NEW & UNFINISHED BUSINESS: -

In response to questions on the cat problem in the City, Mayor Hogan said that Attorney Pelych will review the questions and respond. The proposed law needs to be tweaked and will then be presented to the full Council. Hogan, Bud Burdett and Mark Mahoney will be meeting to work on a solution to the cat problem.

Mayor Hogan reported that the State Budget has been passed with a variation of the “pension smoothing”. There has been an increase in consolidated highway improvements funding.

The new project at the railroad depot was discussed. 100 new jobs will be created in the next year. Mayor Hogan gave all credit for this project to Pete Wall.

Peebles is buying the building on Broadway and will be investing \$1,000,000 for remodeling and improvements.

The new Save-A-Lot store is under construction. Aaron's has moved into their new location and Family Dollar is investing \$300,000 in their expansion and remodel.

Alderman Brown asked if there were any street projects planned for this year. Mayor Hogan said there were not any major works planned but lots of paving.

Alderman Sciotti asked if the City has changed over to the new radio system yet. Hogan said we are in the process and the funds have been budgeted for.

Alderman Buckley asked if the increase in minimum wage had been planned for. Hogan said that he budgeted for the increase for the summer workers.
