- 2. Elect/Appoint Secretary: Patricia Drew
- 3. Approval of the agenda: Motion: Lee Adams. Second: Jia Guo. Approved by unanimous consent.
- 4. Approval of <u>10/20/22</u> minutes. Motion: Patrick Huang. Second: Vivian Gonzalez Cueto. Approved by unanimous consent.

5. Reports:

- a. Report of the Chair: Sarah Nielson: No new reports. Lee Adams question: One program did not submit an annual report (MBA), TT requests are in though CBE. Maureen: If you let it go for one program, more may follow. Maureen and CAPR leaders will send out requests for reports to departments.
- b. Report of the Presidential Appointee. Fanny Yeung: Has conflict today. She wants to report that the CAPR data portal is working again. Is working with IT to do a deep revision of the portal.
- c. Report of Academic Programs & Services: Maureen Scharberg: For liaisons working with programs with 5-year reviews, remind them of Adobe sign for external reviewers.
 As you go through AR, if programs are seeking to suspend or terminate, please notify Maureen either state side or self-support programs.

6. Business Items:

a. New program proposals ready for CAPR review: Two CBE programs that have submitted new proposals – requesting that they are added to the Master Plan in California. Both proposals are timely and highly in-demand in the marketplace; both are following a

fast-track process. A second proposal will come through in SP 23 for launch of all programs in Fall of 2024.

- i. M.S. Marketing Analytics [Curriculog Proposal] Yi He: Chair of Marketing. Growing demand for degrees in marketing analytics, and growing job opportunities available. There is a unique comparative advantage in analytics and technology. Two Bay Area private schools offer MS in Marketing, but we will be the first Bay Area CSU campus to offer MS in Marketing Analytics. Have hired two new TT faculty already and can use their expertise. Anticipate starting with 20-30 students, no new faculty needed.
- ii. B.S. in Business (Accounting and) Analytics [Curriculog Proposal] Jiming Wu: Want to have students from different groups attend East Bay, and offer new programs to attract new students. Leading to rewarding careers, helping students to succeed. Will use existing faculty resources. Will modify existing courses for the new program. Steve Peng: Business analytics is a hot area and will help undergraduate students to get into the field. St. Marys, GG and Santa Clara all have Business Analytics degrees; no CSUs in the area have Analytics.

Singh: It is a critical juncture where CSUEB has lost many students, and we need to revise to address pressing labor demands. These programs will eliminate gaps. Are likely to support existing students and attract new students. Faculty are excited about these opportunities.

Lee Adams: What will you need from the library to support these new programs? The library has experienced significant cuts.

Sarah Nielson: You have consulted with Computer Science and Statistics, what were their thoughts? Peng: We met with and are working with these departments to have mutual benefits. If we attract Frosh students, the students will take CS classes in lower div.

Maureen Scharberg: They have also aligned with AD-T in CS, which is great because most students after 2025 will be AD-T students.

Motion to approve MS in Marketing Analytics: Maureen Scharberg. Second: Jia Guo. Approved by unanimous consent.

Motion to approve BS in Business Analytics: Lee Adams. Vivian Gonzalez Cueto seconds. Approved by unanimous consent.

 - iii. Lee Adams: Reports are quite long, but we are asking for a lot of information. Maureen Scharberg: It may be a good time to look at what we are asking for, and think about what to cut. Sarah Nielsen: We may look at this over Winter Break or (as a committee) next Spring Semester. Think about scaffolding AR towards 5-year reports.
