#### **December 2024 Lecturer's Reflection**

#### Brother Knights,

As we Journey through this Advent season moving towards Christmas, let us reflect on the birth of our Lord God himself entering this world to save us from our own transgressions and iniquities. As we know, Christ came into this world impoverished born in a manger among livestock. As the Christmas season unfolds, we must not loose sight of this. Sadly, the secular view of Christmas is one of profit and consumerism. Come December 26<sup>th</sup>, major retailers would have liquidated their stock of decorations, trappings, and Christmas themed accoutrements eyeing the next big money maker and the secular world will move on.

This idea of throwing out Christmas as something to be discarded like a worn-out pair of shoes is an unfortunate byproduct of our highly secularized society. As Catholics, we know that Christmas, the celebration of the coming of our Lord to save us does not end with the conclusion of Christmas Day. In fact, the United States Conference of Catholics Bishops says that Christmas ends with the celebration of The Baptism of Our Lord. In fact, prior to The Second Vatican Council, Christmastide was celebrated for forty days (paralleling the forty days of lent) concluding on February 2<sup>nd</sup>. Whichever you choose Christmas does not end after December 25<sup>th</sup>.

As Catholics, we are called to be examples to the rest of the world. This may look different for each of us. For example, this may include saying Merry Christmas till The Celebration of the Baptism of Our Lord, not immediately removing our decorations, continuing our generosity towards those less fortunate, and aiding organizations whose values are in harmony with the Catholic Church. The latter two is something we partake in all year long however giving tied to the reverence of the coming of Our Lord and Savior can make for a particularly powerful and moving gesture this time of year.

Our example as Catholic Gentlemen and Knights to celebrate the Christmas season in its entirety will not be in vain and will serve as an impactful example to those around us in our community and even beyond. By prayerfully requesting Our Lady's intercession in this matter we can spiritually combat materialism and the secular authorities who only worship money and worldly power.

Brother Knights, I wish all of you and yours a joyous Christmas season. May all of us spend time walking with the Lord through prayer this Christmas season contemplating his coming to dwell among us.

#### **Insurance Agents Report**

Happy New Year! The Knights of Columbus has very exciting news to share as we jump into 2025.

Beginning January 1, 2025, a dividend increase took effect for eligible participating insurance policies. This is in addition to the increased fraternal benefits announced last year. Inspired by our founder Blessed Michael McGivney, we continue to seek opportunities to help provide our members with financial security.

What does an increased dividend rate mean?

Dividends are amounts that may be paid annually from the surplus funds of the Knights of Columbus and are paid on an equitable basis by class as determined by the Board of Directors. 1

These dividends can be used in various ways, including to:

- Purchase paid up additions, which is the default option.
- Place the dividends on deposit and earn additional interest.
- Receive the dividends in cash.
- Reduce billed premium. 1
- Reduce an existing loan.

Over the past 30 years, Knights of Columbus has paid more than \$22 billion in dividends and insurance benefits.

I would love to sit down with you in the coming year to discuss how this dividend increase may help you achieve your financial security goals.
