing and accusing the Saints before God
- The Ancient of Days will come and judge between the horn's accusations and the Saints' evidence
- The judgment will be in favor of the Saints and they will receive the kingdom of God
- Sermon topic: Going into business with God
- Partners in a business have strengths and weaknesses
- Partnership example: Car dealership with strengths in selling cars
- It is important to recognize and utilize each partner's strengths in a business partnership

God's Restoration Services

- God has a business of creation and recreation. His purpose is not destruction, but to build and restore.
- God's business is restoration. He loves to build, allow things to break, and then rebuild them better than before.
- Satan may try to break and destroy, but God sees the beauty in brokenness and restores it.
- God allows us to be broken, but He instructs Satan to break us only in certain areas that He can rebuild.
- If we go through brokenness and restoration, we will come out unrecognizable to others.
- The speaker reflects on his own life and how things could have turned out differently if he had stayed under the guidance of a pastor.

Restoration and Creation by the God I Serve

- The speaker discusses the concept of restoration and the God they serve.
- They mention that they could have "turned out like that" and been broken, but God allowed them to go through difficulties to show the power of restoration.
- The God they serve is a master restorer even in the midst of messiness and baggage.

- The speaker expresses concern for people who don't have any baggage, as they may not understand the transformative power of being restored by God.
- They compare the restoration of Humpty Dumpty to the restoration of one's life by God.
- God's business is creation and recreation, including restoration, and he is never in the destroying business.
- If God allows someone to be destroyed, it is because grace is needing another trophy to put back together.
- The God they serve is not worried about mistakes or the past, as he is a restorer.
- Those who work on someone's life without aiming to restore them are not of God but of the devil.
- The speaker emphasizes that true Sons of God rejoice when someone else is promoted or recognized.
- The original creation by Yahweh was perfect, but it was broken and destroyed, resulting in the fallen state of the world.
- The world is currently filled with cruelty and Nephilim Spirits.

The Restoration of Creation and Going into Business with God

- In the past, it was customary for men to remove their hats when entering a church as a sign of respect for God.
- The concept of respect for God seems to be fading in modern times.
- Yahweh has a plan to restore creation.
- The restoration will not be solely carried out by God, but individuals will be partners in this process.
- The idea of going into business with God is emphasized.
- The term "Yahweh International LLC" is used as a metaphorical representation of this partnership.
- However, until the restoration is complete, believers will face opposition from Satan.
- The reason for the battle is not explicitly mentioned, but it is implied that it is related to the ministry's efforts to spread the pure word of God against the world.
- Leaving or joining the ministry can result in encountering unexpected battles.
- The restoration of creation will be reflected in individuals who are part of the prototype.
- Just like a prototype car showcases features of the final product, believers will exemplify what Yahweh will do in others.
- In this partnership, individuals are called to be prototypes and salespeople for Yahweh's plan.
- The purpose of individuals being prototypes is to inspire a desire for the restoration in others.

- The prototype will demonstrate what will happen during the recreation when Yahweh restores everything.
- The ultimate goal is for even the animals, represented by the lions and lambs, to coexist peacefully in Zion, a true Israelite church.

Unity and Partnership with God

- The speaker discusses the importance of unity within the church and the prototype that God is building.
- The church should strive for a spirit of unity where gossip, hurt feelings, insinuations, and assumptions are strangers.
- The love of God should flow from the hearts of church members to one another.
- God is building a prototype of unity and love in this church, which will be attractive to the world.
- In God's kingdom, there will be no jealous spirits, gossip, or divisions.
- The speaker expresses excitement about what God is building now and what He will do in the future.
- They emphasize the desire to be business partners with God, loving, forgiving, overlooking, and helping people as God does.
- The speaker references Jeremiah 29:11-13 and expresses belief that the church will go in business with God, giving everything they've got.
- They anticipate a future where everyone will be a servant to one another, and God is currently creating that prototype.

The Importance of Joy and Unity in the Church

- The Bible emphasizes the importance of the joy of the Lord covering the whole earth.
- Without this joy, one cannot effectively be a part of the community.
- The church is characterized by joy unspeakable and full of glory.
- In the future, there will be a day when everyone gathers to pray together.
- The church is a family that prays together and supports each other.
- Even if not physically healed, believers should act as if they are healed.
- The goal for every member of the church is to be a 100% committed follower of Christ.
- It is important for the church to remain unified and not be divided into separate groups.
- The congregation's response during the sermon was recorded and observed.
- There is no room for those who are only partially committed to their faith in the church.

