*Each SRC research workshop session with students should include introduction and access to high quality multimedia texts on the life science topic for each grade level including physical books in a text set, digital texts, videos, websites, etc. Each grade level will need a digital repository for access to resources for students during their classroom research workshop such as a Google Drive folder, a hyperdoc, a symbaloo website, Tizmos, a choice board, etc.
