Graduation Requirements

It is important that you select a course load that will fulfill graduation requirements. In order to graduate, students need a total of at least **220 credits**; additionally, they need to meet credit requirements by A-G subject and pass specific required courses:

Course Guideline

AP Course Requirements: There are no requirements for AP World History since it is a required course. For all other elective AP classes, students are encouraged to sign up. Requests for the elective AP courses will be subject to approval after course selection requests are submitted.

Credit Recovery from 2021-22

- Students who failed a semester of a required course in <u>History</u>, <u>English</u>, <u>Math or Science</u> will likely be able to recover
 the credits during **Extended Year Summer Remediation** and should select the next level course for 2022-2023 (if
 needed). If the student doesn't recover the credits during summer remediation, they will retake the course during the
 2021-22 school year.
- Students who failed a semester of <u>Spanish</u> will not be able to recover the credits in summer remediation and should select the same course to repeat in 2022-23, rather than the next level course.

If you are currently in Geometry, you should select Algebra 2 or Algebra 2/Precalculus. (Note: If you fail a semester of your math class <i>this</i> school year, you will need to recover the credits in Summer School or retake it next school year.)
	4. Biology or Chemistry	Science	All 10th graders must take a science course. If you passed semester 1 Biology, select Chemistry. If you failed semester 1 of Biology, select Biology (you will need to retake it next year).
	5. Spanish 1, Spanish 2, Spanish 3, AP Spanish Language or AP Spanish Literature	Spanish	All 10th graders must take a Spanish course. If you are a non-native speaker, select Spanish 1. If you are currently in Spanish 1, select Spanish 2. If you are a native Spanish speaker, select Spanish 3. If you are currently in Spanish 3, select AP Spanish Language. If you are currently in AP Spanish Language, it is highly recommended you take AP Spanish Literature (Note: If you fail a semester of your Spanish class this school year, you will need to recover the credits in Summer School or retake it next school year.)