Running with Patience and Remaining Focused

- The importance of running without distractions and continuing to run regardless of obstacles or setbacks
- Running with the footman and running with the horsemen signifies persevering and not giving up
- Running until there is no strength left emphasizes the need to push oneself to the limit
- Falling during a race can be detrimental, so it is essential to stay focused and complete the race
- Staying in the race regardless of who comes or goes and being part of God's current work
- The significance of God's plans for individuals, which are thoughts of peace and not of evil
- Even in the presence of evil, God's plans remain good and individuals should trust in His intentions
- The idea of God having an expected end for individuals, meaning that He has a predetermined outcome or purpose for their lives
- The role of faith in trusting God's plans and remaining strong, even in challenging times

God's Plan and Seeking His Guidance

- God has a plan for your life and wants you to be an overcomer and inherit the kingdom of God.
- He will show you your expected end, which is His plan and purpose for you.
- Despite any current struggles, His plan for you is out there and you need to take God's hand and follow Him.
- God's plans for you are not evil, even though it may feel that way at times, as He uses various circumstances to bring about a good plan.
- You need to call upon God, pray to Him, and He will hear you.
- It is necessary to seek God and His guidance to know your expected end and destiny.
- God will reveal to you your destiny through a man of God, but you need to actively seek Him and the Old Paths.
- God will not walk the journey for you, but He has left footprints in the valley for you to follow.
- You must walk your own path and go through the Lonesome Valley to reach your destination.
- Even in the midst of difficulties, you have to keep walking and trust in God's plan.

Seeking after God and Finding Your Expected End

- The text emphasizes the importance of seeking after God to find Him and your expected end.
- The expected end is described as the kingdom of God, where Yahweh stands.
- Seeking after God and the kingdom of God is a personal responsibility.
- The text mentions a woman named Sister Baker who had to walk through a valley alone, despite the support of others.
- It is stated that God will show you your expected end.
- Isaiah 58:14 is referenced as a verse that reveals God's expected end for individuals.
- God's expected end involves partnering with Him and establishing Yahweh and Sons Incorporated.
- God's future plans include opening a remodeling shop that will bring hope to those perceived as without hope.
- The roles of individuals and the world are differentiated, with individuals being the prototype and the world being the beneficiaries.

Protecting My Wife and Choosing Silence

- The writer emphasizes the importance of protecting their wife from certain things.
- They consider challenging someone publicly on Zoom to clear up any misunderstandings.
- The writer recalls the phrase "What would Jesus do" and decides to remain silent, just as Jesus did.
- The writer believes that they have the right to remain silent, as anything they say can be used against them.
- God tells the writer to shut up and demonstrates how silence can be a powerful tool.
- The writer wants to set an example for the world on how to fight battles by letting God fight for them.
- There are false rumors circulating that the writer and their wife were not really at Marago, accompanied by fake pictures.
- The writer receives texts accusing them of lying and challenges of proof, but they do not want to waste time addressing them.
- The writer believes in the power of truth to set them free from the criticism and bondage of others.

Trust and Expected End

- In this context, the speaker emphasizes the importance of trust and unity within the church community.
- The speaker highlights that in the kingdom of God, trust in one another is valued and important.

- The speaker calls for members of the church to trust that they are loved and supported.
- The speaker contrasts the trusting nature of the church with a negative portrayal of the world and the Patriots movement, where everything is seen as a lie.
- The speaker asserts that everything in the church is based on truth and encourages trust in this prototype of the kingdom.
- The speaker mentions being taught by the Holy Ghost to embody the prototype of the kingdom.
- The speaker references Isaiah 58-14 and explains that God's plan is for individuals to ride upon the high places of the Earth (government) and also enjoy the heritage of Jacob (Israelite heritage).
- The speaker reveals that the expected end for individuals is to rule in the government as an Israelite.
- The speaker states that Satan's goal is to get individuals out of the church, as it is the path towards their expected end.
- The speaker suggests that through sitting and learning in the church, individuals can experience a love they have never encountered before.

God's Plan and Process for His People

- Sister Charlotte will have her feelings hurt if someone does something differently than her way.
- It is important not to get trapped in being upset at what others have done.
- Laughing and joy are essential in the process of creating a new future together with God.
- President Trump's speech in South Carolina was praised.
- The speaker believes that if they weren't preaching the kingdom message, none of the trials and challenges would be happening.
- Greater is He that's within you than he that's in the whole world.
- Quitting is not an option for the speaker.
- The speaker wants to discuss the process required to achieve God's expected end for His people.
- Sometimes, a prophet reveals that God has an expected end for someone, but they fail to mention the challenges that need to be overcome.
- Elder Baker came out of her fire unscathed, not even smelling like smoke.
- God's plan to bring His people to their expected end can be found in Ezekiel 22:30.

