## Next Step Scholarships

Next Step Scholarship offers grants and scholarships from federal, state, and Pacific University sources to cover full tuition for need-eligible. Students can also access work-study and federal loans for additional costs. This offer is for students in Future Connect provided they maintain full-time enrollment, good academic progress, and financial aid eligibility.

### Eligibility Requirements:

PCC students completing 45 transferable quarter credits through the Future Connect program who have earned their associate's degrees from Portland Community College (PCC) and are transferring to Pacific University.

### Scholarship Details:

- **Number of Scholarships:** Up to 3 renewable
- **Award:** Renewable full-tuition scholarship
- **Deadline:** March 1

### Academic Requirements:

- Complete an AAOT degree or ASOT-B at PCC
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0

### Application Process:

1. Applications for admission are to be submitted via [Pacific's online transfer application](#) or through the [Transfer Common Application\\*](#).
2. Submission of Official college transcripts (including other college transcripts)
3. A letter of recommendation
4. Submit a separate [Future Connect Next Steps Scholarship](#) 350-500 word essay, including an additional essay beyond the application by March 1.
5. Selected candidates may be invited to an interview
6. Must be admitted to Pacific University by March 1, as a full-time degree-seeking undergraduate (Forest Grove campus only) to begin in the Fall term.

### Exclusions:

- This scholarship excludes candidates pursuing the Dental Hygiene program.
- It is not applicable to candidates pursuing a Bachelor of Education (for those working full time in education)
- It does not apply to candidates pursuing a Bachelor of Health Science (online degree)

### Awarding:

Scholarship awardees will be notified by mid-March and will receive a financial aid award detailing the scholarship offer via mail. **Renewal:** Maintain good academic standing, Maintain full-time enrollment at Linfield University, and Establish financial aid through ORSAA or FAFSA.

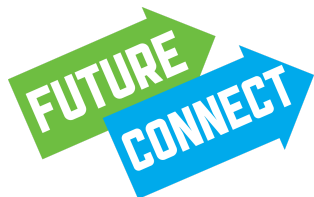
