Updates from yesterday below .

1. Heat! We got the radiator heat on, but it is not sufficient enough to heat all of extended stay without the forced air still. It is sufficient enough for the time being while we're still full & having to house dogs in there though.

2. Such a good day yesterday! 25 dogs went into foster homes thanks to all of you!!! We have 3 open kennels currently & 219 dogs in foster out of the scary, loud kennels. We will have lots of dogs returning (already have 10+ emails for returns this morning- please remember foster dogs need time to settle in), so let's just have a big week & get above positive 15 kennels to breathe a little!

3. Are you ready to have another amazing day? Please bear with us today as we are expecting it to be busy! 👸

4. Did you take a dog to help yesterday? Thank you! Please remember to email us giving 48-hours notice when you need to return them! Remember the goal is to get them into another foster home or adopted before needing to come back to the kennels!

EMERGENCY- DUST BUNNY NEEDS A FOSTER.

Dust bunny is returning due to no fault of her own & needs a foster tomorrow. I am 100% crying in bed right now for this sweet girl, & she needs a foster with patience willing to work with her. She likely had not been shown love before arriving at our shelter.

Dust bunny came to us almost a month ago now. She came in with another dog as a stray. Dust bunny was so scared that she had to be carried back to a loud kennel. In the kennel, she sat for days & days facing the wall trembling profusely & not eating. It was so bad that a behavior team member had to go in her kennel & carry her into their office days later. She still shook in the office for days & days. However, this girl never showed a sign of aggression even while being so scared & confused. She sat under desks trembling, but she would allow pets. We carried her outside to the bathroom & would carry her back in since she was too scared to move (she is house trained).

She moved to the foster office after a few days in the behavior office where we instantly fell in love with this sweet Angel. Dust Bunny slowly warmed up everyday. Before she left for her first foster home (after a few days in our office) she was gently taking treats from us, loved to cuddle, allows pets/basically lets you to do whatever, & eventually started walking on the leash right by you slowly!

We sent her to foster with a foster, & she got out at 4 am. We were notified via email that morning, & I quickly got ready & met Libby in the neighborhood looking for her. It was under 20 degrees out. After 2 days of searching with countless amazing fosters & volunteers helping us we caught this sweet girl & brought her back to our warm

She was immediately giving us kisses, tail wags, & was such a happy girl! Her favorite thing is rolling over constantly for belly rubs! However, our office is no place for her, & she needs to get into a long-term foster who is willing to work with her & help her gain confidence in a home.

We sent her to a new foster several days ago, & she is coming back to us suddenly today.

Dust Bunny does have separation anxiety once she feels safe with you as she doesn't want you to leave. We will provide you with an industrial crate that she can't break out of. She does okay with other dogs with slow meets (involving baby gating & separating at first), but I'd prefer her to go to a home without other pups. She would do fine with cats (following our slow meet guidelines) & is so submissive with kids! Would do best in a house with a fenced yard.




we Appreciate You- Let's Keep Going. Please read. 🦠 🔤 — let's get 10 more dog fosters today & 30 new foster applications!

- update/write bios & photos in petpoint


