Divisional Guideline

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Overview

This document contains information regarding Research Divisions. It details the divisions, the responsibilities of these divisions, as well as a structure for these divisions. It also explains the added privileges available to division members and details how they should be run.

Divisional structure

Research Divisions are defined as research personnel organized into departmental sub-groups dependent on their specializations and experience. The Director of Research will appoint an Executive Researcher with the appropriate credentials to lead Divisions.

The Division Leads will be responsible for:

- Providing Advertisement for their Division
- Deciding and reporting on the membership of their division
- Determining the ranking structure and roles of their division
- Representing their division at regular staff meetings
- Organizing and reporting research projects
- Seeking further permissions if required
- Delegating research responsibilities for ongoing research projects
- Ensuring the proper conduct of divisional members

The Divisional Lead reports directly to the Director of Research on the projects that are taking place, and will attend regular meetings for oversight to be provided.

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In the event a division unexpectedly has no lead for a period of time, ongoing research may be continued by its members. Any new projects will have to be approved by the Director of Research until a new Division Lead is selected.

Projects being run by the division must be approved by the Divisional Lead, who has the responsibility to seek any further authorization required from the Director of Research or from the Ethics Committee. Any further considerations or equipment required for experiments to take place should also be facilitated by the Divisional Lead.

Division Members will be decided by the Divisional Lead with oversight on this process provided by the Director of Research. This oversight extends to any foundation staff with authority over the Director.

Along with the other powers and responsibilities afforded to members of the Research Department, Division Members are able to:

- Work towards divisional research objectives
- Requisition additional resources available to them due to divisional privileges
- Provide MTF or other departments support when handling anomalous entities that fall within their divisions remit
- Contribute to divisional research documentation

It should be mentioned that ongoing www.projects do not grant exclusivity of research over specific SCP subjects. Divisions do not take priority in reserving SCPs for testing, and they may not claim any degree of ownership over any SCPs.

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Documents

Division Leads are expected to upkeep a divisional roster. This is referred to as the Compendium. It should be updated frequently. This document will automatically keep a statistical record of an individual's performance regardless of if they are in a division or not. These statistics will reflect any Lectures presented, Excellent Documents submitted, as well as any commendations for outstanding acts, that an individual has received. Divisional leads are responsible for ensuring members under their roster have an accurate representation of performance reflected on the Compendium.

Advertisements should be realistic and remain on site. This should outline the requirements for joining the division in detail, as well as the process they must go through to become a member.

Division Leads are also able to create policy that applies to their members if they so wish. These policies should additionally be listed in their documentation and approved by the Director of Research or higher. All members are still bound by the Code of Conduct, Code of Ethics, and any departmental policy. Those sets of policy supersede any divisional policy in importance, and if conflict arises the aforementioned policies take precedence. Policies should outline how members are expected to behave, how they should contribute to group goals, how projects are undertaken, and what privileges members are able to request due to their membership.

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Divisions

G-1 (RTF Gamma-1)

Division Lead: Executive Researcher Hikov

Primary SCPs: Surface SCPs

Research Task Force Gamma-1 specializes in field experimentation and are usually the first researchers to interact with new, not yet contained anomalies. RTF Gamma-1 is able to "attach" itself onto an MTF regiment to provide support in high-stakes situations.

BIO-2 (Biohazard Division)

Division Lead: Executive Researcher

Primary SCPs: SCP-008, SCP-409, SCP-049, SCP-457

BIO-2 is a division that specializes in the study of anomalous diseases, pathogens and other biological phenomena. All Members have access to Biohazard equipment.

COG-3 (Cognitohazard Division)

Division Lead: Executive Researcher

Primary SCPs: SCP-012, SCP-096, SCP-099, SCP-512, SCP-3078

COG-3 is a division that specializes in the research of cognitious anomalies through the use of protective equipment.

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I-4 (Extra-dimensional Division)

Division Lead: Executive Researcher Kings

Primary SCPs: SCP-087, SCP-106, SCP-178, SCP-682, SCP-860

The extra-dimensional division specializes in the study of anomalies that exhibit dimension-warping capabilities or originate from another dimension and also conduct extra-dimensional exploration.

PSI-5 (Psychology Division)

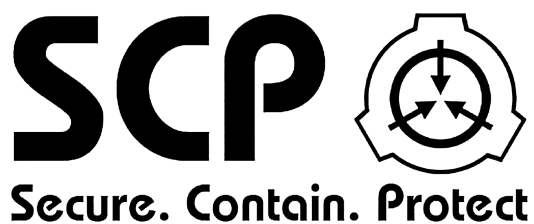
Division Lead: Executive Researcher Jam Ma

PSI-5 specializes in the study of sentient and intelligent anomalies. Members of PSI-5 are also able to conduct psychological evaluation on foundation personnel if they have a Medical License.
