Wisconsin Lutheran delivered a dominant all-around performance, defeating Germantown **72–57** behind efficient shooting, strong rebounding, and standout individual efforts across the lineup.



Wisco - Offense Takes Off Early

Wisco shot an impressive **47.5% from the field** and **52.4% on 2-point attempts**, consistently attacking the paint and converting high-percentage looks. Their balanced scoring attack featured multiple double-digit contributors.

- Kaelyn Nommensen turned in a monster performance, leading all scorers with 22 points, shooting 9-for-13 from the field and pulling down 12 rebounds for a dominant double-double. She added 4 assists and 2 steals, impacting every facet of the game.
- Londyn Hollins provided a huge scoring lift with 17 points on an efficient 7-of-11 shooting night, including two made threes. She also chipped in 2 rebounds, 2 assists, and a steal.
- **Beth Langebartels** was a force on the boards, tallying **8 rebounds** to go with 6 points and steady interior defense.
- Reese Grudzielanek added 7 points, 3 rebounds, while Norah Oschner contributed 6 points and 3 assists, and Layla Walz dished out 7 assists.

Key Differences in the Game

- Wisco claimed a decisive 44–41 rebounding advantage, including 11 offensive boards that led to valuable second-chance scoring.
- Defensively, they held Germantown to just **30.4% shooting** from the field and **24% from three**, consistently contesting shots and limiting clean looks.
- The Vikings forced **19 turnovers**, converting them into transition points and maintaining control of the pace throughout the game.
