 - d. Distinction: there is nothing in the CLCPA that mandates CT&I is the only way to fund climate and cap emissions but

- it is the leading program to do so and the only mechanism for sustained funding and we will uphold the program to the standards of the CLCPA

- i. Big win for NYS climate movement! NY Renews fought for Superfund in CJJP for 2 years, and generally led the momentum on climate revenue in general. Folks should feel a sense of ownership over this accomplishment!
- ii. What's next? An implementation fight ahead!
- iii. Climate Superfund implementation regs will be complete in 2028, which is presumably when the revenue would start flowing.

 - a. What is Cap-trade-and-invest?
 - i. A regulatory program that comes out of climate council gives a cap of what industries are allowed to emit.
 - ii. Allowanced are made, which gives hundreds of millions of \$ (potentially billions?!) to invest in our climate solutions. Money would go through the Climate Action Fund, which we fought for in the budget.
 - iii. Key vehicle to fund EJ in NYS

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- b. Big Qs:
 - i. Why does this matter?
 - 1. Right now this is the vehicle to fund climate and EJ in NYS
 - 2. If done right, it could raise billions of dollars annually, which would have to go through the CAF and we would have real leverage to direct this to where it needs to go to the most
 - 3. But there is real pressure to dramatically weaken this
 - a. PCUs PCUs (price ceiling units) to put a cost on the cap, would lose a lot of money for the fund.
 - b. Free allowances
 - ii. Timeline
 - 1. November/December 2024
 - a. DEC releases the draft regulations, which kicks off the official public comment period. There is a minimum of 60 days (more likely 90 or 120 days) but it will most likely be much longer than that

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- 2. Then, we start both the investment fight **and** the official regulatory fight
- 3. This means hearings for CT&I
 - a. May have a hearing in a few cities, likely will give us a long heads up
- 4. Timelines and Scenarios for 2024 and 2025 around Cap, Tr...

- iv. Why are we talking about this before the OC retreat?
 - For the first time since the CAC scoping plan hearings, we are investing significantly as the OC on a regulatory proceeding and so we need to be campaign planning around this as well AND fighting for CT&I is necessary to get funding for all of our other climate goals. Past years budget has been fighting for the same pot of \$\$.
- v. Why should we all care on the legislative side of things?
 - We made the decision to focus NYR on the investment side of things, returning to our roots with the CCIA and filling a critical role in our movement
 - a. Good politics
 - b. Good for basebuilding
 - c. Good for our communities and tangible!
 - 2. But there isn't a good chance to get \$\$, at least not this session, without a *working* CT&I
 - 3. Superfund is adaptation, which is v important but not reducing emissions
- vi. It is up to us to make the connections for our organizations, our members, and the general public
- vii. Questions from OC:
 - 1. Is NY Renews working on details numbers for CT&I like price ceiling amount?
 - a. Yes, ballpark goals, but not calling for a specific #.
 - 2. Two messages need to go out one to our base, one to the general public, about CT&I. OC needs to know more about it, to answer Qs from legislative directors.
 - a. NY Renews will do mass call teach in on it sometime in October.
 - 3. Is messaging around CT&I going to be intricately connected to the legislative programs we want to see? Do we have clarity on the investments that we're focusing on?
 - a. Combining messaging. State is handling investments and regulations on two different tracks though. Have a first draft of the Marquee spending plan draft, now bringing it to Assembly and labor to get buy in before the public.
 - i. Investment Building decarb, clean transport, community-directed grants, workforce dev. NYSERDA will go through <u>our comments</u> and propose something to the Governor.
 - ii. Regulatory in Nov will drop, will write comments on more technical wonky stuff. AM Kelles is

working on implementing legislation and NY Renews is advising her.

- c. What the OC will probably do
 - i. Hearings
 - Education of our members on the connection between CT&I and investments
 - iii. Prep for our folks for the hearings!
- d. Would a more in-depth training be helpful for folks? If so, we could schedule it as a follow up to the OC retreat

 - a. Why are we doing this?
 - i. Field
 - 1. Definition Borrowing from electoral, means getting in contact with large base of voters (canvassing, phonebanking, etc).

