Long lasting PIDs need long lasting institutions to maintain and curate them

In Switzerland, not a large country by any means, there are multiple DOI/PID providers but there are various restrictions (e.g. cost, or subject exclusions) which mean it's not an effective system. E.g. one repository is only for social science material; another (Zenodo @ CERN) can't be used by some swiss researchers because, as an international treaty organisation, it's not technically in Switzerland (& their employers forbid them to use it for deposit.) They're mainly just used for articles. René sees a possible role for national organisations such as SWITCH (Swiss NREN) providing data PIDs.

Research Data Management without PIDs is possible but senseless!
PIDs rely on a social contract - not just technical ability to mint them

UC3 thought they weren't doing well with deposit numbers to the repository. Comparatively good, but still actually low. Learned that researchers don't think about going to library for tools - not part of workflow.

Aim to increase awareness in research community, integrate into workflows and simplify value proposition. Small scale of uptake also means that publishers don't see value of connecting with one uni repository.
