A program of sacred and classical selections, folk songs and show tunes will be presented at the annual spring concert of the Nampa Musettes, to be held at 8 p.m. Thursday, May 2, in the Northwest Nazarene College Science Lecture Hall.

Among presentations are "Climbin' Up the Mountain," a spiritual arranged by Noble Cain; "Psalm 150" by Louis Lewandowski and arranged by Harry Robert Wilson; "Christopher Robin Is Saying His Prayer" by A. A. Milne and H. Fraser-Simson; "The Night Has a Thousand Eyes" by Bourdillon and Hegeman; "Three Songs from Sweden" arranged by Henry Hallstrom; "It's a Big, Wide Wonderful World" by Rox; and a medley from "The Music Man" by Meredith Willson.

In addition to the group selections, various ensembles within the Musettes will present numbers. The Lyrics, a quintet composed of Mrs. Donald Carroll, Mrs. Cliff Rippon, Mrs. Ronald Wallace, Mrs. Philip Earnest and Mrs. Marvin Hamilton, will sing "Oklahoma" by Rodgers and Hammerstein. The Musettes, a member of the National Federation of Music

Clubs, was organized in 1960 under the direction of Mrs. Robert Carlsson and the sponsorship of the Nampa Monday Musicales. Mrs. Goering assumed the directorship in 1964 and Mrs. Donald Tiegs has been accompanist since the group's formation.

The group is composed of 26 Nampa women who present concerts annually and sing for service organizations and nursing homes. The Musettes presented the entire spring concert at the Idaho State School and Hospital April 5 and appeared on a Boise television program Friday.
