All clubs are open to all grade levels with the exception of the National Junior Honors Society.

Club FUSE (Ms. Haley/Mrs. Leming) - Members include students of both neurotypical and neurodiverse populations at DPMS. We focus on forming meaningful friendships and practicing various life and social skills in a relaxed setting. Our buddies take pride in leading a movement for inclusion and acceptance within our school and our community! Buddies are expected to maintain regular contact and participate in monthly events, which can include activities at school games, crafts, team building activities, or outside of school (like going out for ice cream or bowling). To be a member, students must complete an application, attend monthly after-school meetings, be a positive role model, put their phones away during meetings, and communicate with sponsors if they cannot attend.

**Student Leadership Club (Communications)** (Mrs. Loats) - The Student Leadership Club (SLC) aims to empower students, grades 6th-8th, to take active roles in shaping their school community, develop leadership skills, and promote a positive school culture. The SLC provides a platform for students to voice their opinions, initiate projects, collaborate with peers and school staff to make meaningful contributions to the school environment.