 - 3. A need to show real people power in a way that means something to legislators

 - i. 3 Tiers
 - 1. Climate and EJ investments through the Climate Action Fund (a return to our core!)
 - a. Need to zero in on dna of NYR and what we offer
 - b. NYR is founded on passing CLCPA and funding it
 - c. Celeste: CT&I will go through the executive budget, right? At this point it's safe to say we will support community-oriented projects. Comments are due on Investments Framework on Sept 30th. We call this policy "cap trade and invest" because there is a trading component currently defined that we are fighting against. Similar policy frameworks (e.g., California) have even shown increase in pollution over time. There is a working group that will determine comments we will submit, things are moving along more quickly now.
 - 2. JETA– co-run a campaign on this. Very passable and would be really huge for EJ communities across the state
 - a. Converts polluting power plants to renewable energy hubs
 - b. Such an important EJ priority, huge health impacts in front-line communities
 - Not only talking about reducing emissions, but also addressing disproportionate impact on communities of color
 - d. Celeste: how it's being framed now is a joint campaign alongside NYEJA, but moving toward NYR leading the charge more broadly. NYEJA has been focused on Ravenswood plant but considering changing that. Should think more about the broader statewide implications of JETA. Focus on the top polluting plants across the state, and how we can mobilize communities around those plants.
 - e. NYR Instagram has a resource that charts out peaker plants across the state

- NY HEAT– critically important for our decarb efforts and many of our members. Would support the RHN led campaign but not run our own campaign on it
 - a. NYR will not run its own NY HEAT campaign, we will follow the lead of Renewable Heat Now
 - b. RHN is running a solid campaign, more effective to tap in than divide our resources
- ii. Synthesis Doc 2025 Priorities [DO NOT SHARE WIDELY]:
 - Informal Synthesis on NYR 2024-2025 direction
- iii. All of our other work!
 - 1. We will also have a really big focus on CT&I as the draft regulations are scheduled to be released at the end of this year and we will want to turn out for hearings and influence the program as much as possible to both benefit DACs and create as much \$\$ as possible for climate and EJ investments
- iv. What does this mean for us?
 - 1. A big shift to running an investments campaign. A clearer focus while still collaborating with other movements and orgs

b. Questions?

- i. Jorge: What does this look like in terms of policy?
 - 1. Last year we had the People's Climate Budget, which included a list of shovel-ready projects
 - 2. We will mostly keep that list of projects but refine it to be sure they are closely related to goals of the CLCPA
 - 3. Other core component is a marquee program that is applicable to folks statewide, details tbd. Likely to be something building and affordability related, e.g., free heat pumps.
 - 4. Money from CT&I could flow through the Climate Action Fund
 - 5. In summary, this is going to be a budget proposal
- ii. Michi: Will one of the CAF programs involve weather assistance programs?
 - 1. Celeste: yes it is in the conversation now
 - 2. Ryan: pre-weatherization and weatherization has been part of the conversation, included in the GAP fund
- iii. Allen: Where do things stand with getting comment submissions ahead of Sept 30th deadline?
 - 1. Celeste: currently drafting now and should have something by next Tuesday (24th)
 - 2. Zasu: currently circulating a petition looking for 10k signatures
- iv. Zasu: campaign kickoff mass call coming up in October
- c. SC retreat and focus on building organizing power and a stronger and larger base
 - One of the big takeaways from our 2024 SC retreat was an acknowledgement that we don't just need to use the power that we have

- more effectively but that we actually need to build more power and bring more people into the movement and invest in more leaders within our organizations.
- ii. As a result, we want to prioritize tactics in our campaigns that bring in new people and give organizations an opportunity to build more capacity and experience. This means more distributed actions and also less full blown mobilization mode in Albany. Of course, we will still need to bring people to Albany and show our power, but we need to be more discerning and how and when we do so!
 - 1. Need to discuss burnout and fatigue from organizing. How can we build power up
- d. Review our *political* strategy
 - i. Broad support AND targeting pressure
 - 1. Priority districts
 - 2. We've been focused on building broad support in the legislature, gathering co-sponsors etc.
 - 3. Moving toward a more localized approach, building bases in key districts where AMs have been difficult to move
 - ii. Field
 - Field program and campaign strategy/plans within the priority district
 - 2. Distributed field moments for the entire coalition!
 - iii. What we are fighting for and our political strategy for it (please don't share beyond the OC!)
 - We have a real opportunity with the focus on investments to do a big reset with legislative leaderships (especially in the Assembly) and with labor
 - 2. We also have a real opportunity to build up new bases in our communities and new allies in the legislature because of a focus on delivering concrete benefits to a district instead of some of the more controversial legislation
 - 3. We will be fighting for local projects but we need a flashy statewide program to get everyone on board that is also explicitly addressing affordability within the transition
 - 4. That's where our marguee program (name TBD) comes into play
 - 5. We are currently working on the details of a program that we can bring to the Assembly to see if they will champion this
 - We will also be engaging labor very early on since we fought for and won Gold Star labor standards in the Climate Action Fund and so many unions will really benefit from this \$\$
 - 6. Then, if the Assembly is with it, we can bring it to the Senate and be unified going into the budget negotiations with the Governor
- e. Questions

