Typical collegiate requirement for math is a minimum of Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II; although colleges recommend four years of math during your high school career and look at this for course rigor in the admissions process. Students need to be committed to take four years of math.

The MATH portion of the ACT consists of three subset scores, pre-algebra or elementary algebra, intermediate algebra or coordinate geometry and plane geometry and trigonometry.

AP Statistics may not fulfill a math credit depending on which University/College applied to.

It is recommended that students complete four years of math at the high school level. Most students will be asked to take a placement exam in the second semester of their Senior Year for college placement. It is not practical to take time off from math previous to taking this exam.

Universities/colleges look at course rigor when making admissions decisions. It is highly recommended by admissions to continue an upward track of rigor when scheduling your math courses. Dropping math courses or not completing your outlined sequence of math courses could affect admissions.

Please keep in mind students' other high school course load and other factors such as time management, organization, homework completion, self-discipline, and amount of school and community activities in which the student plans to participate. The accelerated math outline at the high school level is extremely rigorous.

Please keep in mind that all students interested in taking math as a dual credit course will be required to place into that course utilizing the UW math placement exam. A student not in the typical Algebra II sequence will be required to schedule and take their own placement exam, the school will not do this for them.

Currently, Fond du Lac High School offers the following dual-credit math courses:

College Algebra, Pre-Calculus, Calculus I, Calculus II, and AP Statistics.

Students can plan on reaching collegiate level instruction in Math with no acceleration, if so desired.

Please keep in mind that all students interested in taking math as a dual credit course will be required to place into that course utilizing the UW math placement exam. A student not in the typical Algebra II sequence will be required to schedule and take their own placement exam, the school will not do this for them.

Things to know from your High School Counselor while making a decision regarding your DEP:

A WVS course taken over the summer is essentially a year-long course placed into a 3 month period. Online Learning is very different from your typical brick and mortar course. Please keep in mind students' other high school course load and other factors such as time management, organization, homework completion, self-discipline, and amount of school and community activities in which the student plans to participate. These courses will count towards your GPA and will be included on your transcript.

WVS CONTRACT

Continued Enrollment: FT students must pass four WVS classes in order to re-enroll. If a student fails a WVS class, they will only be allowed to re-enroll in the number of classes they were successful in. If a student passes all his/her WVS classes, they will be allowed to enroll in additional classes, no more than a total of 7.

Requirements: GPA of 2.0 or higher, Students with 5 or more unexcused absences or 10 or more unexcused in a semester must be reviewed on a case by case basis by administration. Students can not be a 5th year student. Enrichment must include the DEP process in entirety.

I understand and agree with the following information:

- 1. Course "Drop Policy" WVS guidelines offer a 20 day drop policy, although you will have to follow our FHS add/drop policy.
- 2. Grades will count toward an official high school GPA and be listed on your high school transcript.
- 3. The student and family will be responsible for the cost of the course and any financial obligations and will not be able to continue with WVS if the approved course is not completed successfully or not completed successfully within the time frame. Your end date will be one week before the end of our FHS semester. There will be no extensions.
- 4. Not meeting the minimum attendance requirement for any 3 weeks in a semester for any course (or combination of courses if enrolled in more than one course) is considered Habitual Truancy and is therefore in violation of WI Compulsory Attendance Statutes 118.15 (1)(a) that require a child attend school regularly until graduation from high school, or until the end of the semester in which he/she turns 18 years of age, or until he or she is excused from attendance by the school board. The student and parent/guardian may be subject to legal sanctions. Minimum attendance is based not only on time logged but by successful submission of completed coursework, participation in course activities such as threaded discussions, and communication with the online instructor.
- 5. It is suggested that students work 45 minutes per day per course, excluding summer courses which may require more time.
- 6. Students will have to come into FHS, for all required standardized testing (examples: ACT, ACT Aspire, etc.) and various WVS tests may need to be proctored at the highschool.
- 7. Students are ultimately responsible for the courses that they are taking and their graduation requirements, as well as their transcript.
- 8. All students will have an assigned Local Educator Guide (LEG) through Fond du Lac High School.
- 9. If you are a potential athlete looking to gain NCAA approval please take note of the WVS NCAA approved course list.
- 10. Students will have to provide their own technology for summer courses unless otherwise approved through administration, and students are responsible for this approval.
- 11. All students will be enrolled in a student orientation class. You will not be graded for this course, although this is highly recommended for all students to complete. If you do not see a course on your schedule that you registered for it is your responsibility to let the WVS counselor or LEG know.
- 12. Parents/Guardians have continued access to your student's account, it is the part of the parental responsibilities to oversee and guide your student's success.
- 13. Students will receive a fee if their issued chromebook/laptop is not turned in at the required time.
- 14. Grading and retake policies for WVS do not mimic the FHS grading policy.
