Lincoln Public Schools will continuously review and update the 2021-22 LPS Safe Return to School Plan throughout the school year as the risk of COVID-19 spread in our community changes. This work will be ongoing as new research emerges and

more guidance is provided to the school district from the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department (LLCHD), the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) and the U.S. Department of Education.

ParentVUE-LPS Parent Portal

Synergy ParentVUE is increasingly becoming the "one-stop shop" for information about your student's teachers and classes. In addition to providing parents/guardians secure access to student grades (secondary), assignments, attendance, and class information, ParentVUE is also the avenue for parents/guardians to verify student enrollment in LPS (now through Sept 6th). Parents of secondary students can also pay fees (Chromebook fines, yearbooks, etc.) via ParentVUE.

The District's goal is to ensure at least one parent/guardian per household has activated and uses their Parent/UE account. If you haven't yet acquired an account, please contact the school office for an activation key.

Hello, from the Health Office!

My name is Lori Kampsnider and this will be my 3rd year with Lincoln Public Schools. I'm excited to join the Kloefkorn Health Office as the school Nurse. As a reminder, we ask for any pertinent health information regarding your student 's health like a physical, dental, hearing or vision that has been completed within the last 6 months. The Health Office will start their annual screenings for vision, hearing, height, and weight beginning in September. Suicide Prevention Awareness Month

September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. Suicide is the second leading cause of death among people age 10-24. Over the past five years, it has steadily increased.

Awareness is important so we can all work towards prevention. This can be a hard topic but these uncomfortable conversations are valuable. Talking about suicide *does not* increase the chances it will occur, in fact putting light on it helps a struggling individual feel supported.

To partner with families we will be presenting information to students about mental health warning signs and how to get help. Students in middle and high school will get detailed suggestions to increase their protective factors and self care while elementary students will get a general message about how to manage overwhelming feelings and how to ask for help. All information includes encouraging youth to talk to you as their parent/caregiver.

One of the best ways to help your child's emotional health is to remember these basics; get plenty of sleep, drink water, eat nutritious foods, spend time outside in the fresh air, and find ways to relax. Your child's school social worker, school counselor, or school psychologist is available during the school day to talk with you if you have concerns or questions we can help with. We want to work together to ensure all children have the tools they need to be well.


Please note, at this time, LPS is requiring all visitors to the school to wear a face covering, regardless of vaccination status.
