Name	Description
Seema Moondra, Enjoy/Explore/India Move to the Music, Bollywood Style	Though there were unexpected risks, the overall program was successful with 56 adults and children of diverse backgrounds participating in the interactive program. Patrons celebrated and learned about the culture of India with a Bollywood style workshop. Patrons dressed-up in costumes, learned about the dance and made a New Jersey bookmark craft.
International Cooking Class for Children Ages 6-12	Shoprite of Nutley, New Jersey conducted an International Cooking Classes for 14 elementary aged children 6-12 years old. Children made from scratch Mexican Eagle Pizzas. Many children have never tried some of the ingredients native to Mexican cuisine and were pleasantly surprised. When class was offered, registration was full within one day with many on wait list. This program was sponsored by the Friends of the Nutley Public Library.
Mexican/Hispanic Movie Night	The Nutley Public Library hosted a Mexican/Hispanic Movie Night in which adults and children viewed "The Book of Life" and enjoyed eating tortilla chips, salsa and Tres Leche cake. Children also made bottle cap castanets.
Italian Movie Night	The Nutley Public Library hosted an Italian Movie Night in which adults and children viewed "Pinocchio" and enjoyed eating Brushetta and Pizelles. Children decorated and created pasta necklaces and bracelets.
Touch the Music Story Time	Claudia Baumgaertner Lemmerz of Touch the Music explored with children, ages 2-5 years-old, where music comes from and how it affects our lives throughout the world. Children were

	introduced to musical drums played around the world and played the drums along with the stories told.

Even though there was communication prior, a few days prior to the event, the performer was concerned about painting since she did not know how many children would be present. Performer arrived alone to event.</p>	<p>Nutley Public Library ensured the schedule was kept on time.</p>	<p>Nutley Public Library requested assistance from a staff member from another department for two hours. Nutley Public Library requested two additional teen volunteers to assist.</p>


