1. Question: Do you use Linked Accounts in Aspen?

- Some libraries in the Missouri consortium do, while some do not, most enjoy it, but can lead to confusion since not every library does have them (Evergreen)
- CLiC has one library who uses it
- Minuteman does not use linked accounts
- Wisconsin Valley does not due to some confusion between patron initiated linking in Aspen and uncorrelated account linking in Sierra (also legal/privacy reasons)
- Clams has it on, but does not encourage it
- GMILCS has it on, but does not know of anyone using it
- CWMARS is not using it
- The setting is in Primary Config Library Systems, so you can do it by library

2. Question: How do you handle staff-created lists and turnover? Do you use a generic account? What about consortium-wide lists for awards?

- WVLS has generic accounts for public lists, Minuteman has some for public lists and some accounts for just their library lists
- CW/MARS Library staff who are creating public, searchable lists in Aspen should include their town name in the title of the list
- Many libraries do not handle them but are looking for good ideas to do that
- Everyone can create public lists, but there are permissions on making them searchable

Ideas for development to make it better for consortium

- 1. The list itself would have an indicator of who it should be shared with (consortium list, library list, personal list, etc)
- 2. The ability to transfer lists, copy and edit, as well
- 3. Be able to customize the general staff list creator

- Do we want something more like locking or more like sharing (like we did for Sideloads) - sharing might be more flexible
 - i. Could see cases for both locking and sharing
 - Locking could be sufficient for something like
 System Messages, while sharing might be better for Themes, Placards, etc.
- d. Could there be different permissions to see something vs edit something? (this would be a phase 2) - this is what was done for the sideloading permissions, so that would solve this

4. Open Time

- CW MARS has noticed that advanced search has been slow for them (loading the page is slow because it's loading all of the facets) - Advanced Search could use some love (they only show 100 values for facets, for instance)
 - i. NEKLS and other libraries have added an Advanced Search button under their Search button or Search box, so it's easier for users to access
 - ii. Previous usability studies showed that Advanced Search was not used much or used well, when it was
- Question about floating collections in Koha and how they show in Aspen, if they're showing the Current Library vs. Owning Library. Has anyone else seen that situation?
 - Could be a development to show both or choose per library how they show
- Question about items that cannot transit to other libraries
 - CWMARS has item notes for things like that
 - Minuteman is trying to get home pickup from Sierra work in Aspen (https://aspen-discovery.atlassian.net/browse/DIS-790)
 - WVLS translated our hold failed message to include something generic about some items being limited to local use.

- Can restrict pickup locations in the Format Map (in ILS Indexing) per format
- Hoopla title ingestion currently have to choose one Hoopla library ID to ingest, would like to discuss a better, more flexible way to do this
 - SWAN says yes!
 - Hoopla has new APIs that might allow this, without the issue we had before where ingestion of all the collections took too many resources.
 Would libraries still want to be able to filter by price, subject, audience, etc. in Aspen? Hoopla also offers price caps

- 8. Question: Does anyone have individual library kids catalogs?
 - a. Discussion: Browse Category Permissions/Local Administrator Users
 - i. Are you utilizing a consortial kids catalog or individual library kids catalogs? How?
 - 1. This could get out of hand quickly in large consortiums, but smaller consortiums it may be more manageable to have 2 catalogs per library
 - 2. No other folks atm
 - 3. Pros and Cons difficult for kids to navigate a large consortium kids catalog
 - 4. This could be done as a location that is their Children's Catalog
 - 5. Sierra is reaching out to her libraries to gauge interest (currently about 10 libraries) to look into a test run.
 - 6. Figuring out records to include for each library could be tricky
 - 7. How tricky this is might depend on how much freedom member libraries already have (whether or not libraries administer their own Browse Categories, for example).
 - 8. Libraries that have their own kids catalog can highlight their own collections and not worry about differences across the consortium on whether materials are shelved as kids or teens.
 - ii. Do your libraries have permissions to create browse categories for their catalogs?
 - 1. Issue with Browse Category Groups
 - a. DIS-954: Allow "Administer Library Browse Categorie...
 - 2. The libraries that have permissions to create Browse Categories love them!
 - iii. Are you utilizing the Local Administrator user functionality?
 - 1. Sierra doesn't need this for her current plan
 - iv. Brief discussion on Placards and how folks are using them
 - 1. What should we do if there are multiple placards for the same trigger? Having a method to show all of them might be good (could be a carousel/slider). Could also make them dismissable.
- 9. Question: How much access to Aspen Administration do your libraries have?