- i. Jorge: What exactly are we hoping to solve with the Marquee Program? Is it something the Assembly could implement or something internal for base building?
 - 1. It will be part of the proposed budget for the state
 - Ryan: reduce emissions and invest in communities that need it
 most, how to electrify homes and install heat pumps, there are
 many gaps in existing policies. Navigating the politics of
 affordability that has been weaponized during this transition.
 - 3. Celeste: criteria for how the state and us internally will filter out types of projects we want to push. We're trying to flesh out how to weigh that. E.g., if a project is community-owned and generates wealth for the community. E.g., if something affects a DAC vs a non-DAC, that should be weighted more heavily. When evaluating projects in the past there have been issues with completeness or estimates for how much will be needed—what can we do to support the needs of those projects even if they're not completely fleshed out and "shovel-ready"?

 - Stephan: The aim for the SC to represent different key constituencies and parts of the broader movements. As part of the coalition's focus on Jemez and the points of unity.
 - 2. Stephan: The two things, there are written policies and a logic behind it. The steering committee makes decisions to build consensus in a way we could not do with 380 groups where there is disagreement and contention. Just want to name that, we can dive into that. It's a work in progress, and happy to dive into the details. The goal has always been to have a structure with internal accountability that aligns with the points of unity.
 - 3. Xaver: How do the committees relate to theSC? The SC sets the strategic direction and then give autonomy to actualize that, in terms of a high enough level, then those are brought back to the SC, we take the theme and the proposal and make a decision. Major strategic things go back to the SC, navigated over the years. Over time, there are groups have felt as a non SC member, not making strategic choices. People want to be a part of that process. There's a reason we have a SC. 300+ groups can't vote, a real dynamic, across our movement for agency in decision making. Staff plays a role in bridging committees. But it also happens on the SC as well.
- 3. Proposal for OC representative on the SC 12:20-12:45pm

- a. Ruth: I propose that member organizations that participate in the OC of NY Renews be allowed to elect one representative to the SC. That representative will work with the staff that coordinate the OC to poll member organizations and provide time for discussions on the issues before the Steering Committee. The OC would put together a process to make this happen.
- b. Ruth: Proposal to NY Renews Steering Committee for a representative from the Organizing Committee (OC) to the Steering Committee (SC)
- c. By Ruth Foster (representing 2 member organizations of NY Renews, the NY Climate Advocacy Project and Community Advocates for a Sustainable Environment (also called Stop NY Fracked Gas Pipeline).
- d. I propose that member organizations that participate in the OC of NY Renews be allowed to elect one representative to the SC. That representative will work with the staff that coordinate the OC to poll member organizations and provide time for discussions on the issues before the Steering Committee. The OC would put together a process to make this happen.
- e. Justification:
- f. Many small grassroots, climate groups are not represented on the Steering Committee of NY Renews. The Steering Committee makes decisions about policy priorities and actions the coalition will take. The 300+ groups that have signed on to support NY Renews are expected to mobilize actions and participate in campaigns that they have no say in.
- g. With such a large coalition it isn't practical to have everyone represented on the SC. If member organizations are welcome to send a representative to the OC then there is a forum for these organizations to express their ideas and concerns. The OC representative will serve as a liaison between the OC and the SC.
- h. This will increase the interest of local organizations participating in the OC if they have a say in what campaigns NY Renews takes on. This will also help NY Renews get buy-in from the grassroots organizations that are asked to mobilize their members for NY Renews campaigns.
- Please note, I have no interest in serving in this position. I do have an interest in opening a line of communication between my small volunteer organizations and the Steering Committee.
- j. Ruth: I feel like a prop. I've had groups say that they didn't want to join because they didn't like the policy proposals. I'm active with three local groups, one of the groups was angry the 10b was dropped. Felt strongly about it and was not mentioned by the SC.
- k. Ruth: We come to the OC with hopes to promote NY Renews actions. We want to let the SC knows that happens. We want to elect one representative and to say the OC thinks this or that and get an opportunity to discuss. A line of communications needs to be opened for those who represent NY Renews.
- I. Rami: I appreciate the thought process. My questions are similar to Stephan's. I understand the reasoning. I am not sure this is the avenue to plug the hole you identify. ON the OC there are 5 or 6 SC members. What is one extra person going to do in the grand scheme of things? Thinking about the structures Stephan and Xaver mentioned, unsure about the power structures. All to say the lack you identify is real, but unsure if this the way we fix it. It's not a matter of representation, but rather communication.

