We, the Farm, wish to provide you with fresh, local, seasonal food and you, the Member, wish to receive a portion of our harvest. This agreement outlines our shared commitments to that relationship.

Section 1. Our CSA Farm

A. Becoming a Part of our Farm:

Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) is a relationship between our farm and you as our customer. Rather than simply purchasing food, our customers become “members” of this CSA farm who receive a portion of the farm’s harvest. Our CSA runs for 20 weeks, from May to September. Members are responsible for showing up at the farm every other week to pick up your share of Farm Grown or Produced Goods. You will generally receive 2 Dozen Eggs, 2 Loaves of Fresh Sourdough Bread, and a selection of seasonal items as listed in subsection C equivalent to two grocery bags of produce, with up to 3 bags during peak season. Further included in this share is 2 Whole Chickens from each of our 3 batches of birds for the season. Batch dates are as follows, 5/23, 8/1, and 9/26. Vegetarian Option is also available for a reduced price as listed in Section 4. Detailed information regarding pick-up is discussed below in Section 3. Variety and quantity may vary as described below in Section 2.

B. Our Growing Practices:

Our farm believes in responsible husbandry and farming practices. All our plants are started on site from non-gmo seeds. Fertilizers used are organic and non-chemical (Fish meal, Oyster Shell, Blood Meal, Epsom Salts, etc). Pests are managed first with Organic Neem Oil as well as hand picking of larvae, pesticides are not routinely used on our farm and only on plants that are affected. Fruit Trees are treated with Neem Oil for pest management as well as copper sulfate as a fungicide at appropriate times of year so as not to affect the fruit that is produced. Our produce is pollinated by our on-site apiary which will be expanding this year as well to increase production.

Our farm uses the same practices in animal husbandry. Chickens that are raised on site for eggs and meat are only treated with antibiotics if a situation arises that requires treatment. All animals have 24/7 access to clean water as well as non-gmo feed from another local farm. Beyond feed, our chickens are enriched with vegetable scraps, whole vegetables from the produce garden, as well as scratch and mealworms. Our mission is to raise our animals in the most humane way while providing the highest quality product for our customers.

Section 2. Our Shared Commitments

A. Sharing in the Risk of Crop Failure

We promise to do our best to provide you with a bountiful share each week. The quantity of produce, however, may vary from week to week due to extreme weather, insects, or other production factors despite our best efforts. By joining our CSA, you agree to share the risk of crop failure with us and other members. In the unlikely event of a crop failure, our procedure is as follows:

If only a small portion of crops fail, we compensate for the failed crops by filling your share with other crops grown on the farm that are ready for harvest at that time. If a large portion of crops fail, we may replace failed crops with other items for that week.

B. Sharing in the Reward of Crop Surplus

In addition to our CSA, our farm sells to consumers at Farmer's Markets. Although production is not segregated, our CSA receives priority. After filling our CSA share with the week's harvest first, the remainder is sold to our other markets. When crops are especially abundant, we pack as much as possible into your share. However, we don't want to overwhelm our members or deliver so much produce that it goes to waste. When we feel that members have received enough of certain crops, we will handle the surplus

by sales at Farmer's Markets as well as donations to Linked Hearts Emergency Food Pantry.

Section 3. Picking Up Shares

Pick up of shares will occur on a bi-weekly basis at the farm, 4860 Hough Rd. Dryden, MI 48428, unless other arrangements have been made. Pick-up times will be from 9am to 5 pm on the below listed dates. Chicken pick up dates will be later in the afternoon. Chickens will be processed at McNabb's Poultry Processing the morning of pick up. Members will be notified of time of arrival back at the farm generally 1:00 pm or later.

1. For chicken pick-up dates, the member is responsible for providing their own cooler for transport.
2. Produce and other goods will be bagged in grocery bags with members' names attached for ease of distribution.
3. If possible, return clean egg cartons on the following pick-up date.
4. Farm tours will be possible on pick-up dates but farm bio-security controls will need to be respected or no further farm tours will be offered.

If you cannot pick up your share, you must arrange for someone else to pick it up for you. You are responsible for explaining the pick-up location and procedures to your substitute. If notified 24 hours or more before the pick up date, other arrangements can be made. Shares that are not retrieved within the pick-up time will be donated to Linked Hearts Emergency Food Pantry in Dryden

We take the safety of your food seriously. If there are any food allergy concerns, please inform us at your earliest convenience. For your added protection, wash all produce before eating and put cooled products in a refrigerator as soon as possible.

By selling membership in advance of the growing season, CSA reduces the burden of up-front costs for the farmer. Your membership fees provide us with money to purchase seed and equipment before the season starts, and we appreciate your commitment.

\$50 discount for upfront full season payment

\$450 Bi-Weekly 10 packages of produce and other goods throughout the season. Biweekly includes 2 Loaves of Sourdough Bread and 2 Dozen Eggs.

I understand that, although unlikely, the farm may change parts of this agreement related to production and distribution from time to time.
