### **Chair of the Fair Trade Wales Board Role Description**

The Chair of the Board of Directors of Fair Trade Wales shares the same governance responsibilities as other members of the board. The specific role of the Chair is to ensure that the board is effective in setting and implementing the organisation's culture, direction and strategy by leading the board and focusing it on strategic matters, oversight of the organisation's activities and maintaining high standards of governance.

### **Chair of the Fair Trade Wales Board Responsibilities**

- Ensures that the board functions effectively, meetings are led inclusively, and the board carries out its duties.
- Leads the board in governing itself well, setting the strategic direction of the organisation, creating a positive culture and holding the Head of Fair Trade Wales and staff properly accountable.
- Monitors the agreed actions from board meetings to ensure that decisions are implemented properly and in a timely manner.
- Ensures that the board annually reviews its structure, effectiveness, delegations and key policies, and implements agreed changes as necessary.
- Builds a strong, positive and respectful relationship with the Head of Fair Trade Wales and engages with staff, beneficiaries and other stakeholders.
- Acts as an ambassador for the organisation, representing its interests and values to external stakeholders.
- Works with the Head of Fair Trade Wales to set their objectives, and hold regular one-to-one meetings to support and monitor progress.