The Importance of an Earthly Partner in God's Plan

• In Ezekiel 22:3, God seeks for a person to stand in the gap and make a hedge to prevent the destruction of the land.

- God had previously stated that he would not destroy the land, but finding a business partner is necessary to fulfill his plan.
- God cites the example of Jonah, who became his business partner and prevented the destruction of Nineveh.
- The Heavenly groom requires an Earthly bride to accomplish things in the heavens.
- The fulfillment of prophecies, such as a virgin conceiving and the bruising of the head, required participation from willing partners.
- The Kingdom message must be preached to the whole world, and the speaker made a vow to be a broken vessel for God's use.
- Many people do not experience their expected end because they fail to daily seek God's will and understand that salvation is not their only inheritance.

Partnership with God in Ministry

- Salvation is not the ultimate inheritance, but rather the Dominion mandate, which includes ruling and reigning with God.
- The inheritance of Israel is to be obtained by believers.
- Believers are called to fight for their inheritance and not passively assume they received it at the foot of the cross.
- When a person comes to Christ, they become a partner in God's plans on earth.
- Jesus Christ is no longer the light of the world; believers are now His business partners and the light of the world.
- God is seeking partners in ministry who are willing to do whatever is necessary.
- Examples of partnering with God in ministry include preaching, cleaning vans for outreach, and serving others.
- Working for the Lord and serving His people brings joy.
- Every action and effort in ministry is seen and recorded by God.

The Promised Place and Overcoming Giants

- Exodus 23 verse 20 mentions sending an angel to guide and bring the people to a prepared place.
- The expected end, or destination, is Canaan land.
- The place has mountains, and the people are meant to rule and reign there.
- However, the people were not informed about the presence of Giants in Canaan.
- Despite the Giants, God assures the people that He will give them the land.
- Joshua and the Israelites see the Giants as insignificant compared to the promise of God.
- The speaker shares a personal experience of receiving a promise from God in a prison cell.

- God provides everything necessary for victory; all one needs to do is have faith and wield the sword of God.
- The role of being a partner in the ministry is mentioned at the end.

Ministry and Promises

- The speaker discusses the concept of partnership in ministry and restoration.
- The ministry mentioned is said to be filled with challenges, but also with blessings.
- The idea is emphasized that knowing something is already yours eliminates the need to fight for it, but rather practice faith.
- Faith in God's promise is highlighted as the key to success in battles or challenges.
- Examples are given of two individuals going into battle, one with a sword and one with the assurance of victory already promised.
- The importance of holding on to the promise even when faced with obstacles, referred to as "Giants," is emphasized.
- The speaker shares a personal example of their wife holding on to the promise despite difficulties.
- The importance of prayer and having faith in God's promises is discussed.
- The speaker mentions the belief that God will send a messenger (an angel) with a message to guide towards the expected end.

Importance of the Message in Staying on the Narrow Way

- The angel is not the focus, but rather the message that the angel brings.
- The message is meant to guide and keep individuals in the narrow way.
- The purpose of the message is to prevent straying from the right path.
- Even angels can make mistakes, but the word of God is infallible.
- God's calling is to follow the message and reach the expected end.
- Daily reliance on the message keeps individuals on track.
- Beware of focusing on the faults of the messenger rather than the message.
- Personal issues with the messenger should not deter from the importance of the message.

The Authority in the Message

- The speaker recalls a recent incident where they were arguing with their wife on a public platform with a hot microphone.
- They express their frustration with their wife's behavior and stress the importance of immediate action.

- The speaker highlights the significance of the message rather than the messenger.
- They mention carrying a message that can guide and keep others on the right path.
- They emphasize the importance of unity and love within their community.
- The speaker warns against provoking an angel, as even angels can make mistakes.
- They state that Yahweh has placed his name and authority in the angel.
- The speaker explains that honoring the angel is a way of showing respect to God.
- They assert that the message is more important than the messenger and should be listened to even if the messenger falls.
- The speaker concludes by mentioning that not everyone has God's authority, but it is crucial to recognize and respect it when it is present.

Following God's Message and Overcoming Challenges

- Donald Trump is seen as a man of authority, who remains unfazed despite facing opposition.
- God is using Donald Trump for this particular time.
- It is important to obey God's voice and message.
- Following the voice of the shepherd, who is God, leads to success.
- Shane Von, a preacher, allows God to speak through him and is convicted by his own sermons.
- The message preached helps to steer individuals in the right direction.
- By obeying God's message, He promises to be an enemy to our enemies and an adversary to our adversaries.
- God's angel will guide and bring individuals to their destination, even if it means facing enemies.
- The enemies mentioned include the Amorites, Hittites, parasites, and others.
- Following the angel's guidance may require enduring difficult situations before attaining success.

