<u>Art</u>

<u>Kindergarten</u>- Students will identify ideas that come from observation and create artwork to express ideas about animals. Students will identify ideas that come from observation and create artwork to express ideas about weather and seasons.



<u>1st Grade</u>- Students experiment with pattern (repetition, center of interest) in the creation of artworks and identify reasons why artists create artworks. Students apply their knowledge of art elements and design principles to express what they see, know, feel, and imagine. They identify reasons why artists create by studying artworks and other sources of information.

<u>2nd Grade</u>- Students study how artists respond to what they see, know, and feel and are inspired by the work of other artists to create artworks with personal meaning. Students interpret works of art as inspiration to express ideas visually and verbally about people, places, and events.

<u>**3rd Grade**</u>- Aesthetic standards are developed and used to critique artwork. Students explore the communication of ideas.

<u>4th Grade</u>- Students examine how advancements in technology have impacted artwork. Throughout the marking period, students will discuss the aesthetic qualities of artwork.

<u>5th Grade</u>- Students take a closer look at the role that innovation plays in the creation of art. This is another opportunity for students to study art of different times and places to develop new ideas for creating art.
