## **Chapter Actions:**

- Chapters will not hold <u>ANY</u> in-person events of any kind (including, but not limited to: social, philanthropy, recruitment, fundraising, etc...)
- Chapters will not have any guests on chapter properties during the recruitment period
- Chapters will wear masks in common areas if their guest policy is anything other than "no guests allowed"
- Chapters members will practice social distancing and wear masks whenever they are in public or in a crowded space

## **Individual Actions:**

- Wear a face covering at all times when outside and comply with individual chapter face covering expectations
- Practice physical/social distancing (6 ft. apart) as much as possible
- ❖ Do NOT attend any social gatherings that are not abiding by local guidelines
- ❖ Practice hand washing for 20 seconds regularly
- Quarantine for 14 days if you have been exposed to anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19
- Stay home if you are experiencing any of these <u>symptoms</u> and call your medical provider for advice
- Stay home if a member of your household has a confirmed COVID-19 infection or you have been in close contact with someone who had a confirmed COVID-19 infection

- ❖ Get tested if you are exhibiting any of the symptoms associated with COVID or you had close contact with someone who has COVID-19
- ❖ Report to the Tang Center if you have a positive COVID-19 test
