Process Paper

1. How did you choose your topic and how does it relate to the annual theme?

We were considering disasters that altered Chicago, and we eventually narrowed the topic down to influential events that left an impact on Chicago, and decided on the reversal of the Chicago River. The Chicago River caused debate such as the Missouri v. Illinois Supreme Court Case, which demonstrated St. Louis' concerns about the undiplomatic effects it had on other communities.
