Well, I'm afraid I don't know.

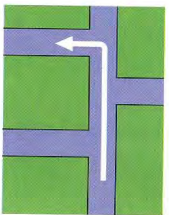
Yes, there is. / No, not near here I'm afraid.

Just keep going.

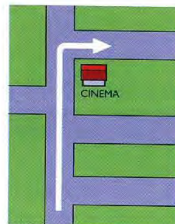
It's about 10 minutes.

There's a cinema on the corner.**

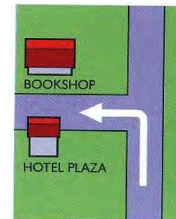


Go past the bank.

Cross the street.



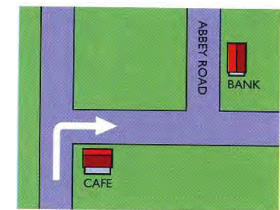
Go over the bridge.