- i. Stephan: Two different issues: Communication and democratic process: A representation and power. SC is in favor of larger EJ groups of basebuilders. Can be frustrating to smaller groups who want a leadership role. No matter what we do, the power dynamics are broader.
- m. Stephan: People have been in the weeds for 10 years now, some of these questions are relatively easy. For me, a bunch of questions: What about the other 12 Committees? Would this only apply to the OC?
- n. How does having one representative from the OC differ from having 5 members of the SC on the OC?
- O. Poll What does this mean? Would the poll be informative? are you envisioning voting on decisions?
- p. Unfair if it's only for the OC and not any other committee.
- q. Genuinely curious, if the concern is folks feel left out, there's already plenty of OC members on the SC. There's a communication problem, sure, that's being identified but what about everyone else who makes the coalition possible? Like fundraising? This would be a huge departure from how we've governed and it has a lot of implications there.
- r. Ruth: I picked the OC because it's a committee open to everyone and people who want to have a say. The policy has a say, but the OC is expected to implement, not develop. No problem with other committees to have a say. The difference between having a specific OC member. Ryan represents LIPC, not the OC as a whole. Huge difference. The OC would figure this out, two or three times a year on the agenda, the policy proposal let us know and share our thinking and that would be brought back.
- s. Celeste: A lot of what I thought has been said. I would add, from what I strongly feel the PC suggesting it's the reverse the decisions are made on the SC and PC decides on that from there from the priority. I agree it's a communication issue. Other people not joining NY Renews because not aligned, has to the do with the SC. It's important we stick to those values in terms of implementation of the CLCPA. Unsure where to go from here, but people do want to feel more heard and how do we do that for smaller orgs?
- t. Stephan: There is no process solution for a democratic process where a 6 person all volunteer group has as much weight as a statewide group with 150,000 members.
- u. Ryan: I would say it is also multi-directional. SC would not be able to make decisions without input/advice/guidance from the individual committees
- v. Ethan: I appreciate the convo, something important to think about. One of the things I brought up is that is there a way we can carve at time to say explicitly that we are brining to the SC? Could help. Doesn't resolve everything, but time set aside wouldn't hurt and could be a better advocate for the OC ideas.
- w. Stephan: A practice of sharing from the OC
 - i. Also want to recognize that there are structural challenges around communications and decision making caused by the coalition tends to plan n 6 month increments with a rushed process each season.
 - Angie: Could the issue be that we don't have enough Albany representation on the SC?- Angie
 - i. Ryan: EANY
 - ii. Ethan: We do have a new Albany organizer now, and we'll have communication channels (re)opened up with his hiring.

- iii. Xaver: The committees are where the work happens. If someone can make the meetings, they can shape the entire coalition.
- b. Monique: Thanks for the convo and talking it out. Wasn't on the call last week and back up just a second, because it's not clear who wanted this conversation, who else is supporting?
 - i. Ruth: I got emails behind the scenes supporting this
 - ii. Stephan: Can I suggest as next steps:
 - iii. This will go on the OC agenda as a standing item. Share out from the SC every call, and ask explicitly what items do you want to share with the SC.
 - iv. Can we ask for volunteers to take this conversation as a starting point for discussion and take some time to articulate whether and how the OC members have concerns, suggestions, and then assess whether there is a proposed solutions.
 - v. Additionally, I think we can take back as staff that there is a need to develop additional pathways for smaller groups to be brought into decision making, and communicate what and how decision making is going on, not wait until all the decisions have been informed to have a webinar.
 - vi. Celeste: This is larger than the OC, thinking of the PC, there's members who have issues with approach and analysis a questions generally how do we address larger questions. Not to make it more complicated, but greater than the OC.
 - vii. Xaver: Definitely true, getting to the core of what has been raised whether or not it means having a rep on the OC, I hesitate to do a stakeholder process but this is a steady way forward and a good way to get the conversation going.
 - viii. Monique: I'm struggling with the comment of the representative on the committee. How would we determine that process? We have so many different committees, many are smaller than the OC. People have thoughts about directions. How would that process be that represents the OC. We have the co chairs of the committees. Is that not significant enough?

