I'd like to find work experience for live sound. I already get involved in this subject for college but it has been on a small scale. I shadowed a sound engineer at our Latest Bar gig last year. It was a valuable experience as the engineer was telling me what he was doing, why he was doing it and showed me the digital mixer that they used which I've never seen before. Work experience will also help me apply my knowledge from this course but allow me to learn tips, tricks and gain a better understanding of the job of a sound engineer.

Brighton Dome

They are a multi-arts venue that presents and hosts events such as dance, music, theater, visual arts and more. Brighton Dome also offer workshops from theatrical make-up to morning singing. I performed there years ago for Dance At The Dome. I remember that all the staff were nice and supportive and that they recorded the performances, managed the songs we danced to and gave us our queues to go on stage.

Pros:

- ★ Good working environment performed there before.
- ★ Live sound for performances.
- ★ Would be different to do sound for theater, it may involve gueued/timed sounds.

Cons:

- More known for hosting theater, dance and comedy performances.
- Big stages

Evaluation of choices:

My lecturer is close friends with someone in C3 productions, he is the one who suggested the company. My lecturer speaks highly of C3 productions and from research they look like a reputable company with impressive case studies. This would be a great place to get work experience as they have a warehouse and sound technicians. This could improve my music equipment, venue set up and live sound knowledge.

If C3 doesn't work out then I would try reaching out to Concord 2, Latest Bar and Brighton Dome. However, I'd prefer to reach out to Concord 2 and Latest Bar as they do more gigs than Brighton Dome.

Application Process

As I want to do work experience I know that I am going to have to write a Music CV and Cover Letter and/or personal statement to send to C3. I did this process when I did work experience for secondary school.

Music CV process/evaluation:

I already have a work CV for applying to jobs. I knew this wouldn't be enough to apply to C3 as it doesn't involve anything about music, bar my year 1 grade. So I decided to copy my work CV onto a different google docs document. I only kept my information, grades and mini personal statement.

To improve my CV I needed to make it music based. So I added my college work experience gigs to show that I have experience working at small venues/gigs. I shared that at the Latest Bar I shadowed the sound engineer and that I set up and managed the Whitehawk gig. I thought this information was relevant to add as it shows that I'm hands on at a gig and that I understand the workings of a small gig.

I also included a list of my musical skills. To show the equipment I understand and what I'm capable of doing. It may give them an indication of things I could learn and what they could get me to do.

Lastly, I added my interests and a link to my FMP EP. To show them that I'm passionate about music and produce my own songs.

Cover Letter process/evaluation:

Originally, I started creating a personal statement to send to C3. However, I thought this would be too long and that the reader would lose interest as I drone on about myself. A

cover letter is more straight to the point about why I would like to apply with a brief explanation about myself.

For the first paragraph I explained why I would like to do work experience with C3. I included some facts about the company that I researched when deciding where to apply. This would show them that I know about them, that I'm impressed with the company and shows that I'm eager to work with them.

The next few paragraphs I talked about my music qualifications, my music experience prior to college and my gig experiences. These paragraphs explain my knowledge, skills and my passion for music. I tried to keep my skills and knowledge straight to the point as they don't want to hear my whole life story. Within the paragraphs I added little nuggets of details. For example how I collaborated with others to show that I'm a team player and that I can work with others to seem a bit more impressive.

Another key thing I included was that I am a college student looking for work experience and my availability times. This is so they know when I'm available but also know that I have college on the side.

To finish the cover letter I ended it formally and politely. I wrote this cover letter as formally and professionally as I could. This is because businesses would avoid informal emails as it shows you are unorganised and sloppy.

Cover Letter

I would like to apply for work experience at C3 Productions as the company offers a wide range of services. Currently, I understand that C3 Productions offers equipment hire, technical service, venue support and production management. As such, C3 have organised The Great Escape & Lovebox, which are impressive case studies. C3 was suggested to me by my lecturer Johnny Giles who spoke very highly of the company. I think it would be valuable to do work experience here as it would improve my equipment and venue set up knowledge.

At the moment I am currently studying the Extended Diploma in Music Performance and Production at the Greater Brighton Metropolitan College. In my first year is achieved a Distinction. From doing the first year at BMET I now have a basic understanding of a studio mixing desk. I can set up a microphone, guitar and headphone foldback in a studio. Also, I understand basic mixing techniques such as EQ, compression and vocal mixing. Theses skills helped me produce my EP for our final major project and also help collaborate with others.

Previous to BMET I had keyboard lessons in primary school learning the basics, picked up a guitar in secondary school and have been self teaching myself since. At my first college I started recording, making tracks and experimenting on Ableton Live 9 as a hobby. This inspired me to go to college and study music performance and production.

For my first year at BMET I collaborated with college friends to help them record their EP. I would set up a studio and record their vocals or guitar, sometimes playing guitar for them. I did this alongside producing my own soft rock EP and two covers, to which I collaborated with two vocalist within our class. I really enjoyed doing this as I experimented with different recording techniques and effects that I'd never used before.

Another thing I thoroughly enjoyed was setting up college gigs and managing the live sound. We've have gigs at the Latest Bar, Whitehawk F.C and put on a small performance at the BMET central campus for an art college event. For most of these performances I helped set up and managed the small mixer. However, for the Latest Bar I shadowed the sound engineer which was a fun and an educational experience.

Recently, I've been working with our college technician Sam and we've built a Wah pedal. I soldered and Sam would explain what we were doing as we followed a schematic.

As I am a college student my current availability is Wednesdays, Fridays and the Weekends. I look forward to hearing from you and possibly doing work experience at C3 Productions.




(Cover Letter)