- a. CW Mars has one "Aspen Admin" user for each library. They also use Mike's "consortial object guard javascript" to prevent libraries from editing things shared between libraries. They don't let libraries change anything related to search (ie search full consortium first, etc). Mostly they can customize UI like Browse Categories and colors. Regular staff get permission to make public lists and masquerade. There are a few other folks with a few more permissions.
- MAIN started by giving out permissions freely (for their library, not consortium-wide). Mike later reworked permissions into tiered roles. <u>Here's his</u> list of roles.
- c. CLAMS Eileen said that their libraries do their own Kanopy sideloads.



19. CW MARS - Browse Category Permissions bug

- a. There appears to be a permissions conflict between Administer Library Browse Category Groups and Administer Selected Browse Category Groups.
 - i. Jira tickets <u>DIS-347</u>, <u>DIS-585</u>
- Basically, we are investigating how to set up individual library kid's catalogs that libraries can manage themselves, including updating the browse categories themselves.
 - i. The library administrator was added to the kid's catalog location using Additional Locations to Administer. This does not cover the browse category group for that location.
 - ii. In order to view the browse category group for the kid's catalog, "Administer Selected Browse Category Groups" needed to be added to the library administrator's role. This allows the admin to create browse categories on this catalog and access the browse category group.
 - iii. However, this leads to an error where the administrator cannot see the subcategories they created on the browse category group and is unable to update these subcategories from Search Tools. Instead, it shows the first one they have access to:



c. The only way the admin can see their browse categories in the Search Tools dropdown correctly is to remove the Administer Selected Browse Category Groups permission. But, then these admins cannot access the browse category group and cannot customize the kid's catalog in that way

 - vii. CLAMS, GMILCS, CW MARS, WYLD interested
 - viii. Should libraries be able to see what others are side loading, but not edit them? For examples for how to load, URLs, etc.
 - 1. What are other networks doing?

- a. CW MARS would plan to have cataloging staff upload sideloads the first time, then have libraries maintain.
- b. CLAMS would like to have libraries load their own
- c. MAIN uses one Kanopy upload and then scopes for libraries.
 - Maybe it could be helpful if there's a scenario where staff volunteer to work on the cataloging/side load and share with the consortium (take workload off of network staff)
- ix. Should it be similar to browse categories? Can share with everyone, or share with just their library
- x. What if removing records per-scope was part of it? A bit out of scope for permissions but related to side loads
 - 1. This would allow individual libraries to delete records from a shared side load?
 - 2. Then you can do both URL rewriting and record scopes for an individual sideload
- xi. Hoopla too?
- b. The ability to lock down pages, materials, etc. in the catalog so only certain admin levels can edit those features (Sierra CW MARS)
 - i. Framework document update from Sierra?

 - v. Would copying be useful? So they could still see it but also could copy if they liked



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- 1. Search filters and facets like "Added in the Last" and "Library" do not currently work together to narrow results down to a specific library. This makes it difficult for patrons to search for branch-specific items. The "Available At" facet isn't a good solution because it only shows items that are immediately available, not those that patrons might want to place a hold on. We've submitted a development request for a new facet that would filter by the owning library, allowing patrons to easily scope down to a specific library, regardless of availability. Cori WYLD
 - a. Yavapai has a ticket open currently
 - b. Nearby location setting is broken
 - i. Limited to allow two nearby location
 - ii. Available at facet could help with nearby locations
 - c. Excluding facets/options
- 2. The items that appear in the recommended sections, like "While You Wait" and "More Like This," currently display titles from the entire consortium rather than being specific to the system's catalog. We would prefer these recommendations to be scoped to the catalog the user is browsing in, ensuring a more relevant and system-specific

experience. We also don't have a courier so our items don't move as freely between library systems as other consortiums might allow. Cori - WYLD