- ix. Stephan: Maybe we ask each committee to share back on the process and any concerns or suggestions
- x. Stephan: One take away is that we need to re-engage the co-chairs and make sure that they are clear and that we have clear pathways through them.
 - Great. I think there will be a few meetings coming out of the upcoming SC retreat to talk about structure given both the shifting world, and our changing membership, and direction. we can fold the follow up conversation into that

 - a. Two words about how you feel about how session ended
- 2. Debrief overview:

 - In two weeks (off for Juneteenth), we will do a longer full hour debrief on session overall
 - c. But we want to talk about what happened last week and do some initial reflection on each of the bills now
- 3. Superfund 12:10-12:30 (Aurora)
 - a. What happened?
 - i. We ran an incredible campaign alongside NYPIRG
 - ii. And also, there were a lot of macro factors that played into this surprise victory
 - iii. The final few days were pure chaos
 - iv. First, congestion pricing was delayed (and maybe canceled) by Kathy Hochul and suddenly, the legislator needed to find \$1B dollars for the revenue gap (which they didn't in the end)
 - v. Then the plastics bill, which looked like it was going to pass, ended up not having the votes to pass on the floor (or so they say)
 - vi. At the same time, as the time passed, any deal on NY HEAT was going to require a message of necessity from the Governor, which made finding a deal on NY HEAT even harder
 - JETA suffered the same fate as it would have had to be amended and then repassed and it was clear that there wasn't enough time to make that happen or enough political will in the Assembly with central staff still blocking it
 - vii. While all of this was happening, the Speaker was feeling immense pressure to get something done on climate and EJ.
 - viii. The speaker and his staff surveyed the Assembly on Superfund and it definitely had enough support to pass
 - ix. With a massive push from NYPIRG, local government officials, tons of different members of NYR, youth advocates, and more, it ended up coming up for a vote at about 4am and it passed!!!
 - x. If Anne is on, please swing it to her to tell more!
 - b. Next steps from here
 - i. Now the bill heads to the Governor's desk
 - ii. So, we need a full fledged campaign to get the Governor to sign it
 - The fossil fuel industry and their cronies were taken by surprise but all of the lobbying that went against NY HEAT and against the Plastics bill is going to be directed at this. We're up against a lot but we can get the Governor to sign this with a strong campaign and public pressure

- iii. If the governor signs it, the fossil fuel industry will undoubtedly sue.

 However, we have a very strong AG office and Tish James has proven to be a strong AG on this in the past so we can count that they will do a great job defending against these attacks
- iv. While all of this is happening, we also need to spread the word to other states and open up this new front of attack on the fossil fuel industry!!

c. Winning the win

i. We also need to "win the win". This means that we need to make sure that everyone knows about this massive victory and is fired up about it. This is a great way to bring new people into your organization and also build more public support for the Climate Superfund bill AND for making polluters pay in general

d. Questions? Thoughts?

- i. Michi: Follow up: people want to invest more in local communities and connect that cap and trade. Are there thoughts on that already?
- ii. Ryan: So climate change superfund is not going to the CAF. Would let it be less legally defensible for some reason, not in the CAF, but Cap and iNvest money will go into the CAF. They are separate but related. NYR is unsure of the role of getting money on the ground for superfund versus CAF. Climate Superfund is an adaptation based program, sewer renovations, road and bridges, battery storage, solar, and wind, large-scale infrastructure. The superfund will abide by the 35% DAC. Mitigation type things but will be a separate funding stream, and an important one. Separate but different ad tie ins to be mindful of
- iii. Mark: In the discussions of Cap and Invest, superfund only pays defensive measures against the effects of destructive weather. We need a much larger investment in cleaner energy, and the debates around cap and investment involve big proposed loopholes and for big polluters and trade exposure. There's infighting on the contents of the program as well as the level of the ceiling on on the costs for the allotments that would be auctioned to pay for the investments we need, a lot of fighting on the polluter pays principle
- iv. Ethan: What are local groups doing?
 - Majadi: We had a membership meeting in the last couple of weeks. I've addressed the superfund act, have spoken of it in terms of reparations, can be a hot button, but everyone has gotten some form of it, this is a scratch. It could take some time to implement it. Reparations in terms of a frame of understanding
 - a. Nan: I like that! The federal government has done the superfund, not something in of itself is brand new. The other part of it that is really important, Blaire and Ann have talked about it, the way that law is set up, going after the largest emitters, not every emitter is a part of the payback. One of the things that get raised is that the cost will be

raised to us – we don't think the costs will be passed to consumers. For some people, they'll raise it will cost us more but the reality is that because of competition it won't be and not pass to consumers.

