Introductions & Round Table Updates/Discussion:

Fiscal year FY23 Grant Reports:

Integrated Provider Network:

- The Savor Every Moment media campaign was shared with 62 different churches in the 5-county area with 9 churches agreeing to post the campaign in their bulletins, newsletters, or on their bulletin board. This campaign is also running on 4 different radio stations that reach Winneshiek county until June 30th.
- Jenny trained over 100 individuals with the TIPS Responsible Beverage Server
 Training certification this fiscal year with over 60 of the participants being from
 Winneshiek County. Leah became TIPS Trainer certified in May and is looking for
 individuals to train.

Age to serve alcohol has changed from 18 to 16 years old. There are some stipulations, but statistics show the younger the server the higher chance to over serve minors. Please reach out to businesses and promote TIPS.

- Five Curriculum-Based Support Groups took place in Winneshiek County this fiscal year with 43 students attending. CBSG will start again in the Fall.
- Jenny has worked on reaching out to nonprofit businesses and helping them implement the Responsible Gambling Toolkit for the workplace. Please call 1-800-BETS-OFF for help with problem gambling.

State Opioid Response Grant (SOR3):

- Jon is continuing to give trainings (More information under "New Business")
- He will be meeting with the Winneshiek County Settlement Committee to discuss how to spend the \$280,000 total Opioid Settlement that Winneshiek County will receive over the next 15 years.

Tobacco Prevention

- Ashley presented to approximately 112 youth in Winneshiek County about the harms of vaping
- Roughly 21 adults from Winneshiek attended a Youth Nicotine Trends training
- Next fiscal year she will continue to offer Youth Nicotine Frends training for Adults and promotion of the youth and adult cessation programs.

Youth Mentoring

- Mentoring currently has 13 matches in Winneshiek County. There are 5 youth (1 girl & 4 boys) waiting for a mentor. As usual, they are always looking for more mentors and kids for their program.
- They had a mentoring event at Village Creek which was Fun at the Lake with 25 people participating.
- There will be another Youth Mentoring event at Prairie Funland in Prairie Du Chien,
 WI on July 22nd. This event includes go-karting, water wars, and pizza!
- Please think about becoming a youth mentor for a day. Mentors for a day are needed for all of the events that mentoring puts on. This is a one-day mentoring opportunity. Otherwise if you are looking for a longer term mentoring opportunity, mentors meet with their youth 4 hours per month with a one year commitment.

Northeast Iowa Behavioral Health: Judy is working on trying to get 6 more people enrolled in treatment under the SOR grant to meet their goals for the year.

- The coalition has decided to work on getting small resource papers together to put in these locations for individuals that are in need of a variety of different resources in Winneshiek County
 - Jenny will work on making this resource and bring it to the next meeting in July to get the coalition member's input.

Hidden in Plain Sight

- Community Scan Updates
 - The Helping Services Prevention Team went to Decorah Vape & Smoke Friday before the meeting and collected extra items for HIPS including a Kratom drink and rubix cube grinder.
 - If you have free time, stop by and see all of the different items in this store. A wide variety of Kratom, vapes, bongs, etc in bright colors fill the store without the need for a "18 Years or Older" sign on the door.
 - Products with <0.3% THC are also able to be sold at this store among others because of the new amendment to the farm bill. This type of THC does not have an age limit and is not certified through the FDA, meaning there is no way to know exactly how much THC it contains even though it says <0.3% on the packaging.