The Pathway to the Promised Land

- Walking through battles is necessary to reach the throne
- There are multiple nations to pass through: the Amorites, Canaanites, Hittites, Hivites, and Jebusites
- God will cut off these nations, but requires the partnership of the people
- Walking through the nations is a test to see who the people align themselves with spiritually

• To reach the Promised Land, one must not be influenced by the gods of these nations

Walking Among Them to Reach Your Expected End

- The speaker emphasizes the importance of being careful when interacting with certain individuals.
- The speaker encourages the audience to walk among these people to see if they can resist their negative influences.
- The speaker advises against becoming too close with these individuals and warns about the potential consequences.
- The speaker suggests that engaging with these people on social media can lead to negative identification.
- The speaker encourages the audience to distance themselves from these individuals and their actions.
- The speaker mentions finding one's expected end and the potential dangers of being part of negative groups or engaging in negative actions.
- The speaker highlights the need to overcome these negative influences and pursue a higher purpose.
- The speaker emphasizes the importance of going through low places before reaching high places.
- The speaker warns against embracing negativity and encourages the audience to focus on love, belief, and positivity.

- The only thing keeping some people praying and in church is their brokenness.
- Depending on God in times of trouble strengthens one's faith.
- If everything was perfect, there would be no need to pray or rely on God.
- Facing enemies and challenges drives people to the altar and strengthens their relationship with God.
- Enemies and challenges prevent demonic powers from taking over one's life.
- God allows horrible things to happen to train and prepare individuals to run to Him in times of trouble.
- Personal experiences, such as being beaten and losing a mother, have taught the speaker to rely on God in all situations.
- Difficult experiences in childhood have cultivated a habit of running to prayer and seeking refuge in God.

The Process of Growing and Overcoming Enemies

- The speaker recalls a time when they couldn't go into their house and had to rely on others for water.
- They remember asking the Lord for water when they were thirsty and being provided for.
- The speaker acknowledges that they keep many people at a distance due to past hurts, but they have a close relationship with God.
- The speaker expresses gratitude for their enemies, as they have taught them who to rely on in difficult times.
- The speaker acknowledges that they may be difficult to get close to, but emphasize that God has never left or failed them.
- The speaker quotes a verse saying that enemies will be driven out gradually, little by little, until the person has grown and inherited the land.
- They explain that every time they face enemies, it is an opportunity to grow spiritually.
- The speaker emphasizes the importance of adding to one's faith and knowledge, mentioning patience and longsuffering.
- They mention that enemies are left as a means of teaching and growth, not for destruction.

- Offense can keep individuals among the hivites and prevent them from entering the promised land.
- The spirit of offense can destroy individuals if they do not learn how to fight it.
- After betrayal, hatred towards one another often follows, without any explanation for the hate.

Offense and Forgiveness

- Offense in the last days is common because forgiveness is rare.
- Offense leads to downfall in ministry.
- Example of being offended by forgetting dinner.
- Trust and forgiveness are important in relationships.
- Failure to learn and apply forgiveness will result in not being present next year.
- Offense is hard to overcome, even for great prophets like John the Baptist.

The Destructive Power of Offense and the Importance of Love and Unity

- Offense is the key factor that allows Satan to enter one's heart, as seen in the betrayal of Judas. Offense often arises from being offended by something, such as actions related to money.
- Casting down offensive thoughts quickly is crucial in preventing the further entrance of negative influences.
- Offenses can lead to a chain reaction, with one offense leading to another, causing a cycle of hurt and division.
- Love for one another creates room for understanding and forgiveness, preventing offense from taking root.
- Offenses can occur when one spends time with those who have negative attitudes and opinions about others, as their negative talk can influence one's own perspective.
- Loving and supportive relationships protect individuals from being criticized or attacked by others.
- Displaying a clear stance and loyalty towards one's pastor or leader can deter others from attacking or speaking negatively about them.
- Lack of clarity about one's stance can make individuals vulnerable to criticism or gossip.

• Personal connections and trust are essential in avoiding and handling offenses effectively.

The Dangers of Offense and the Trap it Creates

- Offenses are used by others to manipulate and gather information.
- The Greek word for "offended" is scandalo, which means to cause distrust and abandonment of trust and obedience.
- The root word of offended is scandalon, meaning a movable stick or trigger of a trap.
- Offenses are traps that are triggered when one gets offended.
- Avoid mingling with those who may cause offense, as offenses are traded like trading cards.
- God will continue to allow one to face offenses until they learn how to conquer them.
- The block button is a good way to start conquering offenses.
- Keep focused on the expected end and avoid becoming idle chatterers.
- The ultimate goal is to reach the high places of the Earth.