- e. Moment to let it sink in!
 - i. We passed one of the bills of the Climate, Jobs, and Justice Package
 - ii. This is the bill that MOST directly attacks the fossil fuel industry AND the bill that MOST sets a national precedent!
 - iii. Let's all take 30 seconds to see each other, cheer, celebrate, and be happy together!!!
- 4. What happened to the other bills (Kathryn) 12:30-12:50
 - a. NY HEAT
 - i. Of all of the toughest pills to swallow, not getting NY HEAT in any more this year is the toughest. It looked like we were SO CLOSE in the budget and then again at the end of session
 - ii. So what happened?
 - Nan: Superfund was easier then NY HEAT was the labor movement was against NY HEAT. Labor was never really against superfund. Might be a lot easier to push superfund without our legislators seeing where labor is. Labor wasn't against it so easier than NY HEAT:
 - 2. Kathryn: So much opposition for NY HEAT
 - 3. Ryan: Conspiratorial thinking,a small part thinks superfund was easier to pass because even passing it, if Hochul doesn't sign it, it's on Hochul not assembly. Path of least resistance to not look bad while not carrying water for it.
 - 4. Majadi: Trying to gauge western NY Assembly Persons. First time to talk to someone in an office, repeatedly. We've exhausted ourselves with our tiny capacity. Gauging how much influence western NY Assemblypersons has on NY HEAT, because we're about to work with People and Planet Cohort to build out a utility justice dynamic for august. We're also going to engage assembly members for passing NY HEAT. Any names or ideas would be helpful to make them bleed further.
 - 5. Ethan: I can't speak super confidently on how much Western NY members speak that. But CANY is taking a look going forward with this as well, and it's going to be a really important conversation to make the assembly members feel it. A similar thing in Syracuse in Albany in how our electeds had a real opportunity to protect their constituents and didn't. It's bribery! These giant corporations pump money into these campaigns and get what they want. ANd get some media attention too. excited to see what you do.
 - 6. Ryan: More of a suggestion to Majadi, Jessica Azulay, AGREE, and Lisa Marshall at New Yorkers For Clean Power, have a better

understanding. There was a western NY Constituency along with Zebrowski, National Fuel lobbying which trickled downstate, they gave some money to the boroughs on NY, getting a deeper to get the bones and scarps.

- iii. Well we're doing some analysis and trying to wrap our head around it but it seems like the same pattern that happened all session was never able to be broken. Despite a lot of pressure on the Assembly, the Speaker, and a few vulnerable members of the legislature, the Assembly never came to the table with an offer that was worth taking. They weren't willing to move on the obligation to serve and we ran out of time for them to negotiate
- iv. It's completely normal to feel a lot of anger and frustration with the assembly and also with the rest of the legislature and the Governor for not passing NY HEAT
- v. Questions? Thoughts?
- vi. What happens next:
 - We need to make the Assembly feel the political cost of not acting on this
 - That means birddogging, it means blaming our Assemblymembers on rate hikes, it means keeping up the pressure throughout what will be a terrible summer of climate disasters, and it means shoring up support before the budget next year, which will be the best chance to pass the bill.

POC (anonymous on purpose):

Parameters of racial action, we have a large group, we have to organize better around the ethnic and racial dynamic, and address racial capitalism. Actually using the terms – not "POC" "Marginalized" — say "Black, Brown, Indigenous" communities, we need to be authentic about who is being affected. Unclear about the whole coalition – some stuff is deeply geographical. Western New York, it's like talking to a brick wall. No one wants to talk to a brick wall. I don't know what it is. Anger doesn't move anything.

Sometimes this feels like it's around homeownership, more than anything

Conversations in (group), there's an educational gap, people don't understand legislation and can be tough to connect and can be tough in general for our base. Climate Justice Legislation is hard to explain because it's hard to touch. Stuff like housing is easier to explain. Climate change doesn't feel real for a lot of folks. Education is important. There's pushback. The education thing is for some legislators. Heastie knows exactly what's going on, he is educated. He's not being honest about why he's against it. These people are being paid to "not get it" and not engage with it. They're being paid and they need to leave. A lot of non profits can't directly engage with endorsing. More pointing the finger and getting these people out. Again, no one wants to talk to be talking to a wall.

Jemez Principles

To piggyback on all of that, what we're doing with the legislation it's not something that's sexy enough to motivate people to get involved. It's divorced from people's reality. It's hard to champion people in DACs, they're dealing with a lot of other stuff. People need to feel, taste, and touch this stuff. The PCJB was about this — but even with this, we need to put this stuff into people's homes so people will feel it's worth it. I live in a DAC, and I have no idea how it works for me. We can't promise it's going to work if there's no example it works. You have to go to wealthy white communities to see these things, and DACs get tons of propaganda all the time. It's the status quo to have gas and oil

What I will say is this: I think POC are being tokenized for a victim mentality, like look at all these POCs that are dying, while using tactics of a white audience. We're going to meetings, lobbying and are obsessed with being nice. That's how the coalition seems to operate from how I've been there. This dynamic is exploitative. Everyone is happy when there's a bunch a POCs in the audience, but the way it's actually led is telling people what they want to hear rather than pushing them. Just an observation, not a complaint, just a perspective. Not a better way. NY renews is happy with tons of diversity, not white people who care about trees. The way we move What does Kevin Parker want to hear and how do we get specific? To me, why do we give these dipshits a platform? We should be trying to unseat him? We're having conversations about dissolving the C4 element. We're not structured in a way where we can do this kind of work. Why not power play — how to get the speaker, and a sustainable solution instead of relying on good graces.

