Growing up as a first-generation only child in a low-income and immigrant household, my parents emphasized the importance of focusing on my academics, causing them to minimize my concerns surrounding household chores and financial difficulties. With my growth project, I hope to normalize the seemingly complex field of financial literacy in order to both aid my parents in their financial struggle as well as develop a foundation of financial knowledge in preparation for college and adulthood. Through educating myself via research and consulting financial experts, I also hope to provide myself as a resource to other high schoolers like me by hosting workshops about topics in financial literacy, pertinent to the transition from high school to college.
Social Impact	How do you plan to impact a community or group of people from this project?	My personal objective is to normalize the seemingly complex field of financial literacy to high school students from low-income and/or first-generation backgrounds. By learning more about financial literacy, I will build a foundation of financial knowledge that prepares me for the one of the "adulting" aspects of college. This project will also allow me to further build on this foundation in the future through more advanced topics related to finances. I will be able to regularly apply the knowledge I learn during my Growth Project into my daily life. By being able to interpret financial jargon and explain it to others in a shorter, simpler way, I will acquire the skills of teaching and demystifying seemingly complicated topics that I can later apply to my future career in pharmacy, which also contains a lot of medical jargon. By understanding the basics of financial literacy, it furthers my

		level of independence and ability to rely on myself instead of being solely dependent on my parents.	
Personal Growth	How will this project help you grow as a person? What will you learn, or what experience will you gain from completing this?	My growth in self-independence eases my parents' stress when dealing with finances or financial issues that could be solved with more knowledge in those areas. Furthermore, by providing workshops and gathering material from my own research and learning, I can not only allow others with similar backgrounds as mine to have access to financial literacy information, but will also gain expertise in the field of financial literacy that will help me in my life.	
Performance Indicator	How will you track your progress and impact in this project?	I will be recording written logs of what I researched and learned, either daily or weekly depending on what my goal is. The topics could range from topics in finance, connecting and networking with financial professionals, gathering user data, creating slideshow presentations, hosting workshops, and more. As stated, I will also share the information I've learned in my own research and from consultation with experts in the field via Zoom teaching sessions and typed documents for reference.	
Risks	What will be the most challenging part of this project?	A major challenge to my project is achieving credibility with the information I will be providing to others. Many may believe: "Well why should I listen to her, if she's had no work/higher educational experience in finance? Does she even know what she's talking about?" To hopefully combat this idea, I will extensively research each source I gather information from, cite all sources, fact check all information, and reach out to experts in the financial field to avoid false, incredible information. Also, I believe that having a large and broad enough group to attend a workshop I've put together will definitely be a networking challenge.

What have you learned?	<ul> <li>The first week, I gathered user research from graduating seniors, college freshmen, and college sophomores about what they wish they would've known about financial literacy. So far, they've mentioned wanting to know more about FAFSA, budgeting, taxes and its regulations, building a line of credit, loan types, etc</li> <li>finished gathering information for all the topics I want to talk about. I've drafted agendas for all 3 workshops that I will be holding, and created infographic posters for the workshops to post on social media and have others share. I've also tried to contact financial experts.</li> <li>finished the first slideshow deck for the first of three workshops I plan on hosting. This includes slimming down the amount of information from my general research and picking out the specific portions of my research that would be the most important to teach others. I also integrated various photos and interactive slides like "Quick Check" and screenshots of the websites I talk about. I also intend to insert breaks and I've kept the informational point short so it's easier on the audience's eyes.</li> </ul>

What work do you plan to start?	<ul> <li>I hope to focus on gathering basic information surrounding banking and financial aid in order to generate slideshows for the future workshops. I also want to reach out to financial experts to have a more direct source of information.</li> <li>I want to start and hopefully finish one complete workshop's slideshow and gather some more preliminary information. I also want to make sure the format for my workshops are ideal and usable.</li> <li>Researching different ways to visualize the information to make it understandable with my audience.</li> </ul>

However, I've completed all the needed work and only need to work on the slideshows. 




## **Project Update 3 - Midway Update**





- I probably need to ask about what others want in an infographic of which topics they want me to cover. I also need to start thinking about my Pitch Day Presentation.


