Food Storage

Goal: Store 3 month Food supply of foods your entire normally eats or would normally eat. Then get a year supply of more basic foods like grains, rice, and wheat/flour"

Why this is important	It's not possible to store all the water you're going to need for your whole family (for drinking, cooking, cleaning). Its important to engineer a way to capture water for ongoing use. With the use of tarps and surface area, you can capture rain water. Be able to store water for a month or 2 so that you can recapture water when it rains every month.

Getting a solar generator will be one of the most important things you can do. You will need to also do a few modifications on it to protect it from any EMP (natural or man-made). It's easy to do but it's an important thing to protect your equipment and to make sure you have the fuel necessary to cook for your family. I have felt strongly like in our area in Utah, major portions of the state will be out of power for an extended amount of time. If a major earthquake is to occur, it could be months before power is restored. Getting a large solar generator, some solar panels to charge, and then possibly a smaller power station to make things more portable, will be one of the key differences in how your experience will be.

Clothing

Clothing will be one of the most important things you can do to help compensate for heat and cold. You won't need to heat your house as much if you are properly protected. Try to get a base layer, mid layer, and top layer, and then finally a "shell" or "insulated" layer for each member in your family. Get some good socks and shoes for each member of your family too. Also get some sort of hat or head wear. For all the items of clothing, stay away from Cotton.

As you get all the items of clothing for each individual family member, try to keep it all packaged together so it's organized.

I'll show ideas below for each item below and then you can select what will be good for you and your family and go from there. Replicate this pattern for smaller kids.

I've also been thinking, there's a good chance you have a lot of mid-layer stuff already. Just focus on getting a base layer, and then a good top layer and shell, and then use the clothes you have already for a mid layer.
