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(Book Antiqua, 12 pt Bold, without a degree)

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Article History Received xxx, 2021 Revised xxx, 2021 Accepted xxx, 2021 (filled in by the editor if the manuscript is accepted)	Abstract (Book Antiqua, 11 pt, spacing 1): The abstract must provide a clear picture of the content of the article. The abstract should contain the research objectives, methods used, important findings or research results, and conclusions. The author is also advised to add a little review of the research problem at the beginning of the abstract as an introduction. Abstracts are written in upright letters with a length of 150-250 words. If the abstract exceeds 250 words, then the editor will ask the writer to correct it. Under certain conditions, editors have the right to correct abstracts to conform to journal guidelines or standards. The font type used is Book Antiqua 11 pt, space 1. Abstracts are written in English. If it is in Indonesian, then words or terms derived from English or other foreign languages are written in <i>italics</i> . The abstract is written in concise and clear language, does not contain bibliography references, and completely describes the essence of the content of the article as a whole.

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INTRODUCTION (Book Antiqua, 12 pt, Bold)

(Book Antiqua, 12 pt, multiple space 1). The introductory section should

contain the *background*, *gap analysis*, and research objectives. Background can come from actual problems that occur in society/institutions or phenomena that occur from observations in the field. This problem has never been explored (not in depth) by researchers before, creating a gap that requires solution-oriented action through research-based research. The introduction must also write a review of the previous literature (*state of the art*) as the basis for the statement of scientific novelty of the research article written. At the end of the introduction, it must be written that the purpose of carrying out the research-based research is associated with the background and literature review that has been previously described. Write citation sources (references) in this journal article using in-text citations.

METHOD (Book Antiqua, 12 pt, Bold)

(Book Antiqua, 12 pt, multiple space 1). This section describes the methods used to solve (reduce) problems and also the methods to analyze how effective or successful the program is. The steps of the method used can also be explained in the form of a chart or flowchart. The method used should use a strong theoretical foundation so that the scientific aspect can be accounted for. The methods used are, for example: qualitative, quantitative, R&D, Evaluation, Action, or other methods/approaches. This method section also explains the subject of the research, how to obtain the data, the types of data that have been obtained, and how to analyze it. The author can also use charts to explain the flow of the research method carried out.

RESULT (Book Antiqua, 12 pt, Bold)

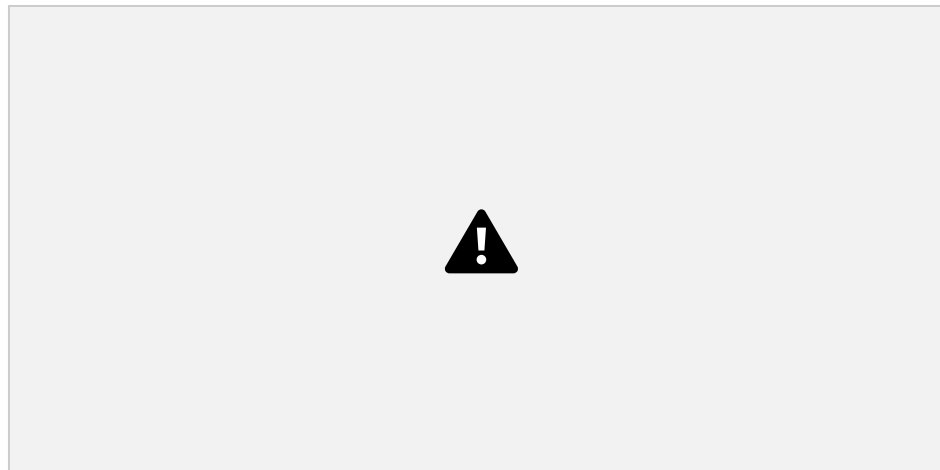
(Book Antiqua, 12 pt for text and 11 pt for tables, charts, multiple space graphs 1). The results and discussion contain the findings of the implementation of the research and its discussion. Write down the important findings that have been obtained clearly and comprehensively. The findings must be supported by complete and adequate data. The data are then displayed in the form of tables, graphs, histograms, or others and then analyzed using descriptive analysis or relevant statistical formulas. The results and discussion must be able to answer the purpose of the implementation of the research program in the preliminary section. Keep in mind that the discussion **does not** explain the details of the steps to implement the research, but focuses on discussing the results obtained.

To support the clarity of the presentation of research results, in this section you can use tables, figures, or charts. If the table, figure, or chart presented is more than one, then it is mandatory to be numbered in order from number 1 (one). If in other parts of the article there are tables/figures/charts, then the rules used are the same. Keep in mind that in the Results section, **it is not allowed to** display images in the form of photos of activities excessively. Two photos are enough if they represent an overview of the implementation of the activity. The following is a standard example of writing tables, figures, or charts.

DISCUSSION (*Book Antiqua, 12 pt, Bold*)

(Book Antiqua, 12 pt, multiple space 1). The discussion consists of at least 4 (four) components/paragraphs. The first paragraph is a summary of the research results. Second, relate the results of the research to previous research. Third, discuss the relationship with the theory used (whether to support, rejects, corroborate). Fourth, it can be explained the impact of the research results on the behavior, perspective, or mindset of the community/government, policies, and explain how the research results can overcome/answer/reduce problems that have been identified as affirmation that the research goals have been achieved. These four components can be developed into 2 (two) paragraphs and arranged sequentially. In addition, **it is not allowed** in the discussion section to include pictures/tables/graphs/formulas. It is enough to have a scientific narrative of the findings that exists systematically. The conclusions in the study are presented in the last paragraph of this section.

REFERENCES (Book Antiqua, 12 pt, Bold)

References or bibliographies are written in Book Antiqua font, 12 pt, 1 space. The terms for writing references are as follows:

1. The number of references must match the citations that have been written in the article. This means that any citations used in the article should appear in the references.
2. The minimum number of references used is 15 references (sources), and references from primary sources (scientific journals) are preferred. The composition is 90% from scientific journals and 10% from relevant books/references.
3. References used must be up-to-date, no more than 5 years from the time of the research, except for books/references.
4. Reference writing using Microsoft Word's built-in reference management app or **Mendeley**.
5. The bibliography writing format follows the **APA 6th Edition (American Psychological Association)** format or above and has an active DOI address. More information related to APA can be accessed at the following link:
