I'm a regional fellow/group leader/role for Citizens' Climate Lobby, a national nonprofit organization that empowers citizens in civic engagement on climate solutions. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change warns that humanity has 12 years to drastically reduce greenhouse gas emissions in order to prevent the worst impacts of climate change. The bipartisan Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act (H.R. 763), introduced in the House this year, would put a price on GHG emissions starting at \$15 per metric ton and increasing by \$10/mt each succeeding year. The bill now has 29 cosponsors. This policy would

- Reduce America's emissions by at least 40% in the first 12 years. It's supported by economists and scientists as simple, comprehensive, and effective.
- Improve health and save lives by reducing pollution that Americans breathe. Poor air quality causes an estimated 114,000 U.S. deaths each year and sickens thousands more. Additionally, the carbon dividend puts money directly into people's pockets every month to spend as they see fit, helping low and middle-income Americans.
- Create 2.1 million new jobs, thanks to economic growth in local communities across America.

We invite leaders in higher education to support this bill by providing their <u>endorsement</u>, or endorse carbon pricing by signing the <u>Higher Education Carbon Pricing Endorsement Initiative</u>.