On point — we can't negotiate with Satan, we can't impress them and beg them for things. The fossil fuel industry was trying to kill my kids, we would have an issue. Not a huge revolution, but the way we do nonviolence can be there too. Researching radical tradition.

I want to point out, again, working on insider game and legislation, politics, trying to be good and nice. There's a whole dynamic we refuse to name. People want holistic change, and if we don't bring that, we're not speaking to the moment, and it's hard to get behind something like that. We're missing the soul of the movement. Until we do that, we're just checking boxes. Even with media, we're tagging legislators who don't like that as if we're beholden to them. Not speaking to the soul of what people feel in our lives. Not transformational. The palestinian camps on colleges – that's soul, that's feeling. Our legislation is not speaking to that. If we get that. We are not threatening.

I can't afford electrified everything – you can sound crazy when no one working class has these resources

Systemic problems require systemic solutions. A lot of this lobbying inside work is important and vital work but it's just one aspect of the war, just one battlefield.

You can't take a flight from boston to new york, there's a pattern of consumption It sometimes feels like POC are entertainment rather than movement builders, until that dynamic is changed and addressed, things will stall

White affinity group breakout:

Allen Blair: Biggest issue for me was misinformation upstate. There's a media team on this, but not sure what they're doing. That's biggest obstacle to getting HEAT act passed.

Buffalo & Rochester areas, national fuel has been hammering reliability & cost messaging. And "taking away people's choice." And legislators we lobby say they're being hammered by these messages.

Nan Faessler: When they call legislators, are they real people or robo-calls? We could call and say "are you going to fall for this? Our side always has real people calling.

Allen: They're robo-calling rate-payers, and having rate-payers call personally.

Xaver: There's probably AI calls coming soon.

John Keevert: Areas of western NY where we don't have supporters/constituents available.

Xaver: that outreach needs to be a focus this summer.

Michi: Mass mobilizations were good, strong. We didn't necessarily expand movement, but mobilized the people that are there. Targeting legislators could be stronger, rather than blanketing. Transitioning to more of an organizing model, could be thought about.

Nan: Has the overall OC been asked how to reach out to coalition organization members. Probably some member groups don't participate. Can we OC members reach out to them?

Xaver: ++ what Nan and Michi said. This summer and next fall will be reorientation as movement and organization. Recognition that political landscape has changed since 2019. Not having as many big wins. Now, need to shift playbook to bring in new constituencies.

Ryan Madden: A curiosity: Are we doing things we really need to do, even if there's no clear target, like budget letters. Housing got 2000 people to Albany, but got screwed on "good cause". Are we doing things just because we've historically done them? Are they really good uses of our time?

Laura Tumarkin: ++ What tactics aren't a good use of our time? A curiosity: understanding the speaker better. Do we have anyone in his orbit who could help us understand him better, or lobby him. What are angle we could use, that we haven't used?

Ruth Foster: Things went well this session. We organized well. People knew what to do, etc. Question is, how do we work better with movement as a whole? Different groups doing phone-ins on different things at same time, etc. Not well synced. Would like to see it synced better. Also, we never had role in determining policy agenda; we should have a say in choosing issues. I'd propose a representative of the OC on the Steering Committee.

Xaver: Interesting idea! Could raise it. I do use my voice & influence to bring voice of OC into the Steering Committee space. As for coordination with other campaigns: Sometimes other groups didn't agree to combine with us. We'll always have some degree of lack of coordination. But we can definitely improve upon it.

John: Thinking back to anti-fracking campaign, birddogging Cuomo at fundraising events was effective. He was annoyed. He got rid of fracking to get rid of us! We have causes we could harass Hochul about.

Ruth: Agree with bird-dogging, perhaps with Heastie? Xaver has done excellent job with communication with Steering Committee. Just wondering if there could be open discussion...

Ethan Gromley: how cosy marginals often are with utilities, FF, etc. Perhaps exposing this at grass-roots level?

Xaver: yes, could be a whole field operation in marginal districts: "so and so takes money from...." etc.

Ruth: I've been at legislature a lot this session. Fridays for Future were effective: youth were there talking to legislators! What if we could do that everyday!

Xaver: seems speaker doesn't care as much about public support for items, as he used to. Hearing from legislators that this year (and somewhat last year), they don't understand what's going on, and have less access to what decisions are being made; they feel more in the dark. Speaker doesn't seem to care as much about what his own members think. No one's sure why's he's making the decisions he's making. Ex: NY HEAT, there's so much Assembly support! So, there's a lot for us to figure out.