- a. WVLS has a ticket open. It would be helpful to have it scoped by location perhaps to either the site they're searching in or to the preferred pickup location.
- b. Minuteman thinks this would be a "nice to have" too. While we have a robust delivery system, libraries like to promote their own collections rather than pulling more things for delivery.
- 3. Branch-system IP-based behaviors. Some of our branch-system libraries are in small towns where the branches are nearby and it is possible for patrons to browse a catalog at one location, see a copy is available at another, and drive there. The IP-based catalog behaviors (to show "It's Here" and force auto-logouts on OPACs) only allow one location to be shown in the search results. It would be nice if there was an option to show the branch locations within search results while onsite. We have a development request for this. I attached a screenshot showing our preferred behavior. Sierra CW MARS



- a. CLAMS would like this feature as well
- b. May be related to 'nearby locations' features
- c. Could relate to hold groups with WYLD ILL processes
- 4. Improving permissions for consortia. This is a larger project/discussion, but we have a few tickets open and have found a few bugs relating to permissions. Being in a

consortia, it's important to be able to designate something as "consortial" so that only network staff can make changes to that page or theme that has been applied to all libraries. We've gotten around this in the meantime using Javascript (Shoutout to Mike from MAIN Alliance for the Consortial Object Guard code). Sierra - CW MARS

- a. Definitely support this. E.g. side loads permissioning Desiree WYLD
- b. Yes, please! -Katie WVLS
- c. CLAMS also would like this
- d. Mark Sounds like a couple issues
 - i. Breaking out side loads into library level permissions
 - ii. Field locking, but an object? Like locking a theme
 - iii. Overall more nuance needed, sounds like a few different projects
- e. Maybe have a separate meeting about permissions to discuss nuances and pain points to narrow the focus and move forward. Can add to the next meeting agenda? Table for now
- 5. Genealogy records are not scoped to a single library or library system. This not only allows all patrons using the module to see ALL the records including ones that are not related to their library but it also gives other libraries the ability to edit records that don't belong to them. We would like this to scope to the library systems. Cori WYLD
 - a. We have one library using genealogy and two others interested Katie, WVLS
 - b. What about people with records in multiple locations? We don't want two John Smiths, but also, we want it to be clear where things are for the patron? Jordan
 - i. Needs more thought for our use case! Cori
 - c. We have a ticket open right now to allow URLs in Genealogy records; how would this fit in if it is linked out and different libraries have different subscriptions? Also part of that request is to add placards to Genealogy - Katie, WVLS
 - d. Maybe another larger topic like permissions to discuss later/separately. Cori
 - e. Maybe related to permissions this library made the record so they can edit it, other libraries can't Mark
 - f. What if it was like Blu-ray/DVDs and having them grouped together for the individual Ben Wolfe
 - g. Would this be manual grouping or could the system be nuanced enough to figure that out? Cori
- 6. Managing Aspen Admin accounts in a test server environment with consortium members - what best practices do you have in place to allow or block changes to individual sites and track/manage changes? Katie - WVLS
 - a. CW MARS does not give libraries access to the test server. Connected to a test ILS server. We also haven't told libraries about all the features available and use the test server to try these out—it would be confusing for them to see that.
 - b. WYLD gave access to *one* library who asked for it. Connected to a test ILS server now, but was initially connected to production. This way they can test without it being too disruptive. We are not as inclined to give them access as it may be confusing between what is production vs. test.
 - c. How do you get feedback to make decisions about changes? Katie

- i. CW MARS has a monthly Aspen Interest Group meeting that discusses potential changes/gets feedback. We have a production test catalog that we can use to try out changes and share with folks. From there we have a recommendation and it may go higher (Executive committee) depending on the change being discussed.
- ii. WYLD discusses changes internally and considers if the feature can be controlled by individual library
