Grades	<p>Grades will be based on the SHS policy:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 70% assessments- Exams and select quizzes 30% daily work -homework, homework quizzes, etc. <p><i>If a student is caught cheating on ANY exam or daily work assignment, they will receive a 0% and will NOT be allowed to retake or makeup the work.</i></p>
Exam Retakes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You may NOT retake, or correct the last exam of the semester or the final. You can correct the problems you missed for ½ credit Corrections MUST be done within two weeks as the initial exam.
Daily Work	<p>Assignments that fall under the “daily work category are problem sets from each section</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Daily assignments will be recorded every Friday in Infinite Campus. Once the assignment is closed, it won’t be available to make up. In case of an extended absence, or other extenuating circumstances, visit with me and we can make arrangements. <p>Retakes and corrections will NOT be available for work in the daily category</p>
Classroom Rules	<p>Electronic Devices: PED will be put in the “caddy” everyday when the bell rings. Refusal will result in an office referral. We will follow district policy for Chromebooks.</p> <p>Food and Drink: ONLY water allowed, in a CLEAR container, with a sealable top.</p> <p>Leaving the room: Fill out the hallway pass every time you need to leave the room.</p> <p>Discipline: We will follow the disciplinary guidelines outlined in the SHS handbook.</p>
