General Items

- o COSSUP24 Application
 - o Applied for a 3-year 1 million grant to fund the continuation of the Mobile MAT unit. No news as of Tuesday the 20th.
 - o WOOPC would become the governing body for this grant, and we would have to follow the open meetings act.
- o Opioid Settlement Update
 - o It is expected that OAB will sign our budget mods and send us the contract any day.
 - o This grant is for \$350,000 through June 2025.
 - o Focus on Naloxone Saturation of the 8-County SWODA (South Western Oklahoma Development Authority) area (Roger Mills, Custer, Beckham, Washita, Greer, Kiowa, Harmon, and Jackson Counties). Vending machines (25), OD Emergency Kits (400) (schools, courthouses, public buildings, etc.), staff and public training. Placement of the vending machines and/or OD emergency kits would require partner to sign an MOU, committing to support the work of the project in various ways (no financial obligation from partners).
- o Legislation
 - o Oklahoma House and Senate are not in session right now.
 - o There are interim studies going on right now but there doesn't seem to be room for public input of advocacy. The lawmaker wants to explore a issue and then they invite people to give input on the issue.

Harm Reduction Efforts-

- o Steve Berry, SWODA
 - o SWODA Narcan Hub
 - o Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Abuse Site-Based Program (COSSAP) (Harmon, Jackson, Tillman, Kiowa, and Caddo).
 - o We have installed some Narcan Vending Machines in these communities, and we are collecting some demographic data on who is getting this Narcan.
 - o The new machine is in place at Red Rock in Hobart. SWODA has been purchasing Naloxone through Padagis for this program.
 - o Other vending machines are located at:
 - Shortgrass in Hollis
 - Amethyst House in Altus
 - Jackson County Memorial Hospital
 - Operation Cares in Fredrick
 - Shortgrass Altus
 - o We received a no cost extension for this current COSSUP grant to continue efforts for another year.
 - Will be able to provide naloxone, lock bags, and Deterra bags.
 - o OSDH has provided 1000 Fentanyl Test Strip Kits (1 Fentanyl Test Strip, Vial of water, measure/stir stick, cup, and instructions on how to test drugs for Fentanyl. Does not have reorder info and only contains the single strip. We suggest to augment with a 10-pack or more of strips.
 - o SWODA pre-ordered 500 Xylazine Testing Kits from OSDH.
- o Darien Chebahtah, Cheyenne & Arapaho Tribal Opioid Response
 - o Overdose Awareness and Memorial Event- Saturday, August 24th in Watonga from 10a-2p, but a dance will follow until midnight. Lunch will be provided. Location is the Lucky Star Casino's Conference Center.
- o Brittani Brice, Red Rock Behavioral Health
 - o Narcan Vending Machine in Chickasha is going through about 100 units a week.
 - o The problem is people will come in and take 40 or more and take all the Fentanyl Test Stripes and not leave any for others.
 - o People are taking that narcan and selling it.
 - o People are just leaving Narcan outside in the hot sun as well.

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- o Mobile Unit Updates- Our census remains at 5. However, HRSA funding will end on 8-31-24. If new funding is not secured, the program will cease, and clients will be referred to another program. The COSSUP24 application, if approved, would fund continuation of the Mobile Unit Operations. SWODA will retain ownership of the Mobile Unit and will continue to seek opportunities to keep this program running.
- o We have provided technical assistance to an APRN out of Ft Cobb that wants to begin prescribing Suboxone out of her medical clinic. Once she begins prescribing, we will publicize her clinic's new services and explore referral procedures.
- o George Hawkins Memorial Treatment Center, Michael Shields
 - o Next treatment cycle starts September 4th.
 - o Outpatient Counseling program should come online soon.
