- An overview of the problem that the case addresses, citing relevant literature wherever necessary.
- Should end with a single sentence describing the patient and the basic condition that he or she is suffering from

CASE PRESENTATION

- Describe the details of the case adequately with the help of 3-4 images
 - o Patient description
 - o Case history
 - Physical examination findings
 - Results of laboratory tests and other investigations
 - o Management and treatment plan/received
 - o Expected/Actual outcome.

DISCUSSION

- Expanding on what has been said in the introduction, focusing on why the case is noteworthy and the problem that it addresses.
 - a summary of the existing literature on the topic.
 - the existing theories and research findings on the key issue in the patient's condition.
 - narrow down to the source of confusion or the main challenge in the case.
 - connected to the existing literature, mentioning the message that the case conveys.

• explain whether this corroborates with or detracts from current beliefs about the problem and how this evidence can add value to future clinical practice.

CONCLUSIONS

- briefly mention the key points covered in the case report.
- give suggestions and recommendations to clinicians, teachers, or researchers.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

• State if you have any conflict of interest involved in the case report and publication.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

• Thank individuals or organizations that supported your study specifically; but do not use literary and flowery word.

CONSENT

• *Mention about consent.*

AUTHOR CONTRIBUTIONS

• State the contributions from all authors named in the article.

- In case of multiple authors, list only the first three (3) authors and then put et al
- Journal names should always be abbreviated.
