CIVICS

Foundational Level: F1.CIVICS

- Recognize reasons for saving money

GEOGRAPHY

- Foundational Knowledge:
 - Label the picture with the following terms: left, right, top, bottom.
 - o Define location and place.

C3 Social Studies Standard: D2.Geo.4.K-2

Learners can explain how weather, climate, and other environmental characteristics affect people's lives in a place or region.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Differentiate between weather and climate
- Explain temperature, precipitation, and different ways to describe the weather
- Foundational Knowledge:
 - Differentiate between the four seasons
 - Explain what makes each season different
 - o Identify environmental characteristics within each community

C3 Social Studies Standard: D2.Geo.1.K-2

Learners can construct maps, graphs, and other representations of familiar places.

- Differentiate between state, city and home on a map
- Recognize and use a map legend/key
- Recognize the four cardinal directions
- Foundational Knowledge:

HISTORY

- Foundational Knowledge:
 - o Demonstrate understanding of daily time sequence

C3 Social Studies Standard: D2.His.2.K-2

Learners can compare life in the past to life today.

- Compare and contrast life today and in the past based on certain criteria (example clothes, vehicles, etc...)
- Foundational Knowledge:
 - Describe what history is as "stories" of the past
 - o Explain why knowing what happened in the past can be important for making decisions about the present and future