So, having a Heastie strategy is going to be really important. It may involve labor. June 12: be there!!!

End with appreciation for all of us and our hard work! We didn't get all we wanted, but we killed it!!!

On the eve of what is predicted to be a summer of <u>record-breaking heat</u> and the <u>most active hurricane season in US history</u> – leading up to a presidential election – we wanted to share one of the critical ways <u>Organizing Resilience</u> is getting ready to support immediate humanitarian response **and** long-term power-building work in the wake of climate disasters.

Over the last couple of years, we've been developing OR's "On Call Network" (OCN) – a bench of support we deploy to flank on-the-ground leaders in their immediate response and power-building work during a climate disaster. We have experts in fundraising, communications, navigating federal disaster response, organizing, policy and more, on deck. To date, the OCN has activated nearly a dozen times around the country, stewarding over \$10 million to the ground for response, recovery, and long-term organizing.

Today, we would like to invite you to nominate strong candidates to join our bench of Activation Managers, a critical force of organizers and campaigners who work in lock step with leaders in the impacted area and help to channel the expertise of the On Call Network. It is their job to make sure support is flowing in highly impactful and accountable ways. Last year, it was game-changing to have this team in place as we raised and deployed over \$1.4 million in response to the Maui fires alone. The organizers we worked with during the Lahaina Fires have provided hundreds of families with immediate assistance to secure housing, food, and services, and continue to organize to shape the direction of federal recovery funds, campaign against land grabs and displacement, and advance a just recovery agenda.

As we approach the 2024 hurricane season, we are deepening our bench of Activation Managers, starting with a 2-day, in-person training in Houston on May 16th and 17th. Attendees will learn about Organizing Resilience's approach to supporting immediate crisis response *and* long-term structural change work and how we mobilize during climate disasters. Activation Managers will be tee'd up to respond to crises with the start of storm season on June 1.

As critical partners of OR, we wanted to let you know about this training and ask you to nominate folks to join our bench of Activation Managers. The ideal Activation Manager is movement-aligned, incredibly responsive, organized and calm under pressure, and has the skills to interface with local leaders with empathy and solidarity during intense moments of crisis. If called on to activate during a crisis, Activation Managers will be expected to work, close to full-time, for approximately 4 weeks following a disaster. This will be a remote role to provide daily support and regular communication with the designated leader(s) on the ground in the impacted location, and to successfully deploy the expertise and resources of the OCN. In some cases, we require Activation Managers to stay on longer. Activation Managers will be compensated for their time and can be located anywhere in the United States.

It's really hard to get new programs especially because of just doing it next year. As Ryan said, so much of our work this summer of fall is going to be fleshing out this PCJB and doing advocacy around it and staking out and how this money needs to go to climate and EJ communities
- 4. Taylor: If the assembly continues to stick to their guns and include policy changes, what other avenues can we take for session. If it comes down to the wire post one house budgets, and the maybe month and half after, it seems like they will continue to disappoint and see if there's a way we can divide and conquer about this
- 5. Xaver: if the budget also wraps up on time, we have a better shot of getting things passed outside of the budget. If it goes into May, they'll claim they don't have enough floor time for this. We could also move some in an Earth day package
- Nan: Senate included Climate Change Superfund, but what is going on with the Assembly. Climate Change superfund is also a fund raiser. I want to hear from carl Heastie or the Assembly, and they should be shamed for prioritizing companies over the taxpayers.
- 7. Marylin: I also keep thinking what more we have to do. If we still don't have enough of a movement it's hard to imagine that we don't have a crisis. ON some level, I think it takes an even more robust movement to ensure things happen. We've all been trying our hardest and I think we need to push even harder to ensure that happens.
- 8. Majadi: I agree with the mass mobilization; there's an intersection between mass mobilization and the way that we engage these legislators, and governor Hochul and people in buffalo and the state. Something in me says the engagement process to me, it is important how we're doing it, there has been another factor. Climate Justice spaces have not engaged in all the ways they can engage. The situation in poor communities and bipoc communities is dire, people are dying. We are dying and we are not behaving in

a way that speaks to people dying. The legislation is a dynamic that can work. How do we engage in new ways? I am beyond enraged, I wake up angry, we are dying and yes, I think we're being too polite, too kind, holding space, taking space. We need more fire, passion and love. We need to do things that looks like Standing rock, things that have actually pushed the government to stop killing us. They're not going to do it in a way and we have to make them. [we must] "do things rooted in fire and love and compassion"
