DESCRIBE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Identify and use sensory details</li><li>• Use specific adjectives and nouns, strong action verbs</li><li>• Organize logically (temporal, spatial, etc.)</li></ul>	

<b>DEFEND A CLAIM/JUSTIFY AN OPINION</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide and logically organize relevant support/reasons from a variety of sources</li> <li>• Address &amp; refute counterclaims &amp; counter-arguments</li> <li>• Cite textual evidence</li> <li>• Use signal words and phrases appropriate to justifying/defending</li> <li>• Make connections between ideas</li> </ul>	
<b>CITE TEXTUAL EVIDENCE</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use proper MLA format for quotations, paraphrases, and summaries of others' words or ideas (punctuations, periods, parentheticals)</li> <li>• Add or omit words to quotations; use relevant parts of quotations only</li> </ul>	
<b>INTERPRET INFORMATION FROM A GRAPHIC</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify factual information</li> <li>• Make logical inferences</li> </ul>	Current graphs on immigration stats, etc.
	<b>Graphs and charts:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify type of graph (line, pie, bar, etc.)</li> <li>• Read title, labels, and any key</li> <li>• Identify factual information</li> </ul>	

	<p>(values, changes, differences)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Extrapolation and interpolation</li> <li>• Make logical inferences</li> </ul>	
	<p><b>Images</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Look for major figures (people, animals, objects)</li> <li>• Look for evidence of what they are doing or what is happening to them (including words in the image, captions)</li> <li>• If helpful, divide image in quadrants</li> <li>• Make inferences</li> </ul>	
<b>RESPOND TO A PROMPT</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Read the prompt carefully</li> <li>• Underline key words</li> <li>• Know what it's asking--all parts</li> <li>• Make sure you respond to all parts of the prompt</li> <li>• Make sure you respond completely</li> <li>• Understand the <i>scope</i> and the purpose of the prompt</li> <li>• Create a claim</li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Support the claim</li> </ul>	
<b>PERSUADE OTHERS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Adjust language choice according to audience, context and/or purpose</li> </ul>	Student-crafted claim, student speeches
