## INTRODUCTION TO THE COMMITTEE

A Crisis Committee is a small body brought together to deal with an issue of immediate importance. Delegates will have to take action upon the problems. Delegates are able to write Crisis Notes (which are explained later in the document) to use their power to impact the committee or work with the committee to write directives. The choice is yours. What makes Crisis different from all the other committees is that everything is driven by the delegates.

Playing a role in this committee will give an accurate insight on how these formal meetings are handled and will improve plenty of your skills, mainly the ones focused on critical thinking, negotiation, oratory, and teamwork.

Due to the chaotic nature of a crisis committee, a delegate must be well prepared by researching on the topic and relevant past policies of your assigned country, as well as assisting in the capacitations that the chair will offer.

*Being on a crisis committee requires a lot of dedication but it also is one of the most enjoyable committees too, we as a chair expect for you to put all of your effort into every session.*

### Crisis Committees and How to Navigate Them

#### Directives

##### 1. Public Directives

- a. Directives that are made from international collaboration (ie. working with other delegates) and will be presented in committee sessions
- b. They concern members of the entire committee (Eg. Founding a new organization, liberating a country, giving aid)
- c. Example: [Public Directive 1](#)

##### 2. Joint Directives

- a. Directives that are made from international collaboration, but only concerns the collaborating nations and therefore will not be announced by the Chairs in committee sessions (Eg. Preparing a collaborative attack, making an international project)
- b. Example: [Joint Directive 1: Canada, India, and Netherlands](#)

Directives majorly influence how the crisis will continue, therefore strongly recommend writing directives early and quickly to prevent the crisis from worsening.

#### Crisis Notes

Another way of influencing the crisis is by writing Crisis Notes. A Crisis Note puts you in the role of the narrator, where you can make up a scenario based on the ongoing crisis. A Crisis Note is basically doing an official action, which has way more value and impact than just saying it in the committee. Keep in mind that you can only make up viable and “realistic” actions taken by your nation, you cannot control another nation, obviously. Although, your actions can affect other countries.

Please follow the Crisis Note format as seen in the example below:

Crisis directors will approve or reject your Crisis Notes based on how well it fits with the current crisis. Therefore, making your crisis notes logical and grounded in reality increases their chances of getting approved.

The effectiveness of your Crisis Notes will be announced in Crisis Updates. Crisis directors will gather all directives and notes, and provide you with the consequences of your actions in Crisis Updates. Moreover, we might also include new emergencies during the Crisis Updates that you should also resolve. Therefore, listen carefully and take notes when an update is announced.

That is all you need to know about navigating a Crisis Committee! If you have any queries during our committee sessions, please feel free to ask us, the Crisis Director and Moderator, before and during the conference. ## TOPIC

It was the year 2023, and a remarkable development was unfolding in the world of science. Over the last few decades, two competing factions had emerged, each with its own unique approach to the revival of historical figures.

The first group, the Revivalist Collective, was known for its controversial agenda of bringing back extinct historical figures. - The Enigma Vanguard
  - This group of people emerged after copying the cloning techniques of the Revivalist Collective, and had mere chaotic intentions. It is speculated that they seek to bring back controversial figures to the actual society.
- Revivalist Technology
  - It is basically new, and it was thanks to the old legend of the frozen head of Walt Disney that the Revivalist collective expressed its interest in developing this new technology, he was the first to be revived because of the facilities of his genetic material in the studios of Disney.
